BETWEEN US . . .

We have been holding a number of evening meetings for prospective members of our congregation. I have met a lot of nice people and I hope that they decide to join the Temple. Most of them are young. Their children are getting ready to start religious school. Some have belonged to other congregations; but most of them are affiliating with their first congregation as adults. So they ask all the important questions — about religious school hours, the course of study, the cost of temple membership, the various programs that we offer.

And I get to give them my shpiel. You know: Anshe Emeth, founded in 1859; old and yet young; many generations in our Temple. Our focus is on the celebration of life through our Jewish ways. I tell them that we are a synagogue committed to excellence and that we are proud of our worship, our education for young and adults, our youth programs, and our commitment to being a vital part of our community in reaching out to those in need, Jew and non-Jew alike.

And I always hope that they will want to join. After all, new members are the life-blood of our Temple. And most do join. But some do not. Some don't join because they find another synagogue that is right for them (after all, no two synagogues are alike). Some don't join because we ask too much from our members — too much time, too much involvement, too much activity and challenge.

Some don't join because they don't understand the meaning of community. They see the synagogue merely as a place to fill their needs only when they need them filled. They think of the Temple as a kind of "spiritual service station." They pull in and buy only what

they need and then they are off again. They don't like it that we insist on membership for religious school enrollment or that our clergy officiate only at life cycle events of members and their families.

And these folks don't understand something about life. They don't understand that a community is nothing without its institutions. The institutions of a community determine what kind of a community it is. And if we want a community that is a treasured place where people are carried through the joys and sorrows of life, we need to build institutions that will enable us to do that; we need synagogues where we can fulfill our dreams and teach them to our children so that they can carry them out, too.

And these people don't understand that a Jew cannot live alone. A Jew can only be a Jew in community. For as a community, Jews are able to celebrate the sacred in life. As a community, Jews are able to weather the storms of hatred, ignorance and prejudice. As a community, Jews are able to defend the rights of liberty and justice, carrying them out in practice and in belief. And as a community, Jews are able to live freely, fully and openly.

What does it mean to join and be a member of a synagogue? Oh, probably the third most important thing in life — after health and family. For when we have synagogue we have life, we have community, we have Torah, and we have a shared vision of a glorious past, present and future.

To our new members, a very warm and gracious welcome. You have just become affiliated with one of the most important insitutions of life. Anshe Emeth — a place to celebrate life and living through the wondrous traditions of our Jewish faith. Beruchim Haba-im!!!

WORSHIP SERVICES - SEPTEMBER 1991

SATURDAY, AUGUST 31 – Our High Holy Day period is ushered in by a special midnight worship called Selichot (forgiveness). This very beautiful experience helps us to set the themes and ideas of the High Holidays. We will begin a 8:30 by joining to see a showing of the acclaimed movie "The Plot Against Harry." This movie was first released in 1969 and was recently re-released. It depicts the life of Harry Plotnick, a small-time Jewish gangster, as he is released from prison and attempts to return to life and living. Harry encounters some of the questions that you and I face in our dealings with family, friends, and society. It is a moving depiction of life and will certainly give each of us reason to pause and think about the lives that we lead. Following a discussion we will conclude with Havdalah and our Selichot service.

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 6 – As we prepare for the High Holy Days, Rabbi Miller will guide us through some of the themes of this penitential period as they apply to us and our time.

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 13 – The job of hospital chaplain calls upon one to pray with and for patients at the most profound moments in life, yet Jews seem to have lost the connection with prayer – and are thus unable to express the power and sanctity of these moments. Rabbi Paskoff will explore these issues and reflect on his experience as a hospital chaplain this summer.

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 20 – The Torah portion for this week is a magnificent poem. It represents the vision that was Moses' as he looked back on his life and turned to the future for the Jewish People. Rabbi Miller will share with us some thoughts and insights about the meaning of this vision and what it means for us in our own day.

MONDAYS, SEPTEMBER 23 & SEPTEMBER 30 – We will join in sacred assembly as we begin our observance of Sukkot and conclude it with Yizkor. We will gather for worship at 11 a.m. and conclude with gathering in the Temple's Sukkah for Oneg Chag.

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 27 – Join with your family in celebrating Shabbat and Sukkot folk style. We will also give a special welcome to our new members and their families.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 30 – What could be more exciting than celebrating the birth of the Torah? With rejoicing we dance and sing as the Torahs are paraded throughout the Sanctuary and into our Social Hall. And all of our new students will be consecrated as they join with our Rabbis on the Bimah.

FULLFILL THE MITZVAH OF TZEDAKAH

In keeping with the Mitzvot of the High Holy Day period, please fullfill the Mitzvah of Tzedakah by helping us fill the food pantries for the needy in this area. Please bring canned and packaged goods with you Rosh Hashanah Eve. There will be containers for drop-off as you enter for services.

Please also remember to bring somthing for our Mitzvah crib in the lobby. Baby food, juice, diapers, etc. are given to babies whose families are victims of domestic violence.

ANNUAL ISRAEL BOND APPEAL TO BE HELD

Trying times test character, and today the Jewish people face a genuinely historic test.

From the Soviet Union, Ethiopia and other lands of Jewish danger, the flood of immigrants continues to pour into Israel. The situation calls for a massive, concrete demonstration of World Jewish understanding and support.

During the approaching Days of Awe, all members of our congregation must face our responsibilities as members of the world Jewish community. We hoped and prayed for the time when Soviet Jews would be free to emigrate to Israel. Now that time has come. Now we have a clear obligation to help secure the full measure of this promising moment, a moment with enormous significance for all future Jewish generations.

Israel is currently grappling with an acute shortage of housing for those who have already arrived. The entire Jewish people has a share in the great human drama that will transform the Jewish State.

Our congregation is privileged to help usher in that era through our participation in this year's High Holy Days Appeal for State of Israel Bonds.

Every family must stretch to make a maximum Israel Bond purchase. Israel's Minister of Finance has promised that Bond sales will be used to provide jobs and housing for immigrants.

No one may occupy any vacant seats unless the Seating Committee is advised of their availability prior to the start of services. Remember, please, that tickets will be required at afternoon Yom Kippur, Yizkor, and Ne'elah services. Ushers will check tickets.

Arrangements may be made for babysitting of children, ages 6-10, during morning services on both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. If you want your children to participate, please call the Temple office (545-6484) by September 3 to make a reservation.

Ushers are needed for all High Holy Day services. If you can assist at one or more of the services, please call Fred Greenstein at 249-6456 or the Temple office (545-6484).

The congregation provides large print editions of the High Holy Days prayer book to those wishing to use them. Ask an usher to provide you with one. Special audio equipment for the hearing impaired is available for use in the Sanctuary. Please call the Temple office to reserve a head set.

Because of physical impairments, some members of the congregation may not be able to attend High Holy Day services. If you or a member of your family is unable to worship with us at the Temple, cassette recordings of previous High Holy Day services will be available. Please call the Temple office to make arrangements to obtain the tapes.

The Carine and Community Program

The High Holiday Season brings with it the anniversary of our Caring Community Program. It was at the Rosh Hashana Service in 1983 that Rabbi Miller first proposed that our Temple become a Caring Community – a place where we could reach out to our Temple family as well as the community. During this period of time, over 300 congregants have volunteered to assist in a variety of ways. Their commitments ranged from once a week to once a month to once a year.

Some of the services that our Caring Community Program provides are:

- (1) Ongoing Food Drive We encourage all congregants to bring a non-perishable food product to Temple whenever they come. A food barrel is in the lobby in front of the office The food is then distributed to the God Squad and Jewish Family Services.
- (2) Passover Food Drive Food is collected, purchased, and delivered by our volunteers to over thirty families identified by Jewish Family Services.
- (3) Shelter for Homeless Men We have combined with several area churches to have homeless men for several weeks during the winter.
- (4) Hospital Visitation Volunteers visit Jewish patients in the two area hospitals. A training session is provided.
- (5) Holiday Hospital Project Our volunteers assume non-medical duties at the area hospitals on Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Easter.
- (6) Quilt Project volunteers work on creating quilts which are given to children with AIDS in the area hospitals.
- (7) Leftover Food Donation Food that is left over from both Temple and private celebrations will be frozen and donated to a local battered women's shelter.
- (8) Aiding the Bereaved Volunteers will assist in setting up the home while the family is at the funeral.

We welcome both returning volunteers and first timers to share the Mitzvot and move our Caring Community Program into its ninth year. Shana Tovah.



ROSH HASHANAH 5752 HOME CEREMONIAL READING

During the course of the festive meal on Rosh Hashanah evening, pieces of apple that have been dipped in honey are distributed to the participants and the following is read either in unison or responsively.

For centuries, Jews have celebrated Rosh Hashanah by eating apples and honey. We express our hopes and prayers that this new year ahead may be especially sweet for ourselves, our loved ones and all the Jewish people around the world.

Seated at the festive table, we remember our precious heritage. We understand that the new year is a sacred time for reflection and hope, as we pray for guidance to meet the challenges of the coming year.

The beginning of the year 5752 is marked by extraordinary events.

We are witnessing the redemption of Ethiopian Jews in the land of Israel. May their memories of famine and danger fade, as they experience the joy of reunification with their families.

We are witnessing the emigration of more than 250,000 Soviet Jews who have been isolated from the mainstream of the Jewish world for decades. May they find empathy and caring as they establish new homes among the people of Israel.

We are witnessing — where there had been repression — the resurgence of Jewish vitality in Eastern Europe. May these communities gain new strength and success in their endeavors.

We are witnessing, through Operation Exodus, an outpouring of compassion and generosity for all Jews in need. May we be thankful for our religious freedom and the ability and opportunity to extend help to others.

Now, on this Rosh Hashanah, as we once again dip our apples into honey, we recite the age-old words of our tradition. May we enlarge our horizons, pledging to ourselves that this year we will do even more to reach out to Jews in distress, wherever they may be.
