Open meetings on dues plan



E-Experimenting F-Achieving.

The ABC'S of Jewish education





A-Informing Students, young and old alike, must be functionally literate in a Jewish way. We all must know the basics; for example, that there are Ten Commandments, not nine. That Shabbat is the 7th day of the week and that Rosh Hashana is the New Year when we hear the Shofar blown and read of Abraham bringing Isaac to be bound, but not actually sacrificed. Facts are still required tools to Knowledge, but Jewish education only begins

B-Enabling As we learn the basics we also must learn how to use the information. We should learn and practice lighting candles, saying Kiddush, making motzi ourselves. One learning experience must enable us to do the deeds for ourselves as participants, not merely observers.

C-Role Modeling Our classrooms must aid parents and grandparents to become teachers to our children. Parents must begin to see themselves as our children's best examples. So parent participation becomes an enabling avenue to greater participation in the learning. teaching process. Multigenerational learning and teaching together will help bring family unity as well as greater Jewish awareness.

D—Expanding Jewish learning must burst beyond the four walls of classroom out into the world, the wide, wonderful world of Jewish experience. That is the idea behind the New York and Israel Discovery trips. The trips to Heritage House, a cemetery, a museum. another synagogue, these all add to our Jewish memory bank as we begin to individualize Jewish expression for our students and families.

E-Experimenting And as we expand, we continue to look for new and different approaches, ever-creative ways of teaching the values and morals of our tradition. Hillel had a student who stood on one foot. Our students may one day stand on Mars. Question: How is Shabbat to be celebrated on Mars? (Answer: first become fully acquainted with its observance here on Earth, then pose the question to your child. After all, your child, not you, will probably have to answer your grandchild long distance from Earth to Mars.)

F-Achieving We all must learn more and do more as we all have a stake in our children's development. Our survival depends on how much we actually know and apply in our Daily Jewish Lives. We can achieve great education. So this year more than ever, read this article again and give it some thought. Then come in and get involved with your child and grandchild-after all, we are. And we want to share it all with you. It is the ABC's of what our school is about.
