The Bureau of Jewish Education is in the midst of its campaign to raise \$85,000, which is the minimum requirement to carry on the Jewish educational activities in our community.

The Bureau of Jewish Education supports 17 Sunday Schools in which 3700 Jewish children receive instruction. It also maintains two normal schools for the training of Religious and Hebrew School teachers. In addition thereto, the Bureau conducts holiday celebrations, Summer vacation story hours, and educational activities in Summer camps.
