BOOKS

"Revolutions and Dictatorships" by Hans Kohn, deals with Jewish life during modern times beginning with a discussion of Messianism and concluding with a general analysis of the present grave international problem—the "Toltartarian Crisis," as the author calls it.

"Rebuilding Palestine," by Ben M. Edidin, is a vivid and interesting book written for children of Junior High age and presenting the thrilling story of our home land in the making.

It tells of the heroic struggles of the Halutzim, of the aims and structure of the Zionist movement and its achievements during the past sixty years. It discusses the new Hebrew culture, the cooperative labor movement and the important Arab problem in Palestine.

"Solomon Schechter," by Norman Bentwich is a fascinating biography and a penetrating study of the Dr. Schechter, the late president of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America. A splendid portrait of a deeply beloved scholar, sage, and leader, who loved his Judaism, and who contributed much to the upbuilding of Jewish life in America.
