A STATEMENT BY BENEDETTO GROCE

Noted Italian Savant Declares Nations Have Never Benefited from Anti-Jewish Persecution.

All my life I have fought against the stupid concepts of race and the suppression of liberty. I maintain that true religion of the modern era consists solely in liberty and in culture. As far as Jews are concerned, I am willing to concede (if only as a basis for discussion) that, at times and in some countries, they cause more or less resentment because of their views and the natural bonds between them—views and bonds, which are intended to further their own interests and their own power in competition with other citizens. But, aside from the fact that this is done not only by Jews but by others as well, and disregarding the question as to if and where this is done, I see no effective remedy except that of pitting force against force, capacity against capacity, in free emulation and rivalry. Only thus can the evil be prevented or diminished, the danger lessened, without causing—through self-defense—damage and impoverishment to the entire social or-

That Hitler Has But His Own Throat to Cut

My belief is that Hitler will not last very long. After all, he has but one throat to cut, and it is an old platitude that those who live by the sword shall perish by the sword. Soon or late his imbecilities will get him into such difficulties that the Germans, in sheer self-defense, will have to rise against him and get rid of him. In all probability, a restoration of the monarchy will follow.

But that any such change will extirpate anti-Semitism I doubt. Its more extravagant and disgusting manifestations, of course, will disappear, but the thing itself will probably survive.

The persecution and expulsion of Jews have never been of any benefit to nations, as history attests. Peoples believe to be elevating themselves through those violent means, whereas they are only debasing themselves; they believe they are liberating themselves from oppressors, but they merely deprive themselves of freedom. Nor will the unfortunate recrudescence of such a procedure as we now witness in Germany help German life and culture. There are already discernable evidences which preoccupy the minds of the thinkers of a people once so rich in thought and in sound doctrines.
