## ANSHE EMETH ALABAMA CIVIL RIGHTS TOUR AUG 6-10, 2003

"I felt my legs were praying"-Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel (on the march from Selma to Montgomery 1965)

This Aug. 28 marks the 40th anniversary of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s immortal "I Have a Dream" speech. In that spirit, it is our pleasure to invite our temple family to join in an amazing adventure. This summer, from **August 6-10** members of our temple will be participating in a Civil Rights pilgrimage to Alabama, to see and experience first hand where many of the battles of the Civil Rights era were fought.

Trip highlights include: Birmingham-where we will visit the Civil Rights Museum, spend Shabbat at Temple Emanu-El, and learn with members of their Black-Jewish dialogue initiative, Peace Birmingham. Selma-where we will visit the National Voting Rights Museum, participate in a walking tour of the city, led by a survivor of the era, including a walk across the

Edmund Pettus Bridge, the place where marchers were beaten in an attempt to walk to Montgomery. Montgomery-where we will visit the Southern Poverty Law Center, Rosa Parks Museum, and where we will meet with a Jewish leader to learn about the Jewish role in promoting civil rights in America.

And much more!

Participants will be lodging in Birmingham for most of the trip, with one night at the Historic St. James Hotel in Selma. Estimated cost of trip including round trip airfare, ground transportation, hotel accommodations, programs, speakers, and facilities and some meals is \$690 per person.

# Helping the sick get back on their feet

The acronym spells HELP. And that in fact is what this probably unique program provides.

Through HELP — the Health Equipment Loan Program — people in need can borrow hospital beds, shower seats, walkers, canes, wheelchairs and other equipment. The only fee is a \$10 deposit, \$25 for a wheelchair or a hospital bed, and that's refunded when the equipment is returned.

HELP is a project of the Anshe Emeth Community Development Corporation, a social-service agency at 228 Livingston Ave., New Brunswick.

The agency is an extension of Anshe Emeth Memorial Temple, a Jewish Reform congregation next door in the ornate-domed building on Livingston Avenue.

"Our main focus is helping people who fall between the cracks," said Deborah Cherniss of Highland Park, board chairperson.

The goal is outlined clearly in one of the fliers available at the agency's office:

"To serve the elderly, the disabled, the 'working poor' and others whose income, though very low, makes them ineligible for most free or subsidized social, legal, and health-related services."

Services are provided in Spanish and English.

Guidelines are flexible and special situations are taken into account.

The Anshe Emeth Community Development Corporation serves people in Middlesex County and Franklin Township.


But you don't have to be Jewish to avail yourself of the service that HELP and the corporation offers. The great majority of people using the service are not Jewish, says Adriana Roffman, services coordinator.

"The group serves Latinos, African-Americans, Indians, Asians, a whole wide range, as well as Jewish," said Roffman.

Roffman, who speaks Spanish and English, does outreach, going to seniors centers and health and meeting with clergy.

"I wear many hats," she said.

"We've helped many people — from newborns, who need nebulizers (respiratory assistance devices) to help them breathe, to people over 65."

Roffman said more than 95 percent of the equipment that is borrowed is returned and then made available to others.

Referrals for HELP come from area health and social service agencies, clergy, hospital-discharge planners and others who are aware of the program.

For Camille Sahine of Metuchen, information came from St. Peter's University Hospital, New Brunswick, where his mom was waiting to be discharged after suffering a stroke. She was in need of a hospital bed and that's where HELP came in.

HELP works with volunteers, and one of them, Hank, a temple member who prefers to remain anonymous, assisted Camille with acquiring the bed.

Here's how the hospital bed got disassembled in Highland Park and reassembled in South Brunswick:

At 3 p.m. Camille, driving his father-in-law's beat-up pick-up truck, met Hank in front of 242 S. Sixth Ave. in Highland Park, a seniors building. There, in a

first-floor apartment vacated by a tenant, Camille and Hank disassembled a heavy, motorized hospital bed. Hank had broken down such beds before and was quite good at it. He wore a baseball cap and jeans, not his ordinary garb for his professional job.

The bed originally was lent to the former tenant by the agency.

Nurse Janie Masur, stationed at the seniors building, offered several other pieces of equipment that were accumulating in a storage room. She donated three walkers, three shower seats, two commodes and a set of crutches.

The additional equipment was piled onto the pick-up with the disassembled bed. Camille and Hank then drove to New Brunswick to the agency's warehouse, a former factory on Bethany Street. There Camille

picked up a walker and a new wheelchair, still in its box, donated by the American Wheelchair Foundation, Rotary Club and Major League Baseball.

Next, they drove to the agency office where Camille signed for the equipment and paid the deposit. They headed to South Brunswick where the bed was reassembled in Camille's niece's apartment.

"The satisfaction I get out of what I'm doing is just to see the expression on the faces of the people we're helping," Hank said.

HELP is only one of the programs offered by Anshe Emeth Community Development Corporation.

The agency, a nonprofit organization, has been offering services to the community since October, 2000. It is funded by grants from the New Jersey Office of Faith-Based Initiatives,

the George Link Jr. Foundation, the Middlesex County Board of Freeholders, Anshe Emeth Memorial Temple and a group called Friends of the AECDC, headed by Marci Feldheim to raise funds for the effort.

Other services include a legal assistance clinic which offers consultations on most civil matters, excluding divorce, and where information is available to help clients obtain pro bono or reduced-fee legal representation.

Another program, Information on Health Insurance Options, helps clients understand the benefits and choices available through Medicaid, Medicare, and NJ FamilyCare, a state health insurance program for children up to age 19. The office is a NJ FamilyCare registration site.

Daniel Wolfson of Highland Park, a volunteer who became a member of the agency's board, has picked up and delivered hospital beds and other equipment on numerous occasions.

"We do our work in a professional way," he said. "We treat people with dignity. When we take equipment out, people are grateful. What would they do with the equipment? They, as survivors, have done something nice for people in the face of a loss of a loved one."

What Dan is doing as a agency volunteer is *tikkun olam*, a Hebrew expression meaning to help repair the world. It is an expression used by Hank and Deborah Cherniss and reflects the outlook of social outreach expressed by members of the temple.

"We're doing our little piece of it," Cherniss said.

She is pleased with the response of the volunteers, but said additional volunteers who could be available during the week would be a help. The agency has a dozen volunteers.

The agency came about with the assistance of Rabbi Bennett F. Miller. "The rabbi was the inspiration and really supported the idea and led us," Cherniss said.

The community development corporation is working on a new program for health literacy for Spanish-speaking people to help them understand what is available in the health field, Cherniss said.
