Consecration Service

The following letter from Rabbi Brick-
ner was given to all of our children for
their parents at the last session of our
Religious School:

*“Dear Parents: I beg leave to invite you
to witness the inauguration of a new and
beautiful Ceremony of Consecration which I
believe will, in time, become as significant as
Confirmation.”*

*This ceremony will take place as part of
the Services on the Concluding Day of Suc-
coth—Simchath Torah—Saturday, October 26
at 10:30 A. M. in the Temple.*

*The ceremony will center around the Initia-
tion of the little children who enter the first
grade of our Religious School and who will
be consecrated by me, to the study of Juda-
ism.*

*The day of Torah Rejoicing is most fitting
for such a Consecration Ceremony, even as
Shabuoth—the Day of the Giving of the
Torah—is appropriate for Confirmation.*

*The children will march into the Temple to
a tune especially written for the occasion.
They will participate in a program that cen-
ters around Israel’s undying declaration—The
Sh’ma. I will present them with Miniature
Torahs. The children will recite and I will
bless them. As part of the ceremonial, three
generations reared in the Temple—grandfath-
ers, fathers and sons—will receive the
Scrolls from me and hand them over one to
the other, to symbolize the transmitting of the
Torah from generation to generation.*

*Mothers and fathers, I urge you to make
every effort to come to the Temple on Satur-
day morning, October 26th, to witness this new
service, and to bring your children along.*
