WHAT'S NEW?

As we embark on another year at Temple, there is so much that is new and exciting for members of all ages and interests:

Adult Jewish Education

Cantor Benson, Adult Jewish Education Chair Connie Rubin and I have been putting together a program for Jewish learning and growth which will include: a weeknight Adult Jewish Academy series, a oneday Hebrew Marathon, Adult Hebrew and Bar Mitzvah classes, and a one-day Shabbaton based on the successful Taste of Judaism. Among the ongoing programs which will continue are: the Sunday Night Book Club, Judaism on One Foot with Gary Aidekman, my Thursday morning Sisterhood Torah Seminar and monthly Men's Schmooze Group.

Family Education

In addition to the very successful Family Education programs in each grade which we have developed through the years, Temple member Sheri Gropper, along with a Family Education Committee, will be creating and organizing new events for families. Shari comes to us with extensive experience and training in Family Education. We are so thrilled that she is now part of our "team."

Shabbat Services

No, these are not new, and yet many new things will happen. Our ongoing Shabbat Committee under Stuart and Barbara Rayvid has been studying the ins and outs of worship and has already made important innovations. This year there will be more of our popular teaching services, a naming service for our Russian immigrant families and much more. In order to help you participate most fully, over the High Holy Days we will be distributing a tape and booklet with the music we sing on Shabbat as well as a practice reading of the Kaddish.

Shaarim/Gateways: Four doors to Jewish life at Temple B'nai Or

This four-part interactive program focuses on Reform Judaism as practiced here at Temple, a look at the prayers we pray and the music we sing, the meaning of being a Jewish community, how the Temple works and how to get involved. *Shaarim* is designed for new members, recent members and members of long standing.

Singles Outreach

We are working on creating a Single's Chavurah as well as facilitating Shabbat dinners for singles.

Ne Social Action opportunities

Continuing our involvement in housing the homeless, the soup kitchen, and the Chanukah Giving Night, we will be increasing our involvement in the community with the Community Pot Luck Dinner (October 27), Operation Love and a Mitzvah Day in the Spring which calls on every member of the Temple to come out and participate.

Nursery School Parenting Workshops

Midweek seminars for the parents of our nursery schoolers.

Of course, all of this is in addition to the fine ongoing programming of Sisterhood, Men's Club, Renaissance, Interfaith Outreach, Chavurot, Senior Youth Group and Junior Youth Group. Should you wish to be involved in any of the above or have an idea about how the Temple can better serve your needs, please give us a call. As always, the door is always open!

This year looks to be another year of excitement and growth. Be a part, not apart. Come home to Temple!

President's Message



L'Shana Tovah! It is hard to believe that summer is already over, and the High Holy Days are upon us again. While many of you were away enjoying summer vacations, we were very busy at Temple working to make sure that we continue to offer the best we can to our members. Our membership is hovering at the 600 family level which has enabled us to elevate Cantor Benson to full-time status. As such, he is available for all life cycle needs of our members which, in turn, will make it easier on Rabbi Rossoff. A congregation our size truly needs two full-time clergymen.

Over the last year, the Board, through a special committee, has been studying the acoustic problems in the Sanctuary and Social Hall which were made very evident during last year's Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services. After considering many proposals to upgrade and/or replace the current system, the Board, on the recommendation of the Committee, accepted a proposal to totally replace the current system including the speakers. This was not done lightly. After considerable discussion and further research, it was agreed this new system would resolve our problems as well as offer us tremendous opportunity to be extremely flexible. The new system is almost entirely wireless which will eliminate the wires and receivers which are only partly hidden on the bimah. It will automatically adjust to the voices of our children as well as the chanting of the Cantor. Since it is a capital improvement, it will be paid for from the building fund as well as donations from our members to the Francis Horowitz Memorial Fund. There is no special fund raising effort to cover the cost of this system. However, when making a donation to Temple for any purpose such as an anniversary, special birthday, a birth, engagement or the like, please consider this fund. In this manner, we will take less from the building fund, keeping it well funded for other projects.

In summary, the Temple did not close for the summer, but merely slowed down a bit. This next year will be one to look forward to including a Goods and Services Auction being planned for May. Check your calendars and save the date. It is a great opportunity to buy merchandise or a service, like a weekend in a vacation spot or a round of golf, at a bargain price while helping your Temple at the same time. Please help the Committee to the best of your ability when the solicitation for goods and services goes out in the Fall.

May 5757 be a good year for Temple B'nai Or and all its members.

If you are going out of town for Rosh Hashanah and/or Yom Kippur, please remember that as a member in good standing at a UAHC affiliated congregation, you may get a **letter of reciprocity** which will entitle you to attend services at another UAHC congregation. Letters of reciprocity are also issued to our Temple's young people, under 22. Please call the office if you need a letter.

If you have not yet requested a **Privilege Card** for an unaffiliated person between the ages of 22–30, please do so as soon as possible.

There are many events that have been planned for the coming year that involve planning and participation. Keep informed! Read your bulletins and your mailings. CHECK BOTH SIDES OF THE FLYERS FOR POSSIBLE ANNOUNCEMENTS. We try to use both sides to conserve space and save money.



Following past procedures, you will receive a grocery bag after Rosh Hashanah services. We ask that you return it filled with non-perishable food and paper goods prior to Monday AM Yom Kippur services.

NURSERY SCHOOL


Meet Your Neighbor Under a Sukkah

PRESIDENT: Jack Piermont welcomed the new members of the Board.

ADMINISTRATION: Carole Goldberg reported High Holy Day material is being prepared and will be mailed in July. The Scholar–In–Residence program is scheduled for November 15/17 with Daniel Matt as the Scholar–In–Residence.

HOUSE AND GROUNDS: A motion was adopted to install a new sound system which should be in place for the High Holy Days.

NURSERY SCHOOL: Jack Piermont reported the school is full for next year and is doing well. Nursery School has 66 students in three classes plus toddlers. Summer camp enrolled 38 students.




