Dear Sir,

Although an entire stranger and greatly doubting the propriety of asking any of your time, every minute of which must be important to your command. Yet as there are exceptions to all general rules and hoping the request I have to make may be looked upon you as such. **ERICAN JEWISH**

I have to prefer the request on behalf of the wife of Col M. M. Spiegle late in command of the 120th O.V.I. which May 4 met with disaster on the City Belle on Red River from where no certain information as to his fate has been had. At one time reported killed again mortally wounded and again wounded & prisoner.

Col. S. was a gallant officer who fought through all the battles immediately preceding the capture of Vicksburg receiving a very severe wound by the fragment of a bursting shell. He returned to his Regt before the wound was perfectly healed.

If anything is known at your department headquarter, your reply communicating the information would be greatly remembered

by the Col' deeply distressed wife as to the uncertain fate of a husband.
