

### FROM RABBI PRIESAND

For weeks now, many of us, myself included, have been talking about how early the Holydays are this year. In reality, according to the Hebrew calendar, they're right on time. Rosh Hashanah falls on the first of Tishri as it does every year and Yom Kippur is ten days later. Nonetheless, it is somewhat difficult to begin the process of taking stock of our lives when the activities of summer are still so much with us.


Our tradition teaches that this season of the year, our most sacred, provides an opportunity for teshuvah, tefillah and tzdakah. For our Holyday experience to be complete, we must incorporate all three concepts into our observance. Through teshuvah (repentance), we look inward to those values and goals which shape our lives. Who are we? Where have we been, and where are we going? How much have we grown during the past year? What is there about ourselves that we would like to improve? Teshuvah challenges us to face life without the masks we so often wear, to be honest with ourselves and each other, to make amends for those moments when we fell short of our highest selves, and to recognize that change is always possible.

Through tefillah (prayer), we look upward and reunite ourselves with God, the Source of life, whose spirit guides the universe. How often during the year we fail to welcome God's presence into our lives! And yet on the Holydays we yearn for that inspiration which has enriched our people in every generation. We want to know that God is with us, replenishing our spirits, renewing our strength in those moments when strength seems so elusive. These Days of Awe give us the opportunity to rediscover and experience the reality of God, to know and understand that God continues to work miracles in our time, not like the miracles of the Bible, but by enabling ordinary people to do extraordinary things.

Through tzdakah (charity), we look outward to the world around us. God has called us to be partners in the work of creation. So much remains to be done: feeding the hungry, housing the homeless, protecting the environment, making our planet a place that is safe for every form of life, ensuring a future for

our children and our children's children. Literally, <u>tzdakah</u> means righteousness or justice. We make it part of our lives because it's the right thing to do.


The High Holy Days are a time to reflect on the past and to look forward to the future. I hope that in the coming year we will grow together as a community and do our part to repair the world.

### **OUTREACH NEWS**

Everything in Outreach is news to me. For six years I was, rightfully, not promoted in Hebrew school. I worked hard to learn my simplified English Bar Mitzvah part. How much my life and striving was reaction to the fact of my being a Jew, all said, a mediocre career as a Jew, and then to be asked to chair the Outreach Committee!

Outreach is an official part of our congregation because our membership is made up of people who are married to Jews (all of us?), who are Jews by Choice (all of us?), and who harbor feelings and ideas which preclude full participation in our congregation. The purpose of Outreach is to comfortably welcome open participation of all members in Temple affairs. Personally, the idea of reaching in to understand oneself is the most important part of being open to and reaching out to others.

The Outreach Committee includes any interested members and will plan and perform according to the needs of our congregants. I personally welcome any input at meetings, 8 PM on the second Wednesday of each month. We started the year off with a congregational picnic and everyone attending had a wonderful time. On October 20, Sunday evening we will have a "hands-on" course in Jewish cooking. We help sponsor the interfaith service on November 27, Erev Thanksgiving at the Temple with the Presbyterian Church. January 20, Sunday evening, 6 PM-8 PM, we have a Holiday Learning Course with Rabbi Priesand. May 31, Sunday, we would like to sponsor a Road Rally.

In the future, I would like to include three parts in this column. First—ideas in Outreach, second—meet our members, and third—news and plans. Outreach information, pertinent meetings and reading lists are yours for the asking.

At Sean Ross's recent Bar Mitzvah he eloquently told of his experience growing up in our Temple and his experience was replayed in its entirety in Rabbi Priesand's annual report. The Rabbi wrote: "Sean's speech reminds us of our goals, educating our children and encouraging them to work toward Confirmation, strengthening their Jewish identity by including in our lives the values and rituals of our people, instilling in them a feeling of pride, creating Jewish memories, providing opportunities for family involvement, serving the community, understanding that study is a life long process, remembering we are part of a people and striving always to set an example for our children by accepting responsibility for our own lewishness and continue to grow and learn and contribute to the well being of our Temple family." Outreach attempts to accomplish this goal.



### ASSOCIATION OF REFORM ZIONIST OF AMERICA

ARZA needs your vote for delegates to the World Zionist Congress, scheduled for June 1992. The Congress, which will be held in Jerusalem, is referred to as "The Parliament of the Jewish People." It provides the only Jewish democratically elected forum in which Israeli and Diaspora Jews face each other on an equal footing, exchanging views in an open, honest way.

For Reform Jews, the Congress is an especially important vehicle to send the Israeli government a message on the importance of religious pluralism and political moderation. Congress elections also will determine if the Reform Movement can continue to control the World Zionist Organization Department of Jewish Education and Culture which supports educational programs in Israel and around the world. The Congress also determines Reform Movement representation in the Jewish Agency for Israel, which allocates UJA funds to institutions in Israel, including Reform programs.

ARZA membership makes you eligible to vote for delegates to the World Zionist Congress, where a large and visible Reform delegation will help safeguard the future of Reform Judaism in Israel. We urge you to join or renew your ARZA membership, remitting \$20 (for a couple or individual) with your first temple dues installment. You must be a paid-up ARZA member to be eligible to vote and we must turn your name in to ARZA by the end of this September. If you have not yet responded positively to the ARZA line on your dues bill, please contact the temple office to make arrangements to be a paid-up ARZA member.
