**Episcopal-Jewish Colloquium To Be Held; Public Invited**

An Episcopal-Jewish colloquium, described as "the first formal meeting of Episcopalian and Jew as colleagues in a common function and goal," will take place March 16 and 17 under auspices of the American Jewish Committee, HUC-JIR, Episcopal Diocese of Southern Ohio; and Episcopal Council of Greater Cincinnati.

The theme will be "The Year for Opening Communications." 1975 marks two 100th anniversaries: the centennial celebration of the Episcopal Diocese of Southern Ohio and that of Hebrew Union College, originated in Cincinnati by Rabbi Isaac Mayer Wise, founder of Reform Judaism in the U.S.

Mr. and Mrs. David Lazarus are co-chairmen.

The conclave will be held Sunday, March 16, from 1:30 to 10 p.m., at Christ Church, and Monday, March 17, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Rockdale Temple, 8501 Ridge Road.

The Rev. D. Peter Burrows is conference chairman. An ordained Episcopal minister, he received his Ph.D. at HUC-JIR.

He is Interreligious Consultant to AJC and assistant to the director of Graduate Studies at HUC-JIR.

Participants will be welcomed by the Rev. John McGill Krumm, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Southern Ohio; Dr. Alfred Gottschalk, HUC-JIR president; and Philip M. Meyers Jr., chairman, AJC, Cincinnati chapter, with prayers by Rev. Edward R. Sims, rector of Christ Church, and Rabbi Harold D. Bahn of Rockdale.

The opening session will be on "Episcopalians and Jews in Na-

logue." Rabbi Marc H. Tanenbaum, New York City, director of AJC Interreligious Affairs, and the Rev. Donald L. Rogan, Gambier, Ohio, chairman of the department of religion at Kenyon College, will speak.

Following a social hour and dinner at Christ Church, the topic will be "Episcopalians and Jews in Retrospect."

Speakers will be the Rev. Dr. Richard A. Henshaw, professor of Old Testament at Colgate-Rochester-Bexley Hall-Crozier Divinity School, Rochester, N.Y., and Rabbi Samuel Sandmel, distinguished service professor of Bible and Hellenistic Literature at HUC-JIR.

Monday morning's session at Rockdale will be on "Episcopalians and Jews—Directions for the Future," conducted by the Rev. Harvey H. Guthrie, dean, Episcopal Divinity School, Cambridge, Mass., and Rabbi Jakob J. Petuchowski, research professor of Jewish theology and liturgy, HUC-JIR.

After luncheon, at the Temple, there will be workshops, followed by reports by Justin Friedman and Robert Norrhish.

A summary will be given by Rabbi A. James Rudin, New York, AJC assistant director, interreligious affairs.

The colloquium is public.

the preface of the 1974 edition. Judgment and selection of nominees are based on their "service to others, professional recognition and community activities." Men between 21 and 35 are eligible.

From 1969 to 1971 Mr. Steiner was president of the Limited Board of Losantiville Country Club of Cincinnati, and has served continuously as president of Camp Livingston, a tri-state area community youth camp.

He also serves on the board of the Cincinnati Area Leadership Council: Jewish Federation, and Jewish Vocational Service.

Mr. Steiner is a graduate of Tulane, where he was president of several campus organizations and was named to the school's Hall of Fame. He was listed in the 1964 edition of "Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities."

Following graduation, he attended the University of Chicago where he received his MBA degree in 1967.

He is the son of Philip G. Steiner, and of the late Desiree Harris Steiner. His brother, Rick, also resides in Cincinnati.
