The proposed budget for the fiscal year 1993-94 was presented by the Treasurer. After explanation and discussion, it was passed unanimously. Phil was commended for his efforts in managing this year's budget and for presenting a budget for the coming year that continues to keep us operating in the black.

Stan Gould reported on eight resignations.

The search committee for an educator has selected a candidate from all the applicants and a negotiating committee will meet with her in May to come to agreement on the terms of the contract as set forth in the limits approved by the Board.

## TORAH DIGEST



June 4-5

### BEHAALOTECHA

Numbers 8:1 - 12:16

In this week's Torah portion, the Menorah (candelabra) is made and oil is collected for its use. The Israelites set out on their journeys, guided by God's presence - in the form of a cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night. The people tire of eating manna and want meat. God provides it, yet the people over-eat and become sick. Moses asks for help in leading the people and a council of 70 elders is formed. Moses' siblings, Miriam and Aaron, express jealousy of their brother's preeminence; yet God responds by defending Moses, the most humble and most trusted of all of God's servants.

June 11-12

### SHELACH LECHA

Numbers 13:1 - 15:41

The people need proof that the Promised Land is the place for them, so God instructs Moses to send one leader from each of the twelve tribes to scout out the land. All return with the report that it is a land "flowing with milk and honey," and yet ten of them are afraid to bring the people there for fear of the powerful local inhabitants. Only Joshua and Caleb have the confidence in God and the people that these stumbling blocks could be overcome. For not wanting to go to the land of Israel, that generation was fated to wander in the desert for forty years until a new generation would arise to take the Israelites into the Promised land.

June 18-19

### KORACH

Numbers 16:1 - 18:32

A group of dissidents under a Levite named Korach rise up to challenge the leadership of Moses and Aaron. "Why should you rule over us - are not all Israelites holy?" they say, while in fact, trying to gain power for themselves. Moses asks God to confirm his leadership which God does in dramatic form - the ground opens up and swallows Korach and all his followers.

June 25-26

### CHUKAT

Numbers 19:1 - 22:1

The enigmatic sacrifice of the red heifer which purifies from death. The people thirst for water and instead of speaking to a rock as God had commanded, Moses strikes it. For this lack of faith/understanding/patience, God decrees that Moses cannot enter the promised land. Aaron dies. Serpents attack some of the Israelites and Moses puts a serpent on his staff as a healing agent. This is the origin of the caduceus.

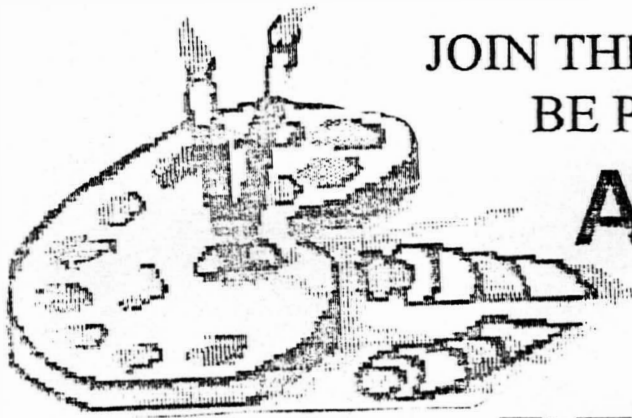

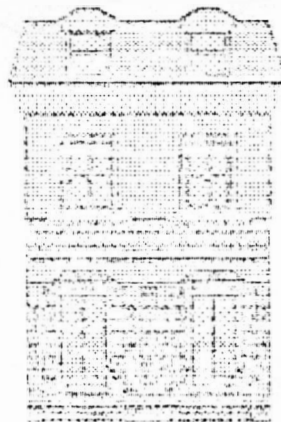

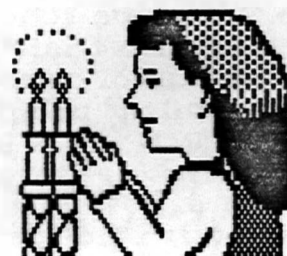


June is also a wonderful time for looking back at our contributions!
