FROM RABBI PRIESAND

As I write these words, I am returning from San Antonio where I attended the annual convention of the Central Conference of American Rabbis. (CCAR) Participating in this event gives me an opportunity for renewal of spirit, a chance to spend time with cherished friends, to study Torah with teachers and scholars and to discuss with my colleagues issues of importance facing the Jewish community, our country and the world.

This year's convention was especially meaningful for me because it included an opportunity to celebrate the twentieth anniversary of my ordination, a significant moment not only in my life but also in the history of our Movement, first among the branches of Judaism to encourage full participation on the part of women in every aspect of Jewish life. I was fortunate to be this year's guest of honor at the Alumni Luncheon cosponsored by the CCAR and the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion. Words cannot really describe the excitement and pride that I felt, the sense of satisfaction and fulfillment that enveloped me, as my female colleagues rose to pay tribute. I remembered my first CCAR convention nearly twenty years ago. Then I stood alone. Now I was surrounded by dozens of female rabbis, our hearts united, our voices strong, as we offered thanks to God for the privilege of serving the Jewish people. It was a moment I shall never forget; indeed, a week that left its imprint on my soul.

Because you, the members of my Temple family, have made it so easy for me to enjoy being a rabbi, I often forget the pioneering role that I play in Jewish life. In recent weeks, I have been reminded of it, and I am well aware that in the months ahead there are commemorations yet to come. I know you will rejoice with me, but I hope that you will also take pride in recognizing that it is <u>our</u> creative partnership which enables me to love the rabbinate as much as I do. Thank you for enriching my life. When Cantor Sussman tendered her resignation, the Ritual Committee formed a Cantorial Search Committee. It was composed of sixteen congregants, representing a cross-section of the membership. The committee began by looking for an invested cantor (one who has completed graduate studies at an accredited school) on a part-time basis, but was not successful in hiring someone.

As the next step, MRT signed up with the Hebrew, Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion's School of Sacred Music to attend auditions and to interview students looking for positions as student cantors. The committee spent a Sunday (from 3 to 9:30 PM) at the School. After hearing all the candidates perform, we interviewed sixteen students. The interviews are very short and there is no possibility to have students visit before a "match" is made. Needless to say, it was necessary to explain over and over where Monmouth County and Tinton Falls are!

The end result of the search is that a 1-year contract has been signed with Claire Metzger, who will be a third-year student next year. She will begin here in August. Claire, her husband and their two children live in Springfield. I know you will help them feel at home at MRT.

If your bulletin arrives on time, it will be before the annual meeting. I urge you to attend on May 3. If you cannot, please ask for an annual report in the office. It will give you a good idea of the many activities and programs which have taken place in Temple this year.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL NOTES

After experiencing an unusually large first time registration for Religious school in September, the School Committee has requested that I send out registration material to Temple members in May, 1992. The new system will have the following benefits:

1. should additional classes have to be formed, I would be in a better position now to hire new teachers than in the fall,

2. supplies would be ordered now to accommodate the new students,

3. if necessary, classrooms would be reassigned depending on class size,

4. billing for Religious School would accurately reflect the registration form, and,

5. for the first time, I would have an emergency home contact number for each student.

My target date for the completion of registration is May 20th, please help me by mailing your form to the Temple's office regardless of your child's(ren's) grade.

For many years I have announced that the goals of our Religious School include a solid Jewish education and wonderful Jewish memories. I am extremely grateful to our dedicated teachers for providing our students with their Jewish instruction and I am equally thankful for the many parental volunteers who gave freely of their Sundays (in most instances) to see to it that your children are blessed with the warm, Temple experiences that will last a lifetime.

Recently, we held a model Passover Seder for our 150 students. Many students brought friends to this ceremony so that the actual number present totaled more than 165. Under the direction of Betty Welt, class parents set the tables, cut up the gefilte fish, poured gallons of grape juice, made up trays of Passover treats, and most importantly, remained to clean up.

The Purim Carnival is an excellent example of Temple members coming out to help your children. Under the direction of Gerald Reisner, Rachel Mendelson and Alan Corbett, the food, games and prizes were coordinated to create a festive holiday memory for everyone. I must point out that several volunteers no longer have children in our school, yet, they feel an obligation to give time to the Temple family.

Our visits to the nursing homes as part of our Chunukah celebration were also the result of many people coming out to help us with transportation and supervision. As in many years past, I thank Al Paley for providing the holiday latkes.

The Ellis Island trip held in November couldn't have succeeded without the involvement of school parents.

I would like to add a special thank you to Brian McMullen. Except for a (very) few Sundays, Brian has remained in the school building on Sunday mornings after dropping off his two sons at their classes to help me with the amazing amount of paper work a school of our size generates. He also coordinates our school's tzdakah collection, gives out supplies, works the copier, and any other job that needs top be done.

The list of Religious School activities is not complete, nor is the list of Temple volunteers to be thanked. Our class parents comprise a list unto themselves; a group of volunteers who are always ready to make the necessary telephones call that ultimately benefit your child(ren) and the Religious School family.

The Religious School Committee meets on the first Tuesday of each month to actively oversee School policies and procedures. Under Temple rules, Laurie Lowenstein cannot again stand for election to the Board of Trustees, and therefore, cannot serve as chairperson of the School Committee (although she will remain on the committee.) A simple thank you does not do justice to the effort, care and love, Laurie has put into this voluntary position. A tremendous asset to the Religious School, Laurie is leaving as chairperson after having helped develop a very effective committee.
