

## POSTMASTER GENERAL OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

TO ALL WHO SHALL SEE THESE PRESENTS, GREETING:

Thereas, On the 10th day of October 1855, Marcus M. Friegle was appointed Postmaster at Summit in the Country of Summit , State of Chio ; and whereas he did, on the 10th day of November, 1855, execute a Bond, and has taken the oath of office, as required by law.

Thom brown 23, That, confiding in the integrity, ability, and punctuality of the said Marcus M. Springle

I do commission him a Postmaster, authorized to execute the duties of that office at Summit aforesaid, according to the Laws of the United States, and the Regulations of the post office department: To hold the said Office of Postmaster with all the

powers, privileges, and emoluments to the same belonging, during the pleasure of the Postmaster General of the United States.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the seal of the Bost Office Department to be affixed, at Washington City, the twenty eighth day of Nevember in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, and of the Independence of the United States the eightieth.
