



Among the items in that letter, please note that all members and non-members will be asked by the ushers to show their tickets and that parking regulations have changed.

The High Holy Days begin with S'lichot on September 11. This service, which begins around 11:30 PM is preceded at 9 PM by Havdalah, refreshments, a musical presentation, and a thought-provoking program. S'lichot helps us enter into the spirit of celebration and repentance, and, once again, we hear the melodies which symbolize this season. This evening is also an opportunity to get to know fellow Temple members.

FROM RABBI PRIESAND

Recently I read the story of a Dutch Jew who survived the Holocaust by hiding in attics and cellars. After the war, he came to America and completed his education. He was appointed head of the Philosophy Department at his university. For the most part, he was completely assimilated, having little or no interest in the

affairs of the Jewish community.


One day, the university President asked him to greet Abraham Joshua Heschel who was coming to the college as a guest lecturer. The professor inquired: "Who is he?" The President "He is a Jewish theologian and philosopher." Somewhat annoyed, the professor continued: "Why are you sending me?" "Two reasons," replied the President. "First, you are Jewish, and second, you chair our Department of Philosophy."

Reluctantly, the man went to meet Rabbi While riding in the car, they began to Heschel. discuss philosophy. The professor was amazed by the rabbi's erudition and his brilliant mind. Their conversation continued, and finally, Heschel asked the professor: "Are you Jewish?" reply, "Yes," was curtly given. Then Heschel asked: "What are you doing about it?" professor replied: "I never thought about it." Softly, Heschel said: "May I suggest that you do."

That is the challenge of this season of the year; the Holydays provide an opportunity for each of us to reflect on the Jewishness of our lives. Are we Jewish by choice, or only by birth? Do we participate actively in the life of the Jewish community, both the synagogue and beyond? Have we learned to recognize the Jewish component that is part of everything we do? Have we made room in our lives for talmud Torah (study) and mitzvah (the Jewish sense of obligation)? Do we take seriously the task of tikkun olam (making the world a better place in which to live)? Have we opened our hearts to God's voice, allowing God to be a force in our lives, a source of strength and direction? Are we growing Jewishly, increasing our sense of commitment, learning to live by the rhythm of the Jewish calendar, observing Shabbat? Are we striving to bring holiness into our lives and the lives of those we love?

These are the questions that confront us as we begin the process of cheshbon ha-nefesh (a reckoning of the soul). The answers we give will determine whether the year 5754 will be for us a new year, or just another year. May you and all those who are dear to you be blessed with an abundance of health and joy, love and peace.



Participation in song sessions, creative services, and making new friends are all part of the Jewish Federation of Temple Youth New Member Conclaves. Any 9th - 12th grader who has attended two or fewer JFTY regional events is eligible to participate in this special weekend event which is centered around a theme. Some examples of New Member themes—which are developed in thematic workshops throughout the weekend—have been "Growing up in the Nineties," and "Stereotypes." The workshops and song sessions are geared toward people who have never before experienced JFTY, and who may be altogether new to youth grouping.

CHOOSING TO CHANGE

The period of time between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur is called the "Ten Days of Repentance," when we are instructed to carefully examine the way we live. A primary theme of the High Holy Days is the choice we have between good and evil and the opportunity we have to repent for our wrongdoing through self-examination, reflection and reconciliation.

The Hebrew word for repentance, teshuvah, means "to turn" or "return." During these ten days, we enter a process that begins with self awareness and ends with self renewal. We first acknowledge past errors of thought, speech and action, and then resolve to change our "direction"

so those errors are not repeated.

In Judaism, repentance is more than pious words or empty sentiment. It involves an active decision to change the direction of our lives so that we can "return" to a just and decent way of life. Sins we commit against God can be forgiven by God, but sins against our fellow human beings cannot be forgiven by God unless we first obtain our neighbor's pardon. We are bidden to seek them out and make every effort at personal reconciliation for the hurt and pain we have caused—whether intentionally or unintentionally.

It is through teshuvah that we return to God and discover God returning to us. We focus on our behavior during the past year, so that the future may be better for us as individuals and as a

community.



RELIGIOUS SCHOOL NOTES

To me, the High Holidays are an exciting time. I have wonderful memories from my childhood of passing the days with family and friends. As an adult, the Days of Awe offer the opportunity for me to renew my personal spirituality. As an educator, September means renewed dedication to the children of Monmouth Reform Temple.

Every Jewish holiday is associated with its own special traditions. In our Religious School, the younger grades begin their study of Rosh Hashanah with the taste of apples and honey. Just as this treat brings a sweet taste to their lips, our students should have a sweet year marked with good health and success in all endeavors.

Whether, our students are singing in the Succah, reliving the Chanukah story, baking hamantashen in the Temple's kitchen and booing the nasty Haman, reciting the four questions, enjoying some of the festivities around minor holidays, or eating a Shabbat meal in their classrooms, our Religious School enjoys its role of creating holiday celebrations and their traditions.

I would like to suggest that if you are looking for a way to begin holiday traditions in your home, especially with older children, become involved with our Religious School. Volunteer to help at our holiday celebrations or offer to plan a special holiday party in your child's classroom. Classroom festivities are not limited to holidays; our curriculum can be tapped for many fun ideas. Please contact me if you wish more information: adult volunteers are welcome with or without children enrolled in our school.

The Jewish New Year is a fine time for goal setting. I would like to assist adults desiring to learn Hebrew for the first time or relearning their forgotten reading skills. Packets are already prepared with the Hebrew letters, vowels, practice material and instructions. Depending on your children's ages, learn with them or let them teach you. Learning Hebrew does require commitment through practice. I will be delighted to offer assistance to any interested Temple member.

Social action is as much a part of our school's curriculum as the study of holidays, Torah and Hebrew. In past years, our students made annual visits to various nursing homes during Chanukah or Purim time. Based on an idea first suggested by our students and teachers, this year our school will initiate an "adopt a nursing home project," with the Shrewsbury Manor Nursing Home as the first recipient of our efforts. Each class will visit, on a rotating schedule, once or twice a year, depending on the grade and car pool availability. This mitzvah project presents many

learning possibilities for both the residents and our students.

By now, the 1993-94 Religious School Booklet should have been received by all Temple families. The Booklet will bring you up to date on the curriculum and policies guiding your children's religious education. Families without children enrolled in our school were sent Booklets to keep them informed. I would appreciate any input members wish to make regarding any facet of this publication.
