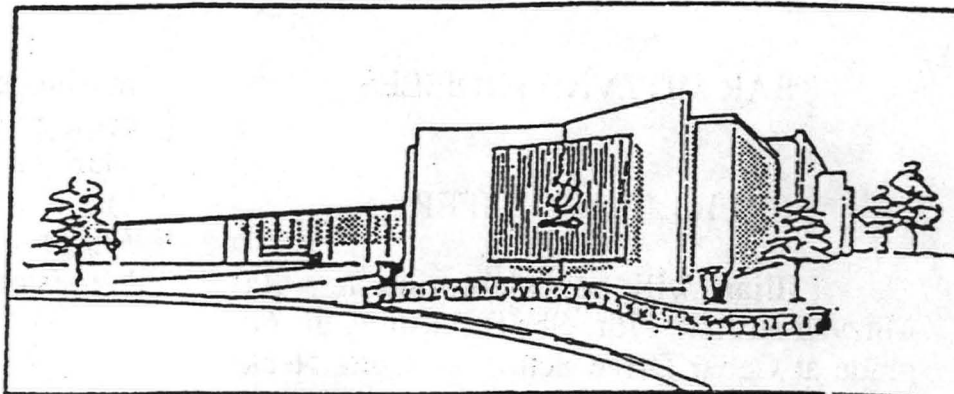

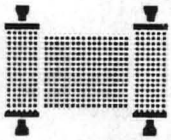

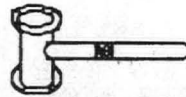


FROM RABBI PRIESAND

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS - MAY MEETING

Temple Administrator Hired

As MRT has grown, the need for a professional temple administrator has become a high priority. For a temple of its size, MRT provides a large number of programs for the congregation. Managing these programs, running the temple office and staff efficiently, and supporting the Rabbi and the board in organizing the affairs of the temple call for the services of a professional administrator. Early this spring the board formed an ad hoc search committee and interviewed four candidates for the position. The board is pleased to announce that Roberta Brown has been hired as MRT's first temple administrator, and will begin work in June. Please join the board in welcoming Roberta to our temple family.

High Holy Days

With the temple experimenting with dual, sequential services this coming September, there are many activities to coordinate. To support the temple in preparing for the High Holy Days, Baldwin Davidson has volunteered to be High Holy Day Coordinator. Baldwin will coordinate the activities of approximately a half dozen temple committees/auxiliaries which are involved in supporting the Ritual Committee for High Holy Days preparation. A major concern raised at the Congregational meeting is the flow and control of traffic to the temple between services. The board has asked the House Committee, chaired by Dean Ross, to consider alternatives for handling the flow of traffic.

Safety Concerns

As a result of a recent architectural study of various expansion alternatives for the MRT building, the congregation was made aware (at the congregational meeting) of safety concerns in our basement classrooms, regarding safe means of egress in case of emergency. The board discussed these safety issues in May and passed a resolution to immediately ban the use of the basement space for classes or meeting. The board will pursue making changes to the basement which will allow the congregation to use this space for classes and meetings. A likely outcome is the installation of a sprinkler system. We'll keep the congregation informed of progress.

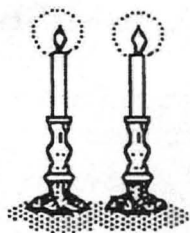

ARCHITECTURE/BUILDING UPDATE

At the May annual meeting I briefly reviewed how we selected an architect and what had been done to date. I introduced Mr. Gary Kaplan of Kaplan, Gaunt & DiSantos, who provided an overview of physical plant changes and expansion that needed to be done to meet the recommendations of the long range planning committee. Mr. Kaplan discussed problem areas caused by the aging plant as well as new safety codes. He reviewed what could be done to correct any current problems and then laid out a plan for the future.

Briefly, Mr. Kaplan discussed expanding the front of the temple to create space for the Rabbi's office, Cantor's office, larger lobby and business office. He then covered how the classrooms could be increased via a second floor along with additional bathrooms. He talked about making the basement primarily storage and ended with some ideas on how to expand the social hall. A great many comments and ideas from the floor were entertained. Everyone felt it was an excellent presentation.

At the request of the Board, copies of the program analysis plans are available in the office for review. Please send me any comments you may have. The Board will be reviewing all comments and deciding how to go forward.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL NOTES
