### American Hitler Warns Against President Franklin "Rosenfeld"

#### Organizes Silver Shirts To Revive Old Hatreds of Ku Klux Klan

The old South, which gave birth some years ago to the Ku Klux Klan of unlamented memory, has now spewn forth the Silver Shirts, a new anti-Semitic and anti-Catholic organization which boasts of its connection with the Hitlerite propaganda machine in the United States.

Asheville, North Carolina, is the headquarters of the Silver Shirts of America, whose official name is the League for Liberation, itself an auxiliary of the Foundation for Christian Economics. The leader of the Silver Shirts is one William Dudley Pelley, a former publisher of newspapers in Massachusetts and Vermont.

Despite the fact that Pelley has been peddling his poison for nearly a year in his magazine "Liberation," numerically the Silver Shirts have made no progress, perhaps because it costs \$10 for the privilege of wearing a silver shirt and blue pants. But there can be no question that Pelley and his organization are a menace.

In issue after issue of "Liberation," Pelley repeats the hoary libels against

the Jews and garnishes them with liberal doses of his own philosophy of "Christian Democracy." He revives the charges of an international Jewish "money-bund," blames the depression on the Jews, and finds that they are plotting the ruin of Christian civilization.

President Roosevelt is held to be a dupe of Jewish bankers. The NRA, Pelley says, is part of a Jewish conspiracy.

Pelley has gone so far as to state that the "Jewish money-bund" has put a dictator in the White House, "who is already so subservient to these predatory Jews that you can hear him openly designated on the streets of Washington as President Franklin D. 'Rosenfeld'."

In another number the Silver Shirts' mouthpiece declares that "if Franklin D. Roosevelt had not been acquiescent to German-Jewish alien money kings and their satraps abroad, he never would have gotten a smell of the New York governorship—where a Jew, Lehman, now sits enthroned in his place, just as the half Jew, Alfred Schmidt, popularly known as Al Smith, sat before him."

To "Save" America from the Jews, Pelley proposes that "this nation must come to Christian democracy."

Pelley has revealed that his Silver Shirts are already organized in 46 states and boasts that before the year is out "you are going to see the Silver Shirts loom large in the events of the United States."

Thus far little or nothing has been heard or seen of them but there is no question that Pelley is a potential danger. He has stated that he "counts it an honor to be in the confidence of some of the highest Hitlerites in the United States and to know something of their forthcoming plans against predatory Jewry."

Even more significant is a passage in "Liberation," which declared that "it is the order of things that Hitler should be doing what he is doing. It is the order of things that those wicked and malignant spirits who have incarnated in certain sections of the Hebrew race trying to bring about the downfall of the Christ Peoples, should meet a fearful fate in this closing of the Cycle of Cosmic Event. That contest is on the make and Hitler's job it has been to do the advance work. But Hitler is not going to finish that work. The finish of it comes right here in America."

## Have You Replied?

The following important message was recently mailed to the members of The Temple and the Euclid Avenue Temple with an urgent request for a personal reply:

"In December 1930, the Board of Governors of Mayfield Cemetery, having acted under instructions of the two Temples, completed the building of the Mayfield Mausoleum.

The purpose of the building, was to make available increased burial facilities in the restricted area of Mayfield Cemetery, for the large membership of the two Temples, whose families did not yet own burial ground.

The Mausoleum included Private Rooms of several Crypts each, selling at the more substantial prices to make possible the building of this permanent and beautiful structure; and Individual Crypts at minimum prices for single entombments.

The Individual Crypts represented about one-half of the total of 850 burial spaces in the Mausoleum, and they were sold singly or in groups of two or more, faster than the more expensive Rooms.

In fact before the Mausoleum had been completed, the sale of these Individual Crypts had proceeded so rapidly that it was necessary to limit their sale further only to member families where deaths occurred.

Despite this restriction upon the sale of Individual Crypts, but sixteen are now left; while in the meantime many members of the two Temples have made application for the purchase of such spaces, which applications could of course not be accepted.

The Board of Governors feels now that the matter has become pressing and that the needs and requests of the member Families, if they can be definitely ascertained, should be given attention, and additional Crypt space constructed.

Whether you are interested in purchasing space in the enlargement of the Mausoleum or whether you are not interested at all, please answer the communication on the card enclosed with it and answer at once.
