#### The Course

Mordecai W. Johnson, President of Howard University, will be the next speaker on the Temple Course Tuesday, March 3rd at 8:30 P. M. His subject will be "The Conquest of Prejudice."

Dr. Johnson is the recognized leader of the colored race and a gifted orator. His address at the convention of the Religious Education Association held in Cleveland last April, was one of the outstanding events of the convention.

One cannot afford to miss hearing this distinguished representative of the colored race.

#### Sunday Lecture Service

"Behind Racketeering and Corruption in Our Cities" will be Rabbi Brickner's subject next Sunday, with special reference to the situations in Cleveland, New York and Chicago. The Rabbi interrupts his series of lectures on "Testing Our Religious Beliefs," four of which he has already given, to discuss this important theme.

### Religious School

#### Purim Party

In keeping with the traditional spirit of Purim, the children of the Religious School will not only hold Purim parties, but will at the same time remember others who may be less fortunately placed. The arrangement will be as follows:

1. Every class will hold its own Purim party on Sunday afternoon, March 1st. There will be no sessions of the school, both Saturday and Sunday mornings.

2. Through co-operation with the Jewish Social Service Bureau, each class as a unit will send a shalach monos box to some needy family.

3. Every child in the school has been given the name of some other child his age, to whom to send a Purim greeting. This other child is not necessarily in needy circumstances, but may be temporarily laid up in a hospital or may be in a nursery or orphan home.

4. Lastly, the collections for that day will go to the Unemployment Fund.

Thus the entire school will participate in a genuine project whereby the child learns not only to think of his own joy on that festival, but to consider the needs and happiness of others.

## The Task of Russia

By Joseph Stalin

Dictator of Russia, in a Speech at the First Conference of the All-Union Communist Industrial Executives.

Russia is from fifty to a hundred years behind the rest of the world in knowledge. It is our job as Bolsheviks to make up arrears in these ten years, because laggards always suffer. That is what happened in Old Russia—she was always backward and paid for it dearly. Mongols beat her, Turks beat her—and Swedish feudalism and Poles. Anglo-French capitalists beat her—and Japanese barons.

They beat her because of backwardness—military backwardness, cultural backwardness, governmental, industrial and agricultural backwardness. They beat her because it was profitable and they could get away with it. That is the law of capitalism—to beat the backward and the weak. "You're right if strong; if weak you're wrong"—that is the wolf law of capitalism. And that is why we must make up arrears. As Lenin said, "We must die or catch up and surpass them." We must do that or they will smash us.

What about the second condition—that is, have we got the proper management for our industry? We have the will, but have we got the competence? Unhappily, things are not wholly satisfactory in this respect, and as Bolsheviks we must say so openly and straight \* \* \*

You must learn it. You must master technique; you as Bolsheviks, as the leaders of Russia, must really lead. And to lead you must have knowledge.
