TEMPLE FLASHES

Four hundred young people representing 50 neighborhood churches and temples met last Sunday evening to discuss "Youth and Marriage." The subject presented by Dr. Lupton precipitated an avalanche of discussion at the six round table meetings into which the general assembly broke up. This is the second annual Youth Forum inaugurated by our Senior Alumni organization and sponsored by them. The general consensus of opinion was, that such open forums where youth is given the opportunity to express itself ought to be held more often. . . This was a busy youth week-end. The Jr. Alumni conducted its March Swirl last Saturday night . . . Have you seen the Passover Exhibit displayed in the new cabinet? The cabinet is the gift of the confirmation classes of 1935 and 1936. Thanks very much. It's a beautiful and useful gift. . . . At the Finals of the Machol Speaking Contest, Sanford Rosen was given first place, Victor Karp, second; Blum Fertel, third, and Sylvan Cohen, fourth. The judges: Judge Lewis Drucker, Dr. Al. Marcus, and Mr. Oscar Steiner. The awards come from a fund established in memory of Dr. Michael Machol, Rabbi of our Temple from 1876 to 1905.

The Cairo Jewish paper, Israel, states that one of the Jews who was publicly flogged in Tripoli for failing to open his store on Saturdays, Zion Brasda, 40 years old, has become insane and is now confined to a lunatic asylum. It is further stated that many Jewish merchants in Tripoli are liquidating their businesses and are going to other places in north Africa. According to this paper, Marshal Balbo, the Governor of Tripoli, has been influenced by German Nazi agents in his anti-Jewish activities.

FACT AND FANCY A Just Retribution

The scientific investigation by the Holland-American Society into the origins of the Roosevelt family, after a year's study of the old records, now indicates the town of Oud-Vosmeer (literally Old-Foxlake) on the island of Tholen as the Heimot of the President's and of Mrs. Roosevelt's ancestors, and not the romantic flower-city of Haarlem or its environs, as was previously supposed. This discovery is of some importance because it makes the President rather of Flemish than Dutch antecedents. Tholen being situated in the Netherlands province of Zealand, where the Flemish ethnical group has predominated since the days of Julius Caesar.

When for some unknown reason a number of blonde and blue-eved Germanic tribes left their original habitat in the Black Forest and came drifting down the Rhine in their hollowed-out tree trunks around the year 1000 B.C.E., one group known as the Batavians settled in what is now Holland, while their kinsmen, the Kaninefaten, that is to say, the rabbit-catchers, took up residence in the storm-tossed islands at the mouths of Rhine. Scheldt and Meuse. If Mr. Roosevelt's forebears hail from Tholen, they were Kaninefaten. Now it was from this tribe, which was not subjected by Rome, but which formed an alliance with Caesar that Titus Vespasionius later drew his shock troops for the final struggle against Judea at the other end of the world. And so it becomes quite well conceivable - seeing how one Batavian legionnaire Pandar, according to the neo-Pagans of Germany, played a most important role in shaping the destiny of mankind around that time-that another legionnaire by the name of Roosevelt was present at the destruction of Jerusalem. If that is the case, our President's well known sympathy for the restoration of Zion becomes an act of just retribution. -New Palestine.

DECLINE IN KNOWLEDGE OF THE BIBLE

The Bible, containing the best of a great people's literature during nearly ten centuries, is regarded throughout the Western World as the most important of the world's books. But though esteemed as highly as ever, perhaps as pure literature esteemed more highly than ever, it is not read as formerly.

This work, which through the King James translation became a part of the very body of our language, which was often the one book in the possession of our pioneering ancestors, its teachings intertwined in the warp and woof of the American tradition, not always for good but unquestionably making us what we have been and are, this food of their fathers is neglected by the children. When it became no longer possible to regard the Bible as the literal word of God, or to turn superstitiously after the manner of the Virgilian lots to any chance text for immediate guidance in one's particular affairs, with the loss of authority came also, unfortunately, a loss of interest. Through having been made too exclusively sacred, the Bible forfeited momentarily its enormous secular power. With its study in the schools limited or even proscribed by sectarian jealousy, after having been virtually the whole of education, the Bible seemed to drop out of education altogether. In the long run, this will not matter, since one may safely prophesy that the Bible will outlive every sect fashioned upon it as Homer has outlived every pagan cult of Greece, but the loss to the immediate contemporary generation is uncalculable.

Few things could be culturally more deplorable than that today the average college graduate, who fancies himself educated, should never have read the Book of Job, should be unfamiliar with Isaiah, and should hardly be able to identfy those mighty men of valor Joshua, the son of Nun, Gideon, and Jepthah, or the most famous of scarlet women, Rehab, Delilah, Bath-sheba and should not only be thus absymally
