## Consecration Service

A huge congregation that filled our temple to overflowing last Saturday—the Concluding Day of Succoth—witnessed the revival of one of the most impressive and colorful ceremonies of Judaism.

Three generations reared in the temple—grandfathers, fathers and sons—received the Scrolls from the Rabbi and handed them over one to the other, thus symbolizing the transmission of the Torahs from generation to generation.

The first grade children then marched into the temple and after reciting their little pieces, held up the miniature Torahs handed them on the pulpit by the Rabbi, and recited Israel's undying declaration—the Sh'ma.

The Ceremony of Consecration left a profound impression on those who witnessed it, and it was evident that this ceremony has already become as important and significant as confirmation.

## Lecture Services Commence Sunday

Sarah Gertrude Millin will be unable to appear on November 19th because of an unfortunate incident. While on her way from Africa to America she stopped in London because of illness. A physician gave her a prescription that made her desperately ill, and as a result she has been compelled to cancel her engagements in America.

The Lecture Course Committee regrets this exceedingly, but have been fortunate enough to secure Aaron Sapiro in their emergency.

Many will recall with pleasure the address that Mr. Sapiro gave here two years ago under our auspices. Over 1800 people attended his lecture, and hundreds had to be turned away.

Undoubtedly there will be standing room only for many of the evenings announced in the course. Subscribers have the assurance that they will have seats held for them up to 8:10.

There has been an unusual response in the sale of tickets. Only as many course book tickets will be sold, as there are seats in the auditorium, and since there are only a few course book tickets left, members are strongly urged to make their reservations immediately, so as to be assured of a place at every single lecture.
