AGREEMENT BETWEEN CHAUTAUQUA INSTITUTION AND

The party of the second part, who agrees to render the following service(s) during the 1976 season.

Religion Lecturer, July 7 and July 8

The party of the second part agrees not to perform the same services, as above set forth, as an employee of another or as an independent contractor in Chautauqua County, New York, during July or August of the year for which this agreement pertains, except as allowed by written permission of Chautauqua Institution.

In consideration for the services performed by the party of the second part, Chautauqua Institution agrees to pay the party of the second part the sum of (\$ 300.00), Three hundred dollars

Payable as follows: upon completion of services

Plus: Travel allowance of 12¢ per mile round trip from place of residence to Chautauqua

Accommodations for self and wife Gate passes for self and wife Tickets to special events for self and wife

In case of a local epidemic or disaster, a national emergency, or any order of the Government or other competent authority, which in the opinion of the first party would necessitate cancellation of any part of the program, the party of the first part reserves the right to nullify this agreement upon one week's notice.
