SHABBAT SHIRA

We have usually observed SHABBAT SHIRA (Jewish Music Sabbath) with some outstanding musical program. Just a few weeks ago, this observance reached a new high water mark with the presentation of the Folk-Rock Sabbath Service at the Morristown Presbyterian Church On the Green. Eleven hundred people joined in this exciting worship service.

Our congregation for its size, has performed outstanding and creative musical services which one does not find being presented in Temples with two and three times the number of member families. We are proud of this tradition and intend to continue it and to enhance it.

The Board of Trustees, at its last meeting, enthusiastically and unanimously endorsed the creation of a new Temple Fund, the Shabbat Shira Fund. We ask our members to honor an occasion or memorialize their dear ones by making contributions to this fund as they would to the Library, Flower and Gift or Prayer Book Funds.
