Rabbi's Message

When the heart is full, the eyes overflow.

-Yiddish saying

Dear Friends,

As I write these words, our hearts, indeed, are full and our eyes overflowing. How could it be anything else when we have suffered the loss of such a special individual? Rabbi Marianne Gevirtz brought the fullness of her gifts to everyone she met and everything she did.

Just as our ancestors before us, we look to the words of Ecclesiastes for guidance:

For every thing there is a season, and a time for every desire under heaven.

A time to be born and a time to die;

A time to plant and a time to uproot what has been planted.

A time to tear down and a time to build up;

A time to weep and a time to laugh;

A time to grieve and a time to dance;

A time to cast away stones and a time to gather stones.

A time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing;

A time to seek and a time to lose;

A time to keep and a time to give away;

A time to rend and a time to mend;

A time to keep silence and a time to speak.

-Ecclesiastes 3:1-7

Now is the time for weeping and grieving. While our tears may flow, our grief should be tempered by the knowledge that Temple Sholom, both as a congregation and as individuals, was given not just eight precious years with Rabbi Gevirtz, but a second gift, too. For these past months, its members have been here to help Rabbi Gevirtz in so many ways — by their presence, by their *gemilut-chasadim*, their acts of lovingkindness, such as preparing food, providing transportation, and all the other things they did. Far too often we do not take advantage of the opportunity to tell someone how much she means to us before it is too late. When it was time to be strong, you were strong. It was a gift of your love to Rabbi Gevirtz.

It is because the heart is so full that the eyes overflow. But we also learn "Weeping may tarry for the night but joy cometh in the morning" [Psalm 30:6]. In the morning when the tears have abated, may we transform the sorrow of today to joy as we embrace our time with Rabbi Gevirtz and embody the lessons she taught us by her example.

TEMPLE LAUNCHES RABBINIC SEARCH Congregational Focus Group — February 1

Rabinnic Search Committee

The Board of Trustees of Temple Sholom has appointed a Rabbinic Search Committee consisting of the following four board members and four off-board members: Steve Broidy, Kim Fish, Laurie Leventhal, Aida Merhemic, Fran Rickenbach, Beverly Weiser, Gary Zaremsky, and Faye Flack, Chair.

The Committee will operate for approximately five months (January –May), will report directly to the Board of Trustees, and is charged with the following responsibilities:

- Gather, interpret, and report information from the congregation on important questions and issues regarding core values of the congregation, qualities of a new rabbi, and short- and long-term goals for the rabbi and congregation.
- Research the best rabbinic leadership option from among a variety of choices and make recommendation to the Board of Trustees, e.g. part-time student rabbi, permanent full-time newly-ordained rabbi, full-time interim rabbi or cantor, other options as available.
- Pursue option(s) of choice and complete process until candidate is chosen. This may include initial interviews off-site, interviews in Springfield, involving the congregation in selection process, reporting progress to the congregation, etc.

The Committee's first meeting is scheduled for mid-January. If at any time during the next several months you have questions, concerns, information, or feedback to inform the search process, please contact Faye or any other member of the Search Committee.

Focus Group

On Sunday, February 1, 2004, at 10:00 a.m. in the meeting room at Temple, the Search Committee will conduct a Focus Group open to any member of the congregation who has not previously participated. This one-hour, structured meeting is designed to express your thoughts on several topics that will aid the Search Committee in finding the best rabbi for our congregation. We encourage as many of you as possible to participate. Call the Temple office to R.S.V.P. so that we may plan for materials and refreshments.

If you would like to be a part of this process but cannot attend the focus group meeting on **February** 1, call Diane at the Temple office and ask her to send you (by e-mail or U.S. mail) a questionnaire. Complete the questionnaire and return it to the Temple office by **February** 5. This will ensure that your feedback is included in our Rabbinic Leadership Report to the Community, scheduled for March publication.

Thank you, in advance, for your participation in the Rabbinic selection process. We welcome your comments and suggestions.


