### Sunday Service

“What is the Meaning of the New Peace  
Between the Pope and Mussolini?”, will  
be the subject of Rabbi Brickner's dis-  
course next Sunday, March 3rd, at 10:30  
A. M.

The settlement of the long-standing dis-  
pute between the Holy See and the Italian  
State over temporal sovereignty of the  
Pope is of significant interest, not only  
to Roman Catholics, but to non-Catholics  
throughout the world.

Rabbi Brickner will explain the his-  
torical background of this dispute which  
kept the Pope in self-imposed confine-  
ment as a prisoner of the Vatican for  
more than a half a century, and which  
has been characterized by Lord Palmer-  
ston, the great English statesman, as  
“the most extraordinary and romantic  
tale recorded in the history of the world.”  
He will also discuss the terms of the set-  
tlement, and their many implications—  
religious and international.

A large congregation greeted Rabbi  
Brickner on his return to the pulpit last  
Sunday morning, and undoubtedly the  
subject of his next Sunday's discourse  
ought to attract an even greater con-  
gregation.
