## Congregation Celebrates Rabbi's Tenth Anniversary

It was a gala event! More than 600 members of the Euclid Avenue Temple attended the 89th Annual Meeting of the Congregation which this year was coupled with the testimonial dinner to Dr. Barnett R. Brickner in recognition of his completion of ten years as Rabbi.

Several hundred telegrams and messages of congratulation were received by Rabbi Brickner from leaders in the nation and the Church.

Mayor Harold H. Burton, and Mrs. Burton were the only "outside" guests, the mayor delivering his greetings in person before returning to Washington later in the evening.

In his annual address Irwin N. Loeser, president of the congregation, told of Rabbi Brickner's accomplishments in the decade, including addition of Sunday services, extension of educational activities, weekly radio addresses, the building of a chapel, the organization of an annual institute for Christian ministers, civic interests as an arbitrator in industrial disputes and leader in welfare activities and as an officer in local and national Jewish movements.

At the close of his address Mr. Loeser presented the Rabbi a purse, the combined gift of the congregation, the Sisterhood and the Men's Club. In his response Rabbi Brickner expressed appreciation for the cooperation of his congregation and predicted continued growth for its membership, which now numbers more than 1,300 families.

The Sisterhood and the Temple Boards each presented the Rabbi with a set of resolutions.

Frederick Frankel, secretary of the Temple, was toastmaster for the program, which included also music by the Schubert Trio and the Temple Choir, under Maurice Goldman.

Myron A. Cohen was co-chairman of the dinner with Mrs. Sol Gitson, Mrs. Henry H. Emsheimer, Mrs. J. O. Stein, Mr. B. H. Sinks and Mr. Oscar H. Steiner as chairmen of sub-committees. Special credit is due to Mesdames Henry Emsheimer, Sol Gitson and Arthur Lindheim for their splendid work in connection with the dinner.

#### IT'S A MATTER OF 2100 YEARS AGO

It awes us considerably to think that Chanukah is exactly 2100 years old this year.

And we say: "So old am I, the Jew! So old and even older. To be still the Jew! To have suffered so much on account of what I am, and still to be what I am!"

It is really a great comfort to contemplate this; to look at the dust of all the Antiochuses that have afflicted us since the first Chanuka and to say, "But I, the Jew, am still here! Today's pain is only of an hour since I have lived so long."

But an immortal should not look at his immortality merely with vanity; but rather with humility. And in humility an immortal should say: "By what have I lived so long? Why do I merit this immortality?

He thinks on this and concludes that not by reason of any physical power has he lived so long; for indeed, his flesh is no more enduring than that of other men.

He says: "It must be by the spirit that I have lived; by the courage which I have derived from seeing the hand of God reach out to heal my pain in all the times; life from death-giving assimilations."

The humble Jew does not take it for granted that because he has lived so long he will live forever. He knows that his own indifference to being Jewish can kill him; the swords and the fires and the bludgeons have been without avail.

"I must guard my immortality since it is in my own hands. The immortal element is in the inheritance which I give to my children. It is in my home if I maintain it as a Jewish home. It is in the Jewish education with which I provide my children in the home and in the Jewish school."

He does not look with vainglory at the 2100 years he has lived since the first Chanuka. Rather these years put upon him a solemn obligation to the future.

#### MARRIAGE AND THE FAMILY

In 1929 divorces in the United States reached a total of 201,468. From 1867 the first year for which we have accurate statistics, the population has increased 300%, marriages 400%, and divorces 2,000%.

To the number of divorces we must add the number of desertions, the number of separations, voluntary and legal, and also the number of estrangements, of which we all know but for which

there is no written record.

The fact that 36% of divorces occur during the first four years and that 66% or about two-thirds occur during the first nine years seems to prove that these young people who marry are either unsuited to each other, or that they are unprepared for marriage, or that they lack proper guidance and counsel during the early and critical

years of married life.

The minister, we believe, is in a strategic position to serve in this period of transition and reconstruction. It is our duty as rabbis to instruct young people in the teachings of Israel that marriage is not a magic rite nor a civil contract, but a companionship sanctioned by the State and sanctified by religion. our duty to impress upon men and wom-en that the family is not merely a social institution nor a legal entity, but a nursery into which posterity is born and the future is fashioned. It is our duty to lift marriage and the family from the low level upon which they too often insecurely rest to the heights of ethical insight and spiritual relationship.

What, then, if today there were in the world no institution witnessing by the very fact of its long-continued existence to a great and upholding religious faith which is, apparently, too vital and too valid to die?

### THE MYTH OF JEWISH COMMUNISM

On Sunday, September 15th, the present National Socialist Government of Germany, at the behest of its Chancellor, Adolf Hitler, dictator of the German people, decreed a series of laws that put Jews beyond the legal and social pale of the German people, and deprived them of claims to German citizenship. This debasement of the Jews in Germany was not the result of a sudden decision. Long prepared for and premeditated, pledged by the National Socialist Party at its foundation, these laws were only the official culmination of a series of measures degrading and oppressing German Jews.

This official denial of civil rights is directed against men and women whose ancestors have lived in Germany for over a thousand years; who have made signal contributions to German economic, political, and cultural life; who have shed ther blood in defense of their fatherland: and who have contributed their best talents to the peaceful development of the German State. This injustice was perpetrated under the cloak of a so-called link between Jews and communism, which has no existence in fact, but which is being used to confuse the minds not only of Germans, but of people all over the world.

When the Jews of the United States first learned of these pretexts for persecution, they deemed it beneath their dignity to take notice of them. However, because of the censorship of free expression in Germany and the enormous propaganda carried on by Nazi Germany outside its borders, the time has come for us to make answer to the libels and unjust insinuations, and to make clear that these falsehoods have the same motive that has always inspired tyrants and despots-that of seeking a scapegoat for their own sins and, under cover of a false issue, of deceiving their people by fomenting suspicion, discord, and hatred.

It is high time that these facts be known:

While communism, having its roots in

economic forces, no doubt influences some Jews as well as some non-Jews a study of German conditions indicates that the majority of the Jews who were permitted to vote in Germany during the Republic were affiliated with the liberal democratic parties. In the presidential e'ections in which Hindenburg, Hitler, and Thaelmann were candidates Jewish leaders appealed to the German Jews to vote for Hindenburg and against the communist and National Socialist candidates. German Jews were chiefly engaged in occupations and in callings from which communists are not recruited; indeed, their own economic interest made them diametrically opposed to communism. The most influential German dailies in the pre-Hitler period, such as the Frankfurter Zeitung and the Berliner Tageblatt, which were owned by Jews, were bitterly opposed to communism. Not one prominent or even wellknown German-Jewish leader was ever identified with the communist party in Germany. cording to authentic figures under the auspices of the present government there was only one Jew among the 70 communist deputies in the Reichstag of 1930, and not a single Jew among the 81 communist deputies of the Reichstag in 1933. Finally, not even the most brazen official mendacity can observe the fact that while there were less than 300,000 German Jews who were enabled to vote, there were fully six million communist votes cast during the Republic.

The fact about Soviet Russia and the Jews are equally illuminating. Among the thirty-six commissars who constitute the Soviet Government, only two are Jews. Neither the president of the Council of Commissars, Ryckoff; the president of the U.S.S.R., Kalinin; the general secretary of the communist party, Stalin; the president of the Third International, Dimitroff; nor the founder of the communist party, Lenin, are Jews. A large percentage of the millions of Jews in Russia before the Revolution were trades people, members of the class

whom the Bolsheviks attacked most violently and who had most to lose by the victory of communism. Indeed, after the Revolution the Soviet Government declared fully half of the total Jewish population in Russia as declassed, as hindrances to the development of the Revolution. Jewish workers in Russia were organized in an association called the Bund, which opposed the Bolsheviks until the very last. Orthodox Jews and Zionists, whose numbers were preponderant in Russia, are regarded as counterrevolutionaries by the Soviet Government.

An examination of the lists deliberately circulated by anti-Semitic agents in attempts to establish their thesis that nearly all of the Bolshevik leaders are Jews reveals that a large number of those classified are not Jews at all, and that a number of others, far from being Bolsheviks, were leaders in the anti-Bolshevik movement. While Trotzky was a Jew many of the leaders of the Mensheviki, the sworn foes of Bolshevism, were Jews. The official statistics of the Petrograd communist party in 1918 shortly after the Revolution showed that there were 124,021 members of which 74.3% were Russians, 10.5% Latvians, 6.3% Poles, 3.7% Esthonians, 2.6% Jews.

It is plain from the above how little evidence there is for the malicious charge of a so-called Jewish communist link. If the Jews are to be condemned because there are some communists among them —men who have never in the slightest degree concerned themselves with Judaism—then there is not a people on earth that might not with equal right be condemned.

Those who have even an elementary acquaintance with the traditions cherished by our people during the two thousand years since the destruction of the Jewish state know that complete and unequivocal loyalty to the country of one's citizenship is a basic principle of Jewish

life. Ever since the Babylonian exile, spiritual leaders from Jeremiah down have adjured the Jewish people to seek the peace and prosperity of the land in which they live, to pray unto the Lord for it; for in the peace thereof they would enjoy peace.

Students of the origin of the American form of government have pointed to the debt which the Colonial fathers owed to the inspiration of the Hebrew Lecky, the distingushed historian, expressed this debt in the famous dictum: "Hebraic mortar cemented the foundation of American democracy!" To millions of American Jews as well as to millions of Jews in other lands, therefore the tenets of liberalism and democracy are the most dearly prized ideals; Jewish emancipation has always gone hand in hand with the progress of democracy. Any form of government or economic system is based on, or maintains itself by, the suppression of the elemental bases of human liberty—freedom of speech, of the press. of association, of religious worship-is, therefore abhorrent to them.

The real reason for the propagation of this falsehood becomes apparent in Chancellor Hitler's words when he refers to "Marxism and its related parliamentary democracy." Under the pretext of an attack on Bolshevism, many of whose tyrannical features have been adopted by the National Socialists, the Nazi Government has in practice robbed the German people of their civil rights, suppressed freedom of speech, of the press, and assembly, has destroyed the free labor unions and confiscated their funds; and it is now engaged in a pagan assault upon the religious conscience of the Protestant, Catholic, and Jew alike. Is it not plain that his thunderbolts against Marxism are only a smokescreen for his sinister designs upon the liberties of the German people and the peace of world? - (American Jewish Comm., B'nai B'rith Jewish Labor Comm.)

#### HENRIETTA SZOLD

The twenty-first day of December will mark the seventy-fifth birthday of a great woman-probably the gree' st Jewish woman of her time. Henrietta Szold's public life divides itself into three periods. First the years throughout which she organized and built up Hadassah, an organization of lofty and limitless service to Palestine. The second period includes the years in Palestine during which she made contributions of the first order to the working out of the educational system of Palestine. The third and greatest period of her life finds her upon her seventy-fifth birthday, leading in the work of the Youth Aliyah, a pilgrimage movement of young German Jewish exiles out of the land of their misery and humiliation to the country of their rebirth. very uncommon for a woman to undertake one of the most difficult and exigent tasks in her eighth decade and to perform that task with such extraordinary wisdom and effectiveness as have characterized the working out of the vastly complicated program of the German Jewish Youth Movement to Palestine. One does not forget the years of Henrietta Szold's high and devoted service to the cause of Jewish learning, first as daughter amanuensis of that beloved Jewish teacher and scholar, Benjamin Szold, and later as Editor of the Jewish Publication Society's edition of the English rendering of Graetz's "Jewish History."

Finis Coronat Opus! It is a crowning work in which Henrietta Szold is engaged as world Israel celebrates her seventy-fifth birthday! She has been first among the Jewish women of this century and of the latter decades of the nineteenth. No Jewish woman stands out more truly as the "Eshet Chayil," in these most blessed years of her life, privileged by reason of choice and common consent and a lifetime of preparation to be the Mother of hundreds, it may yet be thousands, of Jewish children who because of her leadership will become once again the children of promise and of hope in the land of their own people.
