The Rabbi Writes . . .
Rabbi Laurence P. Malinger

On Wednesday evening, **October 6, 2004, at 7:30 p.m.**, we will join together as a community to celebrate *Simchat Torah* – the Rejoicing of the Torah. During this festival service, we will perform the ceremony of Consecration. This festival service marks two significant points in our Jewish calendar – two important moments in the life of our community and our congregation. Number one is that this is the festival that we read the final words of the book of Deuteronomy, and begin anew with the opening words of Genesis. The second reason that this festival is significant is that this evening we hold our annual Consecration service for the new students in our Religious School. Consecration marks the official beginning of these kids' religious education – this is the day on which they and their parents officially affirm in the eyes of the synagogue that Hebrew and Jewish learning are integral parts of the child's life. Both of these *simchas*, these happy occasions, represent new beginnings. But there is a real difference between the milestone of Simchat Torah and that of the Consecration ceremony, and I'd like to take a moment to examine it.

Although both of these ritual moments in our calendars are about beginnings, the types of beginnings they demonstrate must be considered separately, because they both represent important models for the way we Jews perceive religion, and even for the way we understand time itself. Bringing a child before this congregation to have him or her Consecrated is the truer "beginning" of the two events. These kids have only one first year of religious school and never again in their lives will they be officially starting their Jewish education. In contrast to this, Simchat Torah basically marks a return to the starting point of an eternal cycle. We read the same five books of the Torah every year, the words are always exactly the same, and each year on Simchat Torah we revisit the beginning of the story: "*B'reishit bara Elohim et hashamayim v'et ha'aretz*," "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth."

On Simchat Torah, the holiday celebrating the wonder of Torah, our readings from the Bible give us insight into a continuum, not just a cycle. On Simchat Torah, we "finish" the Torah by reading the end of Deuteronomy, and then immediately wind back to the beginning of Genesis, signifying the never-ending spiral of Jewish teaching. But the Haftarah we read on Simchat Torah is from Joshua, the book of the Bible that comes right after Deuteronomy. This shows us that, despite the circles of Jewish ritual time, the history of the Jewish people is constantly moving forward, into the future. This divergence of time is really a wondrous thing: after Moses dies, Joshua takes over and leads the people into the Land at the same time that the entire cosmos is recreated out of nothingness.

On this festival, we reconnect with Genesis – the beginning of the Bible's account of history. But also on this festival we can recognize that the Bible – Torah – is bigger than history. The words of Torah can connect us with those who came before us and those who are yet to be. The words of Torah can bind us to the morals, the ethics, the teachings of the Jewish people. When our children and we study the words of Torah together, we can experience the very mind of God in a way impossible in any other intellectual venture. May this festival be a joyful celebration for all of us.

Wanted: Special Woman to help an infertile couple build their family through Gestational Surrogacy

A local Jewish couple is seeking a special woman who is interested in taking on the selfless role of Gestational Carrier (GC) to help them build their family.

If you or someone you know (of any religion) would contemplate helping an infertile couple by carrying a child for them, please contact the synagogue office for more information. Perhaps you or someone you know has had infertile couples among friends or family, and thought about how you/they could help them.

This couple has been unsuccessful in their efforts to build a family for the past 6 years. Despite a good prognosis from reproductive doctors, the ongoing disappointment of numerous failed treatment cycles and several miscarriages have become a cumulative loss for this couple, as well as a financial burden.

The reproductive doctor has now recommended that they find a kind and special woman who would like to be a GC for them. They are now reaching out via several avenues to find a GC, including our synagogue. They have several frozen embryos "left over" from previous treatment cycles. The doctor's prognosis for them to build a family via gestational surrogacy with frozen embryos is excellent.

Women who have been through the experience remark that it is a truly wonderful thing, and almost every GC finds it to be one of the most rewarding experiences of her life. The infertile couple would be eternally grateful to this person who would bring them the gift of life.

A key qualification is that a GC must have had at least one child of her own. Some other criteria for a woman to be considered medically a good candidate are:

- Having carried her pregnancy to term
- Age in her 20s, 30s or early 40s
- Physically and emotionally in good health
- Has health insurance
- Has support of family and friends.

This special woman would likely be someone who has contemplated the possibility of her being a GC and would like to learn more about it. The couple would answer her questions and get to know each other. If all wished to move forward, the reproductive doctor would start the screening process by reviewing her medical records.

Please note that New Jersey and New York law prohibits the payment of a fee to a GC who delivers in New Jersey or New York; however, while the couple cannot pay a GC who delivers in New Jersey or New York for her services, the couple would reimburse all expenses related to the pregnancy.

If you know any woman who would like to learn more about being a GC, please contact the synagogue office for more information. The couple will provide written information via the synagogue, and you can then contact the couple to get further information and to ask questions.

In 1994, two candidates tied for a seat in the Wyoming House of Representatives with 1,941 votes each. A recount produced the same result. The winner was declared when **A PING-PONG BALL BEARING HIS NAME WAS PULLED FROM THE GOVERNOR'S COWBOY HAT** in a drawing before the State Canvassing Board.


