WHY HATE

Excerpts from Dr. Wise's recent address on "Why Hate":

"We hate whom we fear, whom we envy, whom we wrong-by way of selfjustification. We never hate inferiors, those whom we imagine to be inferior to ourselves, we never hate those whom we have served, though oft-times we hate those by whom we have been We may despise or affect to served. despise superiors but we never them. When there is hatred if men might remember that with respect to superiors-hateful term-emulation is better than hatred, and with respect to inferiors-still more hateful termcompassion is finer than hatred.

"Individual hatreds can be overcome through reason and the sense of fairness, of understanding and iustness which reason inspires, through friendliness which grows out of understanding. Racial and national hatreds can be overcome only through that understanding which is bound up with awareness of the worth and the rights of others despite all differences. Hate is that of which to be ashamed not proud. Hatred is limitation, not expansion and above all is kin to and begotten of fear even as prejudice is a blend of fear and hatred, fear without the courage of its avowal.

"If only men might see that hatred is of the essence of things pathological, that hatred is a species of disease, a type of degeneracy, that a good hater is evil in himself and the bringer of evil to others. When all this is understood, pride in hatred will vanish.

"Hatred means defeat, never triumph Hatred means impoverishment, never enrichment, hate means enslavement, never liberation. Hatred narrows, contracts, imprisons life even as love liberates, widens and enlarges life."

Washington and the Jews

One of the most important Jewish characters in the Revolutionary War is undoubtedly Haym Solomon. Although in the forced service of a Hessian general during the Revolutionary War, he nevertheless managed to assist the American cause by freeing prisoners. He escaped from the British Army in 1778 and settled in Philadelphia where he became exchange broker.

In this position he was of great service to his country acting as one of the chief aides of Robert Norris, the superintendent of finance for the colonies.

Haym Solomon later became treasurer to the French Army. The total of his loans to the American government amounted to \$350,000 which was a vast sum in those days. He was never repaid his loan.

In addition to these strenuous activities he was an important leader in communal affairs and a member of one of the oldest congregations in Philadelphia.
