SISTERHOOD

*Plans*

A varied program of cultural and religious activities has been prepared, by the Sisterhood for the coming season, the details of which, given below, speak for themselves:

**Jewish Current Events.** In reviewing the outstanding Jewish events of the day, as well as books of, and by Jews, Rabbi Brickner also gives the historical background. Those wishing to enter should make their reservations with Mrs. M. Reinthal, Chairman (1492 East 107th St.) There is a registration fee of one dollar per person which is devoted to subscriptions to American and foreign periodicals. The first meeting will be held on Friday, November 1st, at 11:00 A. M., and on alternate Fridays thereafter.

**Books and Authors.** Mr. Joseph Remenyi, Instructor of Literature at Cleveland College, will again deliver a series of lectures on "Modern Books and Their Authors" on alternate Friday mornings from 11 to 12 o'clock, beginning with October 25th. The course of lectures will be offered for three dollars; single admissions 50c. Reservations should be made with Mrs. Theo. Fishel, Chairman (1728 E. 115th St.)

A series of stimulating lectures will be given by Dr. Henry Miller Busch of Western Reserve University on alternate Friday mornings preceding the Jewish Current Events course. We have been extremely fortunate in securing the exclusive services of this brilliant young man. Reservations should be made with Mrs. J. C. Newman, Chairman (13145 Euclid Ave.) There will be a very small nominal charge made for this course.

**Other Groups.** The Sisterhood also conducts the **Literary Group**, which presents several dramatic readings through the year; the **Community Sewing Group** which meets weekly on Mondays; a number of **holiday entertainments**; and a new group, the **Bible Study Circle** under the direction of Mrs. B. R. Brickner for mothers of young children.

*Co-operative Meeting Oct. 9th*

Mrs. Anna Moscovitz Kross of New York City will discuss the Palestinian situation at the first meeting of the Co-Operative League of Jewish Women's Organizations which will be held in our Auditorium Wednesday, October 9th at 2:00 P. M.

## RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

### *High School Department Opens*

Close to two hundred pupils enrolled in our High School Department last Sunday morning. At the assembly which preceded the session, Rabbi Brickner expressed his appreciation of the splendid response which our boys and girls have given to the efforts our temple is making, in extending the period of Jewish education.

The new plan of elective courses which was introduced for the first time this year, has proved highly successful, and is being continued.

The program of studies, together with the plan of extra-curricula activities in which the High School Department will co-operate with the Alumni, holds promise of a season of distinct advancement in high school work.

### *Special Hebrew*

The Hebrew Department is being enlarged in order to give those children who have shown special aptitude for Hebrew, additional opportunities of pursuing their studies in this language. Children of the 4th, 5th and 6th grades will meet for the first time Sunday morning, October 13th in Room 202 during their regular Hebrew period, where the details of the course will be announced. Children who have not been selected, but who wish to join the Hebrew classes, should apply to Mr. Brilliant. These classes will be conducted Saturday and Sunday mornings, and one afternoon a week.

The special Hebrew children of the Junior High Department will hold their first session Saturday morning, Oct. 12th.

### *No Sessions Sunday*

Out of deference to Jewish tradition there will be no sessions of the Religious School this Sunday, the second day of Rosh Hashonah. Sessions of the Religious School will be resumed Saturday, October 12th and Sunday, October 13th.

### *Young Israel*
