

Rabbi's Remarks

Muggles everywhere were disappointed to learn that July 7, 2007 (07/07/07) was NOT the release date of the seventh and final Harry Potter book, Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows. It would have been fitting, since July 7 falls on a Saturday, the day on which every other Harry Potter book has been released. Release of the prior books on Shabbat led to complications in observant households. I understand that in religious Jewish neighborhoods, mail carriers were implored to open Amazon and Barnes and Noble packages so that Shomeir Shabbes teens could start reading immediately! For, while reading is permitted on the Sabbath, opening the mail carton would be forbidden.

We know the significance of the number seven in Judaism: seven days in a week, seven branches on the Temple Menorah, Israel has seven species, seven wedding benedictions, etc. And author J.K. Rowling has hinted at the significance of the number seven in the Harry Potter world as well. In Half-Blood Prince, it was revealed that

Voldemort had made seven horcruxes. Quidditch teams have seven players each. Gryffindor Tower's entrance is on the seventh floor at Hogwarts, etc. Even Universal Studios has gotten into the swing of things, announcing that "The Wizarding World of Harry Potter" twenty-acre theme park will be located on the "Seventh Island of Adventure" some time in 2009.

So if seven is lucky, the actual release date for the Harry Potter finale, July 21, 2007, should be three times as good. Educator's Remarks

The retreat center now fading in my rearview mirror I began to drive toward home. I had spent 5 amazing days in prayer, meditation and transformation. And now after contemplation and sacred work I needed to remember how to use the gas pedal. For 5 days in June I had worked harder than I imagined possible to become a stronger person, a better husband and father, and in turn an improved rabbi.

The program was held at an amazing retreat center in Ohio known as Hope Springs. It is 130 acres of sacred land infused with the intention and compassion of hundreds who have crossed her threshold.

During my retreat I engaged with practitioners from Christian, Pagan, Earth-based Religions and Shamanic Traditions. We shared prayer and practices . We established mystical rituals, meditated as a group and even lit Shabbat candles together. I have never felt more connected to my Judaism and my spiritual path. With no cell phones, no TV or computers , no radios or pagers –the days were full of deep living and rich experiences.

So now driving home, I realized I have been changed forever by the experience. And how will that fit into my often hectic and fast paced life in the real world far from the slow pace of Hope



Springs? I realize that it will be often difficult. Author Jack Kornfield writes in his book, <u>After the Ecstasy the Laundry</u>, that this transition is often fraught with challenges. "Most spiritual accounts end with illumination or enlightenment. But what if we ask what happens after that? What happens when the Zen master returns home to spouse and children? What happens when the Christian mystic goes shopping?"

What happens when in the first day upon his return the rabbi's cat throws up in his meditation room? I guess you clean it up, maybe in a more peaceful motion and with a smile. I will learn to exist each day -facing each specific challenge with a lighter heart and greater intention and I look forward to sharing this journey with all of you.

President's Message

Sunday mornings are a busy time at Temple Beth Or. I am sure that those of you who have been around at that time have noticed the hubbub of activity everywhere you turned. With the monthly arrival of new students to our Sunday school, the success of our new high school program, and the continuing Pilates and adult education programming, we are literally outgrowing our classroom and meeting space. With that realization, the Temple Board has been reevaluating our current facility improvement plan. It seems a long time ago, but as you recall it was first introduced to the congregation in 2004 and groundwork at that time was laid for a fund raising effort. Those plans were put on hold when the possibility of moving to the Boonshoft CJCE grounds to form a Jewish campus was investigated. As you heard from Jay Gutmann this past Yom Kippur, however, the Board decided not to pursue those plans for a variety of reasons.

The facilities improvement plan as presented to the congregation did not address the increased need for classroom and meeting space. That need is much more apparent now that it was when the plan was first developed. For that reason, the Board is closely evaluating those needs and the various options for addressing those needs. The facilities improvement plan is being revised to include increased classroom space and, once completed; the feasibility of funding such a plan will be investigated.

This is certainly an exciting time to be at Temple Beth Or. Our need for more room is a good problem to have! In the meantime, I look forward to seeing many of you at our Tu B'Shevat retreat coming up this weekend.

See you at the starting line, but who will be the first to finish???




TBO Calendar Coming Soon!
