RABBI'S MESSAGE

I am reluctant to speak out on what seems to be the "same old issues" for two reasons - one is that matters that bear repetition are often painful issues. The second; if there is a need to repeat, it is evident that not enough is being done about it.

We have been literally pleading through the mail and at almost every Temple gathering to our members and friends to write to our government representatives stating a strong view that no formula for settlement can be imposed on Israel and the Arab nations. The only substantial peace that can be negotiated in the Middle East is through face-to-face negotiations among the parties directly involved. Also, that America must support a military balance of power, particularly in view of the French shipment of vast armaments to Lybia and Iraq. Our letters and your personal boycott of French goods may not be powerful instruments in ameliorating what is tantamount to an emergency situation, but these are the only measures available to us. The total cost is six cents per letter and ten minutes of your time. We plead with you not to fail your people.
