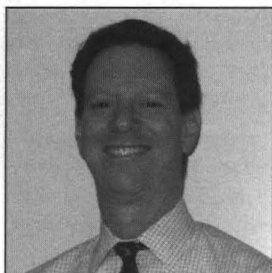
Ice Cream Social & Havdalah

CHAYIM: Finding Life in Torah, Community and Worship

"Your father said we could go – but not if it will upset you!" Upset me? It would be the first time since my first High Holy Days as a student cantor that my parents would not be with me at Rosh Hashanah, but what a wonderful opportunity for them – and especially my mother – to attend a reunion of the Jewish community in which she was born and grew up, in the small town of Aberdeen, South Dakota. I could hear the excitement in her voice, the anticipation of re-connecting with people whom she hadn't seen in over 65 years - or the descendants of those same individuals. My mother often speaks, with great pride, of the remarkable community of her childhood and early teen years. Exactly fifteen Jewish families supported a synagogue, a rabbi (who served also as the *shochet*, the ritual butcher), a Sisterhood and Brotherhood as well as local chapters of Hadassah, B'nai B'rith, ORT and NCJW. The same individuals who led the Jewish community, were civic leaders as well in this wonderfully evocative example of small-town America. Over the years, as most of the Jewish families left (my grandmother wanted to be sure that her children married Jews and so moved the whole group to Chicago!), the Jewish community dwindled until only two senior couples remained. And yet, those two couples, with extraordinary care, devotion and love, conducted services for the holidays and maintained the small synagogue in pristine condition so that when they conceived the idea of a reunion – there was a sacred space in which to welcome the returnees. There was no question – of course they would go! They were accompanied by two of their grandchildren: my niece, Ladeene Freimuth and my daughter, Jennifer.

It was a remarkable reunion that took place in Aberdeen, South Dakota, on Rosh Hashanah of 5765. Over 50 people gathered from all over the country to re-connect, re-acquaint, re-establish their historic and Jewish roots. It was a thrill for my mother to sit with my father and her two granddaughters in the third pew on the right-hand side – exactly where she had sat as a child with her parents and siblings. She was proud to stand on the bimah with her grandchildren with whom she shared an *aliyah* and then to stand next to my father as he twice chanted the *Haftarah* (for both mornings of their traditional observance of the holiday). During the night between the first and second days of Rosh Hashanah, in a wakeful moment, my mother remembered something she hadn't thought about in over 70 years. The next morning, during the service, she quietly told the story to one of the women who still lives in Aberdeen:

"When I was a child, my older brother, Joe, became critically ill with a ruptured appendix and peritonitis. As he hovered between life and death, my grandmother sewed a Torah cover and embroidered upon it, his Hebrew name." Right then and there, in the middle of the service, the woman got up out of her seat, walked up to the pulpit and opened a drawer under the ark. She came back to her seat with a velvet Torah cover in her hand. "This is the only one we have that we can't figure out where it came from or to whom it belongs," she said. They unfolded it together and there, embroidered at the bottom, was my uncle's Hebrew name, Yosef Zalman, preceded by the Hebrew name, Chayim!!! In order to divert the evil spirit that might have been lurking to do harm to my uncle, my great-grandmother gave him a new and symbolic name – "life!"

They interrupted the service to announce their discovery and to inform the congregation that 73 years after the Torah cover was sewn, my mother's brother, Joe Sudow, was still alive at 90 years old!

Torah. Community. Worship. This is the Jewish people's story. At all times, in all places, under all circumstances these are the source of our strength and our continuity.

May we be so blessed as to go forward together into an uncharted future inspired by our tradition, our relationships with each other and our abiding faith.

As we say goodbye to Rabbi Ruben, we at Anshe Chesed Fairmount Temple find ourselves in a period of transition. All transitions involve loss, but they are also full of potential for growth and change. As you know, congregants, staff, and Board members have been engaged in the process of developing a Strategic Plan for our future, *Envisioning Together*. This plan will enable us to take a fresh look at the pillars of our congregation, *Lifelong Learning*, *Sacred Community*, and *Worship*. What kind of community do we want to be? How do we make our vision a reality?

Our vision of the **Sacred Community** pillar includes making Fairmount Temple feel like the “largest small synagogue” in Cleveland. We are extremely fortunate to have all the advantages of a large synagogue—a beautiful building, excellent learning options for children and adults, and a variety of worship services. We also have the opportunity to create the culture of a small congregation, with its atmosphere of warmth, caring, and connection. We hope to deepen congregants’ experience of belonging to a true community in which members take care of each other in difficult times and share in each others’ happiness in times of joy.

Although the possibilities are certainly endless, we have identified three ways to enhance our sense of connection to each other, thereby enriching all our lives:

~Community Kitchen

- Gather together to cook meals that will be frozen and stored for delivery to congregants who are ill or who have lost a loved one.

~Bikkur Cholim

- Visit our congregants who are lonely or ill and may not have anyone else to visit them. Training and support provided.

~Chavurot

- A great way to feel connected to a large congregation is to join a small community within. We would like to form chavurot, groups of congregants who get together to socialize, learn, or celebrate holidays and life cycle events. Chavurot could be organized according to stage of life (eg. post-YPC, empty nesters, etc.) or shared interests (eg. interfaith families, single parents, etc.).

At this time of transition, let’s pull together as a congregation. Let’s build and deepen our relationships with each other. Let’s create the largest small synagogue in Cleveland!

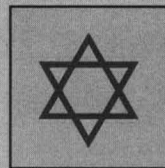
Brotherhood Barbecue

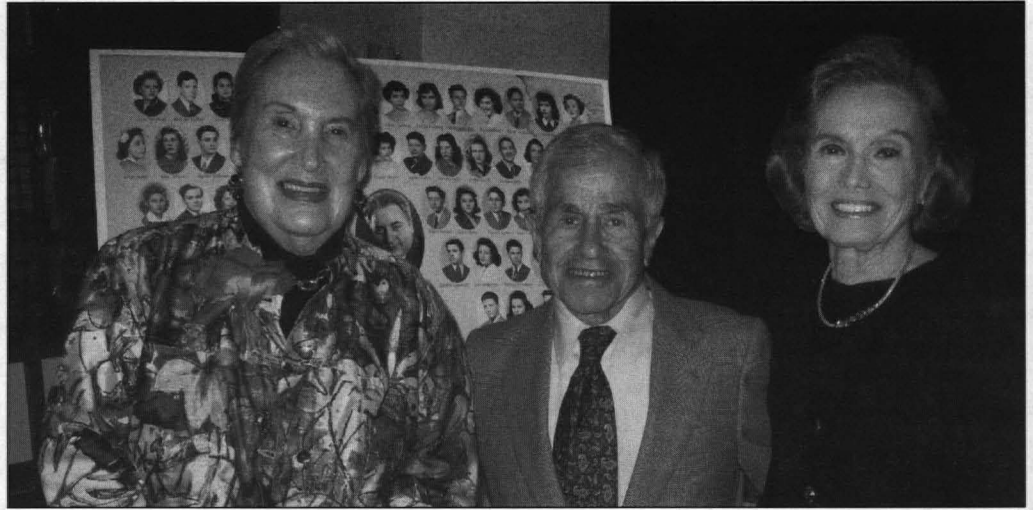
