### MEN'S CLUB

#### Annual Meeting, Sunday, May 20th

The annual meeting of the Men's Club will be held Sunday morning, May 20th at 10:30 in the Sisterhood Parlor. At this meeting a discussion of the future program of activity will take place and members of the Board of Trustees will be elected to fill the places of those whose terms expire.

The Men's Club has been an active force in the life of the congregation since its organization.

With the advent of the opening of the addition to the Temple, Rabbi Wolsey felt the need of broadening the scope of the activities of the male members of the congregation. With that in view, he called together a small group with whom he discussed plans of organization, and as a result of the deliberations, the Men's Club was founded in Jan., 1925. It conducted a series of cultural and social gatherings. It sponsored a series of scientific discussions conducted by David Dietz. It brought to the membership the thought and message of men prominently identified with the civic and cultural life of our community. When Rabbi Brickner came to our Temple, he brought to it a vitality and an energy which found expression in new fields of endeavor. Prominently written in the history of our activity, is the success of the Round Table, led by Rabbi Brickner. It has served as a medium of exchange for the discussion of religious, cultural and communal problems.

The Men's Club has sponsored the Boy Scout activity of the Temple and has co-operated with the Alumni in arranging the Father-Sons dinner and generally worked with all other groups in the Temple. It has identified itself actively with communal projects, has lent itself to the furthering of congregational interests and Jewish problems generally.

Rabbi Brickner has in mind several projects and ideas for the Men's Club which he desires to submit for their consideration. It is hoped that at the coming annual meeting a large number of members will attend and that they will be prepared to aid by their advice and counsel in mapping out a program of activity and a policy, which will insure continued success of the Men's Club for the years to come.

## RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

### *Confirmation*

Ninety-seven pupils who have satisfactorily passed our ten-year course of instruction will be confirmed on Friday, May 25th—Shabuoth.

This year the confirmands were also required to pass a Hebrew test, indicating that they have a satisfactory reading knowledge of Hebrew.

Parts were distributed last Friday to all of the confirmands and rehearsals are now in process. Pursuant to a practice introduced last year, those having the highest standing in the class are privileged to write their own pieces.

Tickets are being mailed to all the members. The services will start promptly at 9:30 and doors will be closed at 10 o'clock.

It is gratifying to note that practically all of the confirmands have pledged themselves to return next fall as members of the High School Department to continue their Jewish studies.

### *Confirmation Class Night-May 20th*

The confirmands and their parents will assemble this Sunday evening, May 20th in our Recreation Hall to participate in class night, the annual event of the confirmation class.

The supper will be prepared and served by a committee of mothers of the confirmands, working together with a committee of the Sisterhood. Class songs, class personals, history and prophecy,

together with a talk by Rabbi Brickner will make up a program of unusual interest.

### Summer Program

Several special Religious School activities will be conducted during the summer months.

Children who failed promotion and who are desirous of making up the deficiency but who go away to camp, may by consulting with Mr. Brilliant, receive permission to make up their deficiency at camp. Mr. Brilliant will gladly communicate with camp directors to this end.

One day a week will be known as Euclid Avenue Temple Outing Day. Under competent leaders, excursions are to be made to the various parks and points of interest within the vicinity of Cleveland. Following the outing, the group will return to the Temple for a short program of Jewish stories and entertainment.
