The fourth season of the Round Table will open its sessions on Monday noon, November 12th at the Statler Hotel. Rabbi Brickner will be the speaker at the opening session.

The attendance and interest in the past have been extremely encouraging, and with the extended plans the Rabbi has in mind, a year of increased attendance and more stimulating discussion is anticipated.

Consecration Service

The following letter from Rabbi Brickner was given to all of our children for their parents at the last session of our Religious School:

"Dear Parents: I beg leave to invite you to witness the inauguration of a new and beautiful Ceremony of Consecration which I believe will, in time, become as significant as Confirmation.

This ceremony will take place as part of the Services on the Concluding Day of Succoth—Simchath Torah—Saturday, October 26 at 10:30 A. M. in the Temple.

The ceremony will center around the Initiation of the little children who enter the first grade of our Religious School and who will be consecrated by me, to the study of Judaism.

The day of Torah Rejoicing is most fitting for such a Consecration Ceremony, even as Shabuoth—the Day of the Giving of the Torah—is appropriate for Confirmation.

The children will march into the Temple to a tune especially written for the occasion. They will participate in a program that centers around Israel's undying declaration—The Sh'ma. I will present them with Miniature Torahs. The children will recite and I will bless them. As part of the ceremonial, three generations reared in the Temple—grandfathers, fathers and sons—will receive the Scrolls from me and hand them over one to the other, to symbolize the transmitting of the Torah from generation to generation.

Mothers and fathers, I urge you to make every effort to come to the Temple on Saturday morning, October 26th, to witness this new service, and to bring your children along.
