Sunday Services

Rabbi Brickner has chosen for his theme next Sunday, December 2nd, a subject which has a wide popular appeal— "What Makes Life Worth Living?"

Last Sunday, in spite of the inclement weather, the temple was filled with a large congregation who came to hear Rabbi Brickner discuss "The Island Within," by Ludwig Lewisohn. Another capacity congregation is expected to attend next Sunday.

The congregation is urged to come early, in order not to disturb those who are worshipping. Late-comers must expect to wait in the lobby until such a time as the ushers can admit them.

Rabbi's Addresses

Last week Rabbi Brickner addressed the Jewish Community of Toronto at a large dinner meeting, and this Friday he will give the address at the annual Jewish Religious Education Association Convention in Youngstown.

Among his addresses in December, there is included a debate with Mr. Maurice Samuel on "Resolved that Reform Judaism is Best Adapted to the Spiritual Needs of the Modern Jew." This debate will be held in Rochester before Congregation B'rith Kodesh, on Thursday evening, December 13th. This is probably the first debate of its kind, on this subject, to be held in recent years.

Mr. Dietz Next Sunday

"Power from the Sun" will be the title of the lecture by Mr. David Dietz next Sunday, December 2nd at 9:30 A. M., in the Sisterhood Parlor.

By means of stereopticon slides, Mr. Dietz will show the attempts which have been made to build solar engines and to solve related problems.

Chanukah At Home

Chanukah is a holiday rich in ceremonies, which can be practised in the home. It is needless to point out that Judaism can best be taught through doing, through active participation in ceremonial life. Here is what you can do at home:

- 1. If you have no Chanukah Menorah, get one at the temple office, (15c each). Every child in the school will receive a box of candles. Kindle the Chanukah candles every evening. The first candle is lit Friday evening, December 7th, and add one light each night, through Friday evening, December 14th, when all eight candles are lit. (See Union Prayer Book page 351).
- 2. Sing the Chanukah songs which your child has learned in Sunday School.
- 3. Play the Dredel game. Your child who goes to Sunday School, knows how.
- 4. The Story of Chanukah may be read in "The Story of the Jewish People," by Jack Myers, Chapters 1, 2 and 3.
