

## Celebrating As a Congregation



For as long as I can remember, my family would anxiously await the High Holidays at Fairmount Temple. On one hand, coming to the temple during the Days of Awe was the time of the year to reconnect with friends, classmates and some family members whose paths we crossed infrequently. That was fun, but as a kid wearing a new suit for the holiday, I had to look and act my best! That was tough as the services tended to be long, and a bit over the top, so fidgeting and mild horse play came naturally. I remember, too, how different the temple looked. The bimah surrounded by bouquets of white flowers and the clergy looked

more pious than ever donning white robes and Tallit typically not seen during regular services. So it went year after year.

My memories of these past High Holidays of 5771 are different. Yes, as President I was a bit more involved, and I won't forget giving my first speech to the congregation. But I shall also remember that this was the first High Holiday services at Fairmount Temple for our new Senior Rabbi. Rabbi Robert Nosanchuk started officially in July and I know he had to work in mysterious ways to craft several sermons while continuing to meet so many of you in personal ways. I saw our new leader take hold of our congregation in ways unimaginable. His poetic, yes slightly animated sermons, were both thought provoking and, might I say, entertaining. The collegiality, the solidarity of our clergy team was incredible; Rabbi Caruso was magnificent and for those who saw Cantor Sager and her daughter Rabbi Jennifer Gertman together on the pulpit witnessed a very rich and beautiful moment of their personal history unfolding before us.

The High Holidays are special times at the synagogue, but let's not wait another year to all come together as a congregation. In just a few weeks, **December 3-5**, we will be celebrating a joyous and historic weekend at the temple. I envision that some wonderful memories will be created for all of us during the official installation of Rabbi Nosanchuk as our Senior Rabbi.

As a testament to the respect Rabbi Nosanchuk has garnered from the Union for Reform Judaism, his installation address will be delivered by the esteemed Rabbi David Ellenson, President of the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion. As the *rosh yeshiva* ("head of seminary") for our Reform Jewish movement, the presence of this distinguished leader is unprecedented and speaks volumes about the close personal relationship between our rabbi and his teacher. I have been told that Rabbi Ellenson officiates at very few events, but this was one ceremony where he was truly honored to have been asked to give the installation address (*see Rabbi Ellenson's comments on front cover*).

The festivities will begin with the sold-out formal dinner Friday night. Following the dinner will be the remarkable Shabbat Installation Service at 7:30 p.m. with our Clergy Team and Rabbi Ellenson. Saturday night is our famous Chanukah latke dinner whereupon the children of the congregation will join the installation festivities. The weekend concludes on Sunday with an array of Mitzvah Day projects. It's a weekend that you won't want to miss! And yes, there is more! We will be joined by another prominent guest on Monday, Dec. 6, when Rabbi Jonah Pesner leads a Monday Night Learning session on *Tikkun Olam* that is open to all, see page 4.

I encourage every one of you, your families and friends to join us. Let's come together again as a congregation to celebrate the privilege of officially welcoming our new Senior Rabbi into the fold. I know he and his family would appreciate sharing this momentous and joyous weekend with all of you.

Let's build new, wonderful memories together as a congregation.

## MONDAY NIGHT LEARNING



The Fairmount Temple clergy team will offer this series of adult courses based on an acclaimed series of entry-level books offered through Jewish Lights Publishing. "The Way Into..." at Fairmount Temple will be a "guided tour" of the Jewish faith, helping each student to interact with key sacred texts, our clergy and community.

The Way Into ... Series offers an accessible and highly usable "guided tour" of the Jewish faith, people, history, and beliefs—in total, an introduction to Judaism that will enable you to understand and interact with the sacred texts of the Jewish tradition. Each volume is written by a leading contemporary scholar and teacher, and explores one key aspect of Judaism. The Way Into... enables all readers to achieve a real sense of Jewish cultural literacy through guided study.

#### The Way into Tikkun Olam (Repairing the World)

Mondays, Dec. 6 and 13 - This series continues with Rabbi Jonah Pesner, Director of the URJ Just Congregations leading the Dec. 6 session and Cantor Sager the final one. This is a unique opportunity to hear from Rabbi Pesner, who works with synagogues across the country pursuing social justice and has appeared on CNN's Faces of Faith program. He will continue the discussions pulled from The Way into Tikkun Olam by Rabbi Elliot Dorff (Jewish Lights Publishing.) and questions such as: What is Tikkun Olam and why should we care? How does it relate to the way we speak with one another? Can we join together with congregations of many faiths and organize to "repair the world?" He will also examine the Jewish Theological Underpinnings of Community Organizing. Even if you have not attended the earlier sessions of this program, you won't be left out.

#### The Way Into Jewish Prayer

Mondays, Jan. 31, Feb. 7, 14, 28, 7:30 p.m. with Cantor Sarah Sager

(co-sponsored by Hodesh Limud, a project of Siegal College)

The class texts will draw themes from the book: *The Way into Jewish Prayer* by Rabbi Lawrence Hoffman (Jewish Lights Publishing.) Our texts will address questions such as: What are the key ideas of Jewish prayer? To whom do Jews pray? And how does one become a more prayerful person?

#### The Way into Varieties of Jewishness

Mondays, March 7, 14, 21 and April 11, 7:30 p.m. with Rabbi Joshua Caruso The class texts will draw themes from the book: *The Way into Varieties of Jewishness* by Sylvia Barack Fishman, Ph.D. Our texts will address questions such as: What are the boundaries of Jewish observance? Why is the question of "Who is a Jew?" so difficult? What are the true religious differences among the Jewish movements?

### The Way into Jewish Mystical Tradition

Mondays, May 9, 16, 23, and June 6, 7:30 p.m. with Rabbi Robert Nosanchuk The class texts will draw themes from the book: *The Way into Jewish Mystical Tradition* by Rabbi Lawrence Kushner (Jewish Lights Publishing.) Our texts will address questions such as: What are key concepts in Jewish mysticism? How do they relate to our lives? How did the mystics describe creation, awe, reverence, and other key Jewish ideas?

Transgender: A Parent's Perspective Friday, Dec. 17, 7:30 pm (between services)

Chevrei Tikva members Karen and Bob Gross will share their personal and moving story of helping their own transgender child and their founding of



TransFamily, a support group for persons who identify as transgender.

Bob & Karen, who have been married for 46 years, travel the country speaking to many groups and PFLAG chapters, educating all who will listen, about transgender issues. Bob and Karen also contributed chapters to the book, *Trans Forming Families: Real Stories About Transgendered Loved Ones*.

Listen to their story, from their son's "coming out" to his legal 12-year marriage to a man he met during his transition. Learn about how Karen, who felt she was responsible for Mitch's problem, learned that she was not at fault. And, learn how Mitch, with his parents support, took on his new personna.

Karen and Bob are happy to support their son, and others, in their journeys of discovery. As they often say, "You never help yourself as much as when you help others."

# Can We Be One Fairmount? Our Teachings on Being Jewish and GLBT Friday, January 7, 6:15 Shabbat Service

Fairmount Temple and many in the Jewish community strive for inclusion of Jews who are Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender. Why is this important- and on what basis do we engage in



GLBT outreach? During this Shabbat Service, Senior Rabbi Robert Nosanchuk will explore Jewish texts and initiatives as they relate to the GLBT community. Discover how Jewish teachings can inform our goal of being inclusive and welcoming at Fairmount Temple.

#### **CARING COMMUNITY**

Last spring, the SENIOR CONNECTIONS TASK FORCE of Caring Community initiated a new program to make sure our older members feel connected to their synagogue. Seventeen congregants have since been trained to make these special calls, and are creating personal connections with our seniors every month.

"The Phone Connections Committee enables our congregation to reach out to our senior members on their special occasions - birthdays and anniversaries - and let them know that in addition to the clergy, the members of our congregation are thinking of them," says Karen Newborn. "Our members have been delighted to receive this personal touch."

Phone Connection Committee members call congregants who are turning 85 years old or older, and those who have been married 50 years or more. In addition to extending greetings on behalf of the congregation, they sometimes engage the seniors in conversation that yields important information. One volunteer found out that the man he was calling to wish happy birthday was anxious about an upcoming medical procedure. Not only were we then able to arrange for our clergy to call the man ahead of the procedure, but a meal from our Community Kitchen was delivered upon his return from the hospital. Another congregant told the volunteer caller that now that she is no longer able to get to temple, she really misses her relationship with Cantor Sager. Cantor Sager was delighted to reestablish contact by giving the congregant a call. Still another member, in her nineties, told the volunteer that she is worried about being able to get to temple to observe her mother's upcoming yahrzeit. We then called the member to arrange for a ride to Shabbat services on the appropriate day.

The phone volunteers say they look forward to making the calls, and are gratified by the positive response. "I really enjoy connecting with congregants from other generations," states Lisa Lebowitz. "I'm so impressed with how vibrant so many of these individuals are! Not only can I hope to add a little joy when I call someone for their special day, but I personally get a lot out of these conversations as well."

For the past five years, Fairmount Temple has been the second home to the Mandel JCC Playmakers Youth Theatre. The recent production of the Playmakers Youth Theatre, *The Diary of Anne Frank*, featured Fairmount Temple member, Camille Rekhson, in the role of Miep, who, along with Mr. Kraler, became the support line for the hidden residents of the annex, bringing them food and other necessities. Miep found Anne's diary at the conclusion of the war and managed to preserve it and the rest is history.



About this experience, Camille said, "Although she is only a minor character in the show, her role in the survival of the annex's residents was monumental. I hope that in portraying Miep, I can do her justice. Being a part of this powerful production is truly quite an experience.
