Dear Madam

My object in writing you this evening is to enquire whether you have heard from your brother Joseph or Mr Sinsheimer. I supposed that after the surrender of Kirby Smith the Texas prisoners would be released. I have not yet heard of it having been done but I thought that perhaps you might have heard from them. Many times have I thought of them since their great disappointment at the mouth of Red River. It seemed very hard that they should have been taken back after getting

dure the hardships of a rebel
prison for so long a time.
