Commencing with next Sunday morning, October 21st, Rabbi Brickner will by request begin a new series of lectures on the general theme "Moulders of the Modern Mind." He will discuss the Quintessence of the Teachings of the five thinkers who, more than any others, have revolutionized modern thought. The subjects and dates are as follows:

October 21st—"Freud and Psycho-Analysis," with special reference to his latest book "The Future of an Illusion."

October 28th—"Bergson's Philosophy," with special reference to his teachings on Creative Evolution.

November 4th—"Einstein's Theory of Relativity for the Layman."

November 11th—"Lenin and Ghandi—the Modern Prophets of Utopia."

Last Sunday morning a congregation that filled the temple and which was made up of many non-members, heard Rabbi Brickner's discourse on "The Moral Issues of this Presidential Campaign."
