We have met on numerous occasions dealing with UAHC activities as well as through personal friends. But, today, I reintroduce myself to you as co-chair of the UAHC's new Task Force on the Prevention of Youth Suicide/Alcoholism and Substance Abuse.

There is a multiplicity in my writing to you today. I am responding to a need for these and other Yad Tikvah committees to be an important component of the UAHC's venue both on programming inclusion and budgetary consideration. Knowing budgetary constraints of the Union and how difficult it is to weigh priorities, I hope these committees will receive the attention they so direly need. We do need your support.

I am also responding to your fervent proclamation and need for Reform Judaism Outreach. Although we are separated by distance in miles we are very connected in our passion for a Jewish tomorrow. I believe in Outreach and all it endeavors to do. But, I also believe in Inreach, a term I have started to use in my work with these task forces and other synagogues and regional programming in which I am involved.

Inreach is a very important and needed component we sometimes put on the back burner. There is a fundamental need to connect to our people's souls. It is that time of year when I write to ask for renewal of last year's generous foundation grant to the UAHC, but this year for a very specific purpose.

On Sunday, June 16th, Jeff Smulyan is hosting a lunch and Mariners game in the Owner's Box at the Stadium. This will be a major fund raising opportunity for our UAHC Hand of Hope Program, which is devoted to combatting the growing national epidemic of youth suicide.

Let me just share a little information:

- 1. Suicide today is the second leading cause of death among those 15-24 years of age, and one of the ten leading causes of death among those aged 5-14. A recent Gallup Poll revealed that 6% of American youth ages 13-19 have attempted suicide.
- 2. Some 90% of all suicides take place between 3:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. in the home precisely at those times when people are most likely to be present to save them. In other words, they don't want to die. They just want help.
- 3. Girls attempt suicide 3-5 times more often than boys. Boys, however complete the act 3-5 times as often as girls because they use more lethal means; self inflicted gunshot wounds and hanging.

Mr. Samuel Stroum -2- April 1, 1991 An overwhelming percentage of those contemplating suicide tell someone, usually a teenage friend, but make them promise not to tell. This has become known as "the wall of silence." 5. Most youth suicides can be prevented by: Teaching teens - and adults - the warning signs of potential suicide Giving teens permission "to tell" and seek help if a friend mentions suicide. The UAHC has the only national Youth Suicide Prevention Program of any religious group in North America. We seek, however, to serve those of all faiths. Saving lives is our goal. 7. Our book When Living Hurts by Dr. Sol Gordon has reached over 100,000 families over the last 4 years, saving many lives in the process. As you will see, it is written for teens, our life saving instruments. Some 500,000 young people attempt suicide every year. The many lives we have saved, therefore, pales in comparison to what we could do with more substantial funding. Peter Yarrow of Peter, Paul and Mary, and Billy Joel are among those in the entertainment industry who have already become involved in our work. THE HAND OF HOPE PROFESSIONAL SPORTS PROGRAM In recent months, Professional sports teams have volunteered to assist us in expanding our program. of today, the teams committed to involvement are: The New York Yankees 2. The New York Mets 3. The Seattle Mariners 4. The New York Jets 5. The St. Louis Cardinals 6. The St. Louis Blues 7. The St. Louis Storm

Mr. Samuel Stroum -3-April 1, 1991 All those approached thusfar have agreed to participate. We anticipate contacting teams in every major sport - Football, Baseball, Basketball, Hockey and Soccer over the next several months. The Mets, Mariners and Yankees have chosen to host a dinner and game in the Owner's Box in Spring of 1991. The Jets will host a July/August day at their training camp, with a tour, screening of films, observation of practice, and lunch with the players. In addition, Whitey Ford has agreed to be part of a major dinner event in New York. I would be deeply grateful - and young people's lives would be saved, if the Foundation Grant for this year could be designated for the June 16th event. 

There is nothing worse than the death of a child - except when the child inflicts its own death.

There is no more helpless feeling for a rabbi than being confronted with that. There is nothing one can say. There is little one can do - except be there, helping, reassuring, loving, officiating. The UAHC National Task Force on Youth Suicide Prevention has provided us with a growing body of knowledge on prevention and now, its loving concern focuses on another perspective - postvention.

Rabbi Daniel Roberts, whose interest in the subject goes back many years and who has provided us with motivation and enlightenment, has now turned his attention to the aftermath. He provides rabbis - and others - with a rational plan of action for a time of panic, turmoil and hopelessness - from the first moment of horror to the long-range lifetime mourning.

His guide is not only destined to be a blessing to so many survivors, and to distraught, frustrated rabbis, but could well be a major deterrent to further suicides. Its role, then, is classically prophetic: consolation on the one hand, and warning on the other. It is a deeply religious, profoundly Jewish exercise. Its reading - indeed, study - is commended now, before God forbid...

### THE VALUE OF LIFE

(The Reform Jewish View of Suicide)

Judaism has always viewed human life as sacred and the taking of one's life as a "chet" (morally wrong and prohibited). It forbids suicide except under specific tragic circumstances, such as the choice between forced conversion and death. With the exception of the Holocaust, these situations do not normally occur in our day.

According to Jewish Law a suicide is interred on the periphery of the cemetery, a goodly distance from the other grave sites, and no mourning rites are observed for the individual. However, if the suicide is considered mentally incompetent (lo la da'at), the foregoing rule is not applied.

Reform Judaism does not condone the taking of one's life. In keeping with Jewish tradition which emphasizes compassion and concern for the surviving family, rites of burial and mourning customs are observed. Survivors of suicide attempts are strongly urged and encouraged to seek appropriate therapy.

As Reform Jews, we are deeply concerned with the recent epidemic of completed suicides and attempted suicides. In an effort to reverse these alarming trends, the Union of American Hebrew Congregations has determined to use its resources to teach and to emphasize the value and holiness of life as a God-given gift to be held in sacred trust. We seek to impart to our youth a recognition of the uniqueness of one's own life and its special meaning to others. The saving of a life, including one's own, is tantamount to saving the world.

Rabbi Daniel Syme in reaction to his article, "Worlds to Save" in <u>Hadassah Magazine</u> (March, 1987) remind us how ill-equipped most of us are when it comes to handling the tremendous devastation caused by suicide.

..As a survivor of suicide, I am continually disappointed by the void I've found in Jewish institutions and its leadership. My experience has been that I shouldn't look for spiritual support or answers in our tradition when it comes to the subject of suicide.

...Robert's (not real name) suicide was a tremendous shock to the Jewish community. And one of my first responses was to counsel with the rabbis. I was looking for help in finding the Jewish responses, thought and traditions to help me gain a perspective on Robert's suicide. I wanted to find comfort and

explanation through the <u>Jewish focus on</u> <u>life</u>. I was sure that somewhere in Jewish thought there were answers and ideas that could help me understand and be able to explain Robert's pain and

despair.....Instead, the answer was, "It's best not to talk about it"; "It's best to forget the tragedy and go on with your life."

As any survivor of suicide knows, it is never

forgotten; as the daily living comes back into focus, the fact of a suicide is always there for me....Where and when and how is its (*Reform Judaism's*) leadership teaching us the Jewish traditions and resources that could bolster and secure our faith after it's so blatantly knocked off its foundation: the ultimate value of each human life?

...I cannot help but wonder how less painful these 3 years-- and the next 30--might be if we had been given the spiritual basis for our daily survival as a Jewish family, rather than the message that it's best to forget.<sup>3</sup>

The intent of this article is to examine not only the

shouting, screaming or any other emotion which they feel. It should be pointed out that suicide is unlike other death experiences, and to reinforce what could be considered "normal" feelings and reactions during the months ahead. It is "normal" to blame themselves, to feel like they are going crazy, to feel that the pain will

### It is vital to stress that the denial of the truth will lead to a social isolation

never subside, to be angry at the deceased for causing such great pain, to even feel a sense of relief that all the anguish during the past months is over. It is even "normal" to react to these emotions with guilt feelings for even thinking this way. We must reiterate over and over again to the mourners that they are only human and had no control over their child's (parent's) behavior and thoughts. It is also essential to warn people against the use of sedatives, liquor or other drugs to deaden the pain and shock. These devices will only hinder the normal grieving process and lengthen the period of mourning.

One important area in which we can also make an immense contribution is in getting the family to decide how they are going to explain the death to others. Often, suicide brings a sense of shame, and people would love to falsify the truth, but this only leads to future deceptions and, likewise, to the denial of the truth to oneself. Thus, it could be extremely helpful to have the family rehearse how they will explain the

death to their family and friends, as well as to their child's friends (or in the case of a parent, a child to his/her friends). It is vital to stress that the denial of the truth will lead to a social isolation by people who most probably will have guessed the truth, but are now reluctant to openly discuss it.<sup>6</sup>

This being a time of complete shock and disarray for the family, we, rabbis, need to delineate carefully what steps should be taken. We should assist with the planning of the funeral, as well as suggesting how everyone might say those "last goodbyes" (see Rituals). In addition, we might support the extended family by helping them to get organized. Since often there is an investigation surrounding the death, the family might very well be inundated by the media and by curious, but not sincere friends. A spokesperson should be appointed who will be in charge of handling this, thus relieving the immediate family of this pressure. For the most part, the family will let you know very clearly (although, at times some families will not be able to articulate it as clearly) when and if you are overextending your bounds.

It must be emphasized again that this death is unlike any other. Under normal circumstances people know what to do and what not to do, but this situation is different. There is a real sense of confusion, panic and chaos surrounding this death. Therese Rando in her book, Grieving: How to Go

This mourning ritual and its period of seven days (shiva) should not be cut short nor downplayed. It should be pointed up, too, that the most difficult time for everyone will be when shiva is completed. This is the real time of loneliness, desperation and feelings of guilt. It would be greatly helpful to organize some sort of support team (see: FRIENDS) that will particularly fill this void after shiva.

#### The Funeral

This is one of the toughest funerals we will ever have to do. Unless this has been a long protracted illness wherein the deceased has alienated him/herself from

others, we can expect the funeral home, or synagogue to be filled to the brim with overly emotional and shocked mourners, especially, if this is a young person. The family will be stricken with grief, and we will be exhausted and in pain from our empathy. Our personal challenge will be to find words of comfort, but not ones which romanticize the deceased, thus making him/her a hero. The eulogy must reflect honesty, and admit that we do not understand the ways of God, nor the choice of ending one's life early.

Although, we might believe that the family wants to hear platitudes and wonderful words about their child (or parent, mate), we must remember that there is a great deal of animosity and anger toward the deceased for having caused all this pain, and so honesty remains the best policy. We eulogize the end of a life, but not the way it ended. We must also bear in mind that there will be many impressionable people sitting in the audience who, if the deceased is overly praised, might decide that they, too, can gain some recognition in the eyes of their parents and/or others through such an act. Let the funeral do what it is supposed to do: to bring reality to the death and to begin the process of mourning. Let it be the ritual through which feelings, which are too difficult to express verbally, can be vented and acted out.

### SKELETONS IN THE CLOSET

It is said that a person who commits suicide leaves his/her skeleton in every survivor's closet. This is plainly seen when we now look at what needs to be done to assist everyone to recover from this tragic incident.

### The Congregation

1. The Rabbi--This is one of the most stressful deaths with which we will have to deal, as rabbis. Almost more than with any other death, we rabbis become emotionally involved with the family, we feel their intense pain and cannot help but cry internally with them every inch of the way. We

warning signs of a potential suicide victim (see Table 5), as well as what to do if any of these signs are observed. That is, we must teach the youth

to......"break a confidence" and tell an authority when a life is threatened. This should be our central message! We must emphasize that by confiding in an adult authority figure, i.e. school principal, counselor, rabbi or parent,

when someone is suspected of suicidal behavior, the "informer" may be saving a life.. In addition, this is a perfect opportunity to discuss alternatives to suicide for those who are in pain and are feeling hopeless, hapless or helpless. This is also the time to discuss legitimate coping mechanisms as well as how drugs and alcohol undermine this process and mask the distress that the person is feeling. It is also an opportunity to teach about self esteem and to help students understand how coping with disappointment and pain helps one's maturity. All this should end with some activity to promote life, and which is hopeful and uplifting.

(Also, the religious school faculty and the entire temple staff, i.e. youth advisor, temple administrator, secretaries, should be included in a discussion of the suicide and be educated as to how each can work to help prevent this from happening to others.)

#### THE COMMUNITY

 Helping the Friends of the Suicide's Relatives (Parents, Grandparents,

Children,

Grandchildren)--The friends of the family are the rabbi's greatest allies in helping the mourners, for here is a group of people who want to be involved and be helpful because they care. Probably, like everyone else, they

too are at a loss as to how to handle the situation. Kjell Rudestam gives us some insight into the friends when he discovered in a large scale study that "the pattern was for friends to listen and be sympathetic, while at the same time avoiding the topic of death itself." In other words, he writes, "friends offered tangible support (e.g., providing meals and rides), but tended not to initiate discussion of the suicide, creating a curtain of silence around the event." (author's underline)<sup>10</sup> When this happens, the survivors feel that their friends cannot or do not want to talk about the death, and thus, they feel even more isolated. We can readily see that solace and knowing how to console another does not come automatically. Friends and relatives need to be instructed in the art of giving comfort and also be given permission to talk about the death. They need to be educated as to

glamorizing or dramatizing a suicide. Unfortunately, many school officials do not understand that doing nothing can be as dangerous as doing too much. 11 Perhaps, the first order in giving help might be to assist the school staff in their own coping with the death. There needs to be time for them to reflect on what they might or might not have done to prevent this death, and then to give a sense of closure to the subject. Next, there needs to be a discussion as to how all could work as a team to help the student body. (See Table 1-The Postintervention Process) It has been suggested by Karen Dune-Maxim, author and Project Director of the New Jersey Youth Suicide Prevention Project, that a memorial service not be held unless this is the procedure for all school deaths. Instead, small groups should meet together with a teacher and/or counselor and be allowed to talk about their feelings. This outward expression of grief which gives students a legitimate way of resolving grief should be accomplished without idolizing the deceased, The rabbi must let school officials know that he/she is interested and willing to help, and that this assistance will be different from other professionals. It is thus hoped that through this approach the school staff will be willing to utilize our special talents. [Actually, if you are reading this paper prior to a suicide, to be really effective, you should be contacting your local high school principals and offering your help and expertise in developing a plan of action in the event that one should occur in the school. See questions to be resolved- Table 2.]

3. Peer Group: Regardless, whether school officials desire your involvement or not, when it comes to the close friends of the deceased, it is possible to be PROACTIVE rather than REACTIVE. These youths, particularly the most recent boyfriend/girlfriend, are in tremendous pain, feeling that they knew and somehow or in some way could have prevented the death. On the other hand it might be possibly that they secretly feel relieved of the burden that this person has been and are glad that it is over. For many, this will be their first encounter with death and their first realization that they are mortal. In reality, these young people are going to be scarred for the rest of their lives and this moment will often invade their thoughts. This event will shape and mold their entire lives. The only question is who is the one that will help them close their wounds and begin the healing process? You, as the rabbi, a trusted and sensitive advisor, are the logical person to gather these friends together and provide an atmosphere in which they can mourn. Simply getting everyone together and giving them the opportunity to talk openly with one another and to express their grief will be the catalyst for the healing process to begin. Allowing everyone to reflect on the situation and to articulate their guilt at not having done more becomes a catharsis. It is important as well to put a halt to the

question over and over again what they could have,

suggestions as to how they can talk with their child about their feelings and not to let the conversation remain on the level of just details. They should be reminded not to lecture their child on how awful the deceased was to have caused such suffering, but

rather, to assist their child in seeing both the good and the bad qualities of the deceased. I believe this conference will help reduce anxieties, and will instruct parents as to how to open new lines of communication between themselves and their children, which thus could prove to be a redeeming factor to this death.

For years afterwards, the parents will probably continue to

go through a plethora of feelings and emotions, i.e., they will attend graduations and/or weddings of friend's children, and old wounds will be opened anew. Thoughts that it could have been their child standing up there will run rampant through their minds, and the ache is once more. For the most part they probably will never quit blaming themselves and questioning "why".

Often others will wonder why these survivors do not get out and attend community events or even come to temple just to get their minds off their troubles? Perhaps the words of an Altanta counselor, and one who lost her son, gives us some insight. "I used to drive down the street thinking I had a sign on my car that said, 'MY SON KILLED HIMSELF.' Another car would pass me and I

#### THE SURVIVORS

"In assisting family survival in the aftermath of suicide, Nancy Hogan speaks to the importance of 'commitment to the survival of the family,' as well as 'commitment to the memory of the deceased.' These two aspects are essential for positive resolution. <sup>12</sup>

1) Parents-Grandparents-Children: (Reread the beginning of "First 48 Hours") It is said that there is no worse death than the death of a child. This is only superseded by the loss of a child through suicide, or homicide. The agony of the parents (the following applies to grandparents and children who have lost a parent as well) is insurmountable and will haunt them for the rest of their lives. They will continually search

weakness. In an attempt to find some momentary relief, as soon as possible, they will try to return to some "normal" activities, yet, they will find that their thoughts of the deceased will hound them continually. The small events of daily living suddenly become major traumas and take much longer to complete. Activities such as those which involve the remaining siblings, as well as work, no longer have the enjoyment they once had and require every ounce of energy to perform. It is our function to indicate that all of these feelings, emotions and exhaustion are normal, and that these survivors must learn to perhaps say, "no" to most new requests at this time in order to preserve their energies. We must remind them that their self esteem is at its lowest point and, consequently, they will be vulnerable to any new traumas that arise, thus they will need all their strength. Yet, we need to encourage them ultimately to find ways that they can do and give to others for this is one of the paths to "recovery".

Most of the events described above can be handled by friends once they understand how they can be of assistance. However, we need to be the architect who diagrams the restructuring of this family. The psychological components should be handled by a competent counselor, but we might have to suggest who that trained person is. Please remember that a suggestion of psychological help might have to be repeated many times, for the family may resist thinking they don't need the help and that they can get through

this alone. Also, it does take considerable energy to get up the energy to go for counseling, and there is for some the perceived stigma in going for such help.

One area of our expertise which we, as rabbis, ironically often overlook, which I feel can be of enormous help is in the area of faith and prayer. Think how many people endured the Holocaust due to their belief and hope! I believe we can assist this family to build upon their own natural faith which has gotten them through life to this point. Our role, as stated before, is not to argue on God's behalf.

These devastated people may be angry with (ked, and what we must do is give them permission to express that anger out loud. My teacher, Rabbi Zvi Yehuda, reminded me, "people of faith can relate to God by either loving God or hating God, by resignation or protestation, thus, they are not indifferent to God." We have to assure this family that even though they feel this anger and, perhaps, feel guilty for such emotions, they can still be within the faith of Judaism.

By bringing these survivors to the sanctuary and helping them to articulate their beliefs, we might surprised to discover that they are infuriated that the deceased brother/sister still seems to be getting all the attention, even though he/she is dead. Latter, the siblings will probably chastise themselves for feeling this way about their beloved brother/sister, someone who is dead and of whom everyone now speaks of in glowing terms. However, they should be told that all of this is perfectly normal. (Much of what has been said above also holds true for a child who loses a parent).

In addition, we might teach these children how they might comfort their parent(s). They must be helped to think realistically what can be expected from their parent(s) in the months ahead. They must understand the torment and anguish as well as how difficult it will be for their parent(s) to derive any joy from their accomplishments or to muster any energy to participate in their activities. Yes, they will probably feel resentful and angry, but this is a normal emotion. We must encourage this group of survivors to find people outside of the family with whom they can talk and share their feelings. (A suggestion of perhaps two or three psychologists, psychiatrists, or social workers should be prepared and given to the child and his/her parents--the parents should be informed of their surviving child(ren)'s need for psychological help.) We can also assist these siblings in rehearing how and what they will tell their friends, and how they will publicly deal with the issue that their sibling (or as the case my be, a parent, etc.) committed

suicide. We might also explore with them constructive ways in which to channel their energies. There is no better way to recovery than to get this 'at risk population' to turn this tragedy into something positive, especially if we can get them to go out and help others. Dr. Sol Gordon, author of When Living Hurts, calls this "Mitzva Therapy"

CONCLUSION: Being the comforter to the family and friends of a suicide victim is one of the hardest tasks we, as rabbis, will ever be called upon to perform. Yet, by the very nature of our position as the rabbi, and the almost unique respect that our position commands, we have the opportunity to affect many people's lives, and, in reality, maybe even to save one. With our help, people might discover how to bury the skeleton remaining in their psychological closets which, without us, might continue there indefinitely. Through our perception and understanding, we often can aid others in their quest to make sense out of a chaotic period of time, to find meaning out of disarray, and to gain direction to a less painful life. With our care and concern it is possible that some might be able to achieve a more satisfying life and to build tomorrow's dreams upon the grave of yesterday's bitterness.

#### Student Reaction

#### Staff Response

- Shock..Students may initially appear remarkably unreactive. In fact, they are in a state of shock and not yet able to accept the reality of the suicide
- Anger and projection, students will look for someone to blame. Initially, this may be directed at important adults in the victim's life, including school staff. "Why did they let it happen?"
- 3. Guilt. Typically, student who knew the victim may move from blaming others to blaming themselves. "If only I had talked to him more."
- Anger at the victim. This is a common reaction by students, even those not closely connected to the victim. "How could he do this to us?"
- Anxiety. Students will begin worrying about themselves. "If he could kill himself because he was upset, may I (or my friends) could too."
- Relief. Once the normal distortions of feelings are resolved, students can allow themselves to feel the sadness of the loss and begin the healing process.

- Staff needs to assume a stance of anticipatory waiting, acknowledging the shock and showing a willingness to talk about the suicide when students are ready. Hill (1984) suggest waiting 24 to 48 hours before initiating more direct action.
- Some expressions of anger must be allowed. Staff members may share the similar feeling they have had. However, at the same time reality must be introduced. There are limits on how much one person can be responsible for actions of another.
- Here, particularly, staff can be helpful by sharing their own similar reactions. And again, the reality principle is also introduced. One person cannot assume total responsibility for the act of another.
- 4.. Staff needs to be give permission for such expressions by normalizing them, perhaps tempered by questioning if the victim fully realized the impact of his act.
- Discussion should be guided towards helping students differentiate between themselves and the victim and towards other options for problem-solving.
- Staff must guard against encouraging a pseudo-mourning process before students have worked at resolving their conflicts over the suicide.

#### Introduction

By, Alfred B. DelBello, Chairman, National Committee on Youth Suicide Prevention

Youth suicide is the third leading cause of death for people under the age of 24 in the United States today, surpassed only by accidents and homicide. If current trends continue, nearly 5,000 American youngsters will kill themselves in 1986, while attempted suicides will continue to spiral upwards in far greater numbers. An estimated 12,000 younger children, aged 5 to 14, were admitted to psychiatric hospitals for suicidal behavior last year.

While these statistics are startling, the actual number of suicides and attempted suicides may be even higher. Accurate statistics are difficult to obtain. Many accidental deaths in which a young person takes extremely high risks with his or her own life, such as single car automobile accidents and victim precipitated homicides, are actually suicides. Many are disguised or miscertified to spare a family additional anguish.

Although we do not know the true causes of youth suicide, we do know from those who survive serious attempts that very few youngsters really want to die. Yet, eighteen young people in this country die by their own hand each day.

The National Committee on Youth Suicide Prevention is a private non-profit organization founded in 1984 to reduce the number of committed and attempted suicides among the nation's youth by establishing and supporting prevention programs and public awareness campaigns.

The Committee is working to increase public awareness of the severity of the problem, to encourage the development of new prevention programs and to support research and evaluation efforts. To date, 49 state chapters have been established to monitor the problem of youth suicide within each state, and to disseminate and make available prevention information. The State Chapters also focus public attention on the need for a Federal Commission to attack the problem of youth suicide on a national scale and to coordinate state prevention efforts.

To facilitate the prevention and awareness campaign, the National Committee on Youth Suicide Prevention is pleased to publish the first National Directory of Youth Suicide Prevention and Intervention Programs. This directory provides a comprehensive listing of the community resources available for assistance in dealing with youths who are suspected to be at risk of suicide.

Special thanks are in order to Dr. David Shaffer; Ann Garland; Columbia University; The Ittleson Foundation; The New York State Governor's Youth Suicide Prevention Council; New York State Office of Mental Health; Linda Laventhall and the State Coordinators for their dedication and efforts in making this publication possible.
