It is suggested that individuals refrain from patronizing the above firms. The major Jewish organizations have terminated their use of Japanese Airlines in their tourist operations.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

Shana Tova! The coming High Holy Days are traditionally a period of self-examination and soul searching. However, your Religious School Staff, observed its season of selfevaluation last Spring. There were meetings, consultation, telephone calls, and trips to Jewish textbook suppliers. We analyzed our successes, tore apart our failures, and asked ourselves questions:

- -- Is our program overly structured and textbook oriented or flexible and experience oriented?
- -- Are we communicating adequately with parents?
- -- Are we providing a relevant climate for the subjects we teach?
- -- Does our Keren Ami program fulfill its objective?
- Is our program well balanced in the important areas of Jewish learning?

And because we believe that parents are "partners" in Jewish religious education, we would like you to ask yourselves some questions, too:

- Do we discuss with the children their religious school activities?
- -- Do we indicate by our attitudes and actions the importance of Judaism in our lives?
- -- Do we help them come to religious school regularly, and appropriately prepared?
- Do we participate when parents are required for special functions?
- Do we alert the teacher to special problems?
