IN CASE YOU'RE INTERESTED . . .

From authoritative sources the number of Jews in the world is placed at 16,-180,000.

According to the latest census, there are 4.831,180 Jews in the United States.

There are 601,797 in all the countries of Africa.

In all Asia there are 815,243 Jews. There are 23,553 Jews in Australia. In Hawaii there are only 310 Jews. New Zealand numbers 2,653 Jews. The Philippine Islands have 500 Jews.

From the 1935 census in Japan we learn there are only 200 Jews in the entire Empire.

Alaska has only 600 Jews.

While there are 40,000 Jews in Brazil, Argentina has 260,000 Jews and Uruguay only 12,000 Jews.

In the Virgin Islands there are all of 62 Jews.

The country with the lowest number is Tanganyika which has only 10 Jews, just enough for a minyan if they all stay put at one service.

Preceding the selections from each author is an introduction by the late A. H. Friedland.

JEWISH VOCATIONAL SERVICE

Choosing a career and finding a job are among the most serious problems facing people today. The questions of what to do, how to prepare, and where to find the opportunity to work have always been confusing; in recent years many individuals have found them too difficult to solve by themselves.

In Cleveland, the Jewish community has been working toward a unified and balanced program designed to meet the need for vocational guidance and employment. Under the auspices of the Jewish Welfare Fund, services in this direction rendered by the Jewish Social Service Bureau, the Cleveland Co-Ordinating Committee for Immgirants and the Council Educational Alliance have now been combined into a new agency, the Jewish Vocational Service, with offices at 241 Euclid Avenue. The purpose of the J. V. S. staff will be to coordinate all individual guidance and placement activities and group guidance with view to making these services available to the entire community.

Vocational guidance services will be extended as broadly into the community as facilities permit. Through skilled vocational counselling and psychological testing, the J. V. S. will help individuals to find their own vocational aptitudes and acquaint them with the opportunities and requirements in various fields of work. Efforts toward careful job placement will follow whenever necessary to complete the guidance service.

Employers and individuals seeking employment will be served through selective filling of job orders from a registration file open to any member of the community. Trained interviews will evaluate carefully the ability of applicants. Opening in all fields of work will be sought in order to assist members of the community to establish their abili-

BOOKS

"Studies in Jewish Preaching"—Middle Ages," by Professor Israel Bettan; Hebrew Union College.

Dr. Bettan presents a thorough analysis of the work and aims of some of the outstanding Jewish preachers of the Middle Ages, as reflected in the sermons they preached. He lets these representagive preachers speak for themselves, that they may enlighten us with respect to the true state of the sermon in the medieval Jewish pulpit, not by telling us about it, but by simply rehearsing their own parts, and thus reproduce for us the setting, the atmosphere, the conflicts, of that stirring drama, in the original enactment of which they numbered among the chief members of the cast.

"From the thirteenth through the eighteenth century," says Dr. Bettan in the preface of his book, "a most prolific period in Jewish preaching, we see the sermon take on more and more the form of an elaborate address, in which not only the ideas of the past, but the thought of the day as well, find their proper place and emphasis. It is the sermon as evolved through the middle period, then, that forms the real basis of the pulpit discourse today."

The Jewish Vocational Service will seek to strengthen Cleveland's vocational resources generally. It offers itself to employers as a source of competent, preselected workers who will play their part in an efficient functioning of industry. To existing employment services and to all interested elements in the community—schools, employers, labor organizations—it tenders its utmost cooperation in building a strong, co-ordinated approach to vocational guidance and employment efforts in Cleveland.

MAD HOUSE IN POLAND

Hitler's dreaded "Jewish Reservation" is beginning to take on form as trainloads of men, women and children arrive from Germany, Austria and Prague. These thousands of living corpses dumped on the streets and market places of Lublin are turning this old city into an enormous madhouse. Starvation, epidemics and death follow in the wake of this gruesome Nazi savagery.

In Warsaw, what is left of the 350,-000 Jews that occupied one-third of the city's area, are being segregated into a few ruined streets behind barbed wire fences, to freeze and starve to death. While the war against Poland has ended with the occupation of Warsaw, the war on the Jews is going on with unabated fury and is leading to Hitler's "solution" of the Jewish problem—the extermination of the Jews remaining under Nazi rule.

And American Jewry, four and onehalf million of us, read this news and practice "neutrality."

Perhaps the "Jewish Congress Bulletin" is right when it says: This contrast of the Lublinization of Polish Jewry on one hand and the strange, though fear stricken, silence of powerful American Jewry on the other hand is something which no mind can comprehend. more this contrast is pondered the more tragic grows the realization of our total unpreparedness-perhaps unworthiness —for the task assigned to us. American Jews have learned to make contributions for relief, how to look to others for defense, but they have not learned how to stand up as a people when the deadliest of their eniemies perpetrate upon their kin the most inhuman crimes known to civilization."

SURVEY AMONG CHRISTIAN STU-DENTS REVEALS INTER-FAITH FRIENDLINESS

Washington;—The majority of non-Jewish college students are friendly in their attitudes towards Jews and they bitterly hate Hitler's anti-Semitic program, but they oppose inter-marriage.

These facts were brought out in a survey conducted among 2,000 Christian students in 21 different colleges by Rabbi Ralph Blumenthal, of Huntington, W. Va., who reports on his experiment in the forthcoming December issue of The National Jewish Monthly.

When asked "Would you marry a Jewish person" 27% of the Gentile students answered yes; 57% no; and 16% were uncertain. When asked whether they approved of intermarriage between Jews and Christians, 33% said yes; 60% no; and 7% were uncertain.

Religious difference was given most often as the cause for these attitudes, although a large number opposed intermarriage because they believed the differences in cultural background, such as customs, ideals, and traditions, would prove difficult obstacles to happiness. Some were opposed because they had no wish to endure unpleasant social consequences; others, because they believed that children of mixed marriages would suffer.

When asked what their attitude would be toward a Jewish family that moved next door to them, 19% reported a favorable attitude; 19% unfavorable; 49% were indifferent; and 13% didn't know.

Only 15% favored a complete stoppage of immigration; 52% were for maintaining the present immigration level; 26% favored reducing it; and 7%, increasing it.

A surprising development in good will was shown when the students were asked whether they favored admission of Jews into the fraternities and other social clubs, 45% said yes; 42% said no; and 13% were unable to make up their minds.

Some 86% disapproved Hitler's treatment of German Jewry! 6.7% approved; and 7.3% didn't know.
