Dear Friend:

I want to bring you up to date on the status of S. 2031, the bill I have introduced to require that the United States embassy in Israel be located in the capital city of Jerusalem.

On February 23, the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations conducted a public hearing on my proposal. Interestingly, this was the <u>first</u> Senate hearing <u>ever</u> to be held on the important question of whether the U.S. should recognize Jerusalem as Israel's capital. Following my own testimony in support of S. 2031, Under Secretary of State Lawrence S. Eagleburger presented the Reagan Administration's position opposing the relocation of our embassy to Jerusalem. More recently, on March 14, President Reagan reiterated his opposition to my proposal during a speech in Washington, when he stated that the status of Jerusalem would be determined through "negotiations."

My own view is that Jerusalem is, and shall remain, the capital of Israel. I believe we should base our Mideast policies in reality. As of this writing, my proposal has 37 cosponsors in the Senate and close to 200 in the House of Representatives. The support continues to grow. While the Reagan Administration continues to oppose our efforts, I remain optimistic that the bill will be passed by Congress this year.

I enclose a copy of S. 2031, and a page from the State Department's 1984 Telephone Directory that illustrates how this administration treats Jerusalem as a separate entity from the State of Israel.
