FROM RABBI PRIESAND

Ever since the State of Israel was founded in 1948, non-Orthodox Jews have known discrimination. What is taken for granted by Christians and Moslems - the right to worship freely and have one's religious leaders officiate at life-cycle events - has been denied Reform, Conservative, and Reconstructionist Jews. ARZA (the Association of Reform Zionists of America) is fighting to change this situation.

Founded in 1977, ARZA has been the strongest voice for religious pluralism and social justice in Israel. Many of its efforts have been successful: Jews-by-choice, converted by Reform rabbis in America, are recognized as Jews in Israel; non-Orthodox burial is now permitted in the homeland of our people; and non-Orthodox institutions, like the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, are finally receiving government funding.

Recently, ARZA has undertaken a two-year campaign called Operation Equality, aimed at obtaining legitimacy for Reform Judaism and its rabbis in the State of Israel. Working through the ARZA-sponsored Israel Religious Action Center, a bill will soon be introduced in the Knesset giving Reform rabbis the right to officiate at marriages. Passing the legislation will be exceedingly difficult, but if we can suceed in this legislative effort, other discriminatory legislation will soon begin to collapse.

In order to generate public support for this legislation, ARZA needs our help now. I hope that every member of our Temple family will join ARZA and therby express in a meaningful way our love for the State of Israel and our concern for the future of religious pluralism. Thanks in advance for your cooperation. This is a real opportunity to make a difference.
