Sunday Lecture Service

"What is the Secret of Happiness?" will be Rabbi Brickner's subject next Sunday morning.

He will take as his text the recent book by Walter B. Pitkin, Professor at Columbia University, entitled "The Psychology of Happiness."

In Pitkin's book which is refreshingly unconventional both in method and reasoned position, we get a psychological case analysis of some interesting lives of the great of the past. Among them are cast studies of Garibaldi, D'Annunzio, Horace Greeley, Cardinal Newman, William Jennings Bryan, Woodrow Wilson, with a view of finding out: Were they happy and what is this forever-to-be-desired, this elusive, fascinating thing called "happiness"? The analysis is intensely modern and psychological in point of view.

This lecture was postponed from Sunday, March 23rd when Rabbi Brickner gave in its stead "Revolution and Religion —Must They Always be Opposed?"

"Theatre of the Nations"

"The Footsteps of Messiah" by Sholom Ash is a symbolic play, rich in scenic effect, Jewish folk music and dancing. It will unquestionably prove interesting even to audiences unfamiliar with the Hebrew language.

director and a fine exponent of the Habimah School, has the co-operation and assistance of K. Elmo Lowe of the Playhouse and others.

We hope that many of our members will take advantage of the opportunity to see a play in Hebrew, presented in the manner of the incomparable work of the Habima.
