I much appreciated our luncheon meeting on Sunday at the Biennial. I felt that our discussion was most helpful and fruitful. I also hope that it will lead to some concrete results. As we agreed, I am enclosing copies of the descriptions of our various curricular offerings in the areas of interest to your committee, as communicated to me by Rabbi Kenneth Ehrlich, director of our Rabbinic School in Cincinnati; Associate Dean Lee Bycel of the Los Angeles School; and Associate Dean Lawrence Raphael of the New York School. These descriptions are sketchy and not complete. At each of our campuses, for example, rabbis and other professionals supervise the biweekly activities of each student. In Cincinnati they are Rabbis Allan Fuchs and Howard Simon; Professor Milton Foreman, director of the University of Cincinnati Walk-in Clinic, and Morton Startz, director of Jewish Family Service. In Los Angeles Rabbi Wolli Kaelter supervises this activity, and in New York Rabbis Jerome Malino and Malcolm Stern are in charge. These various people meet with all students upon their return from their biweekly visit and discuss in detail the range of problems which the students have encountered, as well as a pre-planned outline of the range of activities of the rabbi. In addition, the regional UAHC directors visit each one of the biweekly congregations and observe the students in action several times during each term and subsequently meet with each student to discuss their evaluations, etc. In Cincinnati, for example, the regional directors who participate in this program are Rabbis David Hachen, Howard Kaplansky, Lawrence Jackofsky, Lewis Littman, and Richard Sternberger.

There are other contexts in which the various problems which are of concern to the Committee on Youth are explored and discussed. My intent in stating all this is not to imply that we are doing all that we possibly could in this area. We are, however, aware and are attempting to the best of our ability to address this area.

I am also enclosing a copy of our current catalogue, which may give you a fuller view of the required and elective offerings on our various campuses.

After you will have had an opportunity to review the enclosed materials, I do hope and urge that you write to me as we discussed. We welcome your suggestions and shall give them the most careful consideration. Dear Alex:

I am responding to your letter of April 24 in which you wrote "this is the first meeting of the full Task Force (on Teen Age Suicide) and it is an important time for everyone involved to speak openly and freely in an effort to the work into meaningful and proper channels of endeavor".

In all sincerity , Alex, I have analyzed my thoughts and feelings about the Task Force on many occasions and they keep coming out as follows.

aTIVE I was called by some as "too confrontive and non-political" with my remarks and that may be so. However, I was speaking "openly and freely" about a very serious issue, which goes beyond the realm of politics and political considerations -- the issue of suicide, the issue of life versus death.

In your letter you also wrote "unfortunately our structure is such that we have to use lay leaders". I have no problem with that in and of itself and I am not, frankly, seeking power. I do not question the sincerity and caring of any member of the Task Force. My problem is that the group is made up almost entirely of lay people and mental health para-professionals as distinguished from psychiatrists and psychologists not to say that one is better than the other. They all did their home work well and the read the voluminous literature but that does not qualify one for professional standing.

I am the Medical director of a clinic and of a psycho-analytic training institute where social workers, murses, pastoral counselors and other mental health workers work and study under the aegis and supervision of trained professionals. This is required for legal as well as professional reasons. Malpractice suits are an increasing source of worry.

The Task Force on Teen Age Suicide should have, ideally two or three psychiatrists, since we professionals have differing opinions as well. Further, I feel, members who are close realtives of suicide victims -- there are a few such on the force -- should not be involved in the deliberations and in the decision making process. I know that I generalizing, but they are for the most part, too emotionally involved in the issue. More times than not a too caring person can push another into suicide.

Iti is primarily because of these reasons that I am stepping out of my active involvement in the Task force. I do not feel that I have been allowed to speak "openly and freely" and I do not like a "confrontive or adversarial position".

I thank you for inviting me to participate, I am still interested but

I am writing to you about my concern regarding the Task Force on Teen Age Suicide that will be be convening shortly on April 29th & 30th. You and I have a deep common interest in the success of this project. However, I feel it incumbent on me to share with you some serious omissions that could lead to something less than success and possibly an early demise.

I had hopes that after our initial meeting last spring another meeting would have been held to discuss how to proceed. When I learned that a Task Force had been set up under lay leadership, I found this troublesome. There is no question in my mind that Teen Age Suicide belongs primarily in the domain of psychiatry and psychology, therefore, a qualified professional must be in charge to give leadership and direction. By the same token, you would not put a lay leader in charge of a rabbinic conference.

Secondly, it is my feeling that although this is a Task Force on Teen Age Suicide, the focus must be enlarged, broadened to include all self destructive behavior since suicide is merely the culmination, the end result of such behavior that has been ignored, neglected and not treated.

Finally, it is my belief that there be two chairpersons for the Task Force-one a lay person--already existing and the other a well qualified professional to give much needed expert leadership.

Thank you for your wonderful letter of January 16 concerning our involvement with the adolescent drug rehabilitation program, STRAIGHT, featured recently in the CBS movie, "NOT MY KID".

My wife, Betty, and myself became aware of the very serious, national problem of teenage drug abuse over ten years ago and were one of the founders of the original STRAIGHT program in St. Petersburg which opened in 1976. I served as the first President of STRAIGHT, and presently am Chairman of the Executive Committee for the national organization. Betty and I have remained active through the years because we have been trying to communicate a message to the American public about the seriousness of teenage drug abuse. We were concerned about losing a generation of young people because of the epidemic of drug experimentation and abuse by the youth of our country.

Three years ago, Nancy Reagan launched her interest in juvenile drug abuse here in St. Petersburg when she visited the STRAIGHT program. Subsequently, she has revisited the program at the Cincinnati branch. Our program has been featured in Reader's Digest, Ladies Home Journal, NBC Magazine, ABC 20-20, CBS 60 Minutes, and finally the CBS Movie of the Week, "NOT MY KID".

The agency featured in the program is Straight, Inc., which is based here in St. Petersburg. It is the product of determined hard work on the part of Mel and Betty Sembler, members of this congregation.

Mel and Betty became involved nearly a decade ago when one of their three sons fell victim to addiction. Finding no program available to meet his needs, they set out to develop one.

Straight has generated a controversy because of its extremely authoritarian approach. The agency's therapists maintain that this is the only approach that really works with addictive personalities. Theory not withstanding, the results Straight achieves are widely acknowledged to be among the best, if not the best, among agencies doing this work.

Mel Sembler is an extremely successful and nationally known developer of shopping centers. He is a devout and active Reform Jew who, unfortunately, to date has not been exposed to the scope of our national movement.

I'm sure that a letter after January 15 to this dedicated and generous couple will be deeply appreciated. Their address is 10324 Paradise Blvd., Treasure Island, FL 33706.

These phenomena are manifestations of demoralization within the Jewish community, and it is ironic that "mental healthers," whose work is based on norms rather than ideals, and who have been so harmful to Jewish family life, are now being looked to for answers to these serious problems. The mental health professions are almost utterly unaware of the psychological strengths the Jewish tradition has provided thru much more difficult times than today, via, for example, the Sabbath mitzvah of study, which produces sparks, and a glow, from the rubbing together of minds, or the Sabbath mitzvah of marriage, which produces joy, and often children, from the rubbing together of bodies. Deeper awareness and greater glorification of our own tradition as a guide for daily living is most important, and little recognized, for overcoming the demoralization leading to suicide and similar tragedies. I would be happy to assist in any way possible to help clarify the psychological value of our tradition and to define the harm produced by so many current mental health practices. I read with interest about your concern regarding the growing rate of suicide among Jewish adolescents and young adults. We too have been worried about this trend and consequently our recent Family Life Education effort was directed at prevention, with a focus on the ability of parents to understand and communicate with their teens.

We would like to be doing more of this, however, staff and financial resources are limited. In the Miami Herald newspaper article of December 3, 1984, there was mention of special funding available for prevention and research through the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. Could you provide me with more information about these resources and how we might have access to them? We have an excellent clinical staff and a well established Prevention Department as well as a long term positive working relationship with the synagogues and temples in Miami. We have a strong research interest, several professional staff with research background, and a computerized information system which can be programmed to evaluate outcome data. We also provide training and leadership to the rest of our community.

#### RESOLUTION ON THREATS TO OUR YOUTH

#### BACKGROUND:

No group is more precious to us than our young people. Accordingly, the UAHC has historically devoted a significant proportion of our resources to serving youth, educating, building Jewish identity, seizing every conceivable opportunity to teach and move our children to greater Jewish self-confidence and involvement. Through NFTY, through our UAHC camps, through the College Education Department, through the Commission on Jewish Education, through our Israel programs, we have demonstrated our deep concern and commitment.

In recent years, however, a number of alarming trends have alerted us to the fact that, despite our best efforts, many of our children are in deep trouble. A national surge in teenage drug and alcohol dependency, an estimated 12% Jewish membership in some cults and missionary groups, a growing isolation from family and community, all point to the need for a radical rethinking of the sufficiency of our efforts.

The urgency of our charge has been intensified even further by a tragic epidemic of teenage suicide in our society, a terrifying manifestation of lost hope and devastated spirit.

Our Reform movement cannot -- and will not -- stand idly by.

### RESOLUTION:

WHEREAS Rabbi Schindler has focused our attention on the profound pressures which face young people in a rapidly changing North America,

AND WHEREAS the alarming epidemic of teenage suicide in our society is symptomatic of deep transitions in the family, personal alienation, and loss of self-esteem, as well as society breakdown,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of the UAHC, meeting in Bal Harbour,

- Call upon the President and Chairman of the Board to appoint a UAHC Task Force on Teenage Suicide, with representation from all arms of the Reform movement including the CCAR, HUC-JIR, UAHC affiliates and program departments.
- Urge that the task force, in conjunction with the Research Task Force, develop a comprehensive programmatic plan of research, suicide prevention and crisis intervention, to be presented at the 1985 General Assembly in Los Angeles.
- 3. Authorize the establishment of a new institute, to be called <u>Yad Tikvah</u> as an instrumentality through which the program mandates of the Task Force can be realized. It is understood that these efforts will require funding outside the regular budget of the UAHC.

Within the next several days you should be receiving a check for \$100,000. from the Saltz Family Philanthropic Fund of the Jewish Communal Fund of New York. This sum is to be put into the Endowment Fund as a restricted fund bearing the name YAD TIKVA...(The Hand of Hope). The funds are to be expended for special projects designated by Anita Saltz and authorized by me and by Dan Syme.

So far only one project has gained approval, the publication of a book on teen age suicide for which the Publications Department will ultimately bill you.

No adminstrative charges are to be levelled against the corpus of this gift, they are to be included in the project costs and then credited to the  $7\frac{1}{2}\%$  Fund in a percentage which will certainly be no less than 12% but may be as much as 25%, depending on the nature of the project.

We had a marvelous meeting with Lieutenant Governor Del Bello on Friday, September 7th. It is very clear that the UAHC is one of the few organizations nationwide undertaking a serious program in adolescent suicide prevention.

Del Bello is very interested in keeping us involved, and jumped at the suggestion that the religious community should be involved in his National Committee on Youth Suicide Prevention.

I volunteered you to be the convener of a meeting of religious leaders of the most important Jewish and Christian denominations. This would include the Archbishop of New York, the Head of the National Council of Churches, plus the highest possible level of religious leadership throughout the country.

Things are still in the very early stages, but it is clear that Del Bello sees this as a major priority, for both humanistic and political reasons. We are in on the ground floor, and I think that the Union and the Project will derive a great deal of mutual benefit. We should meet within the next seven to ten days to develop a draft list of names for the religious leaders meeting. Thanks.

August 29, 1984 Dear Rabbi Schindler, Thank you for sending me a copy of Ramie Arian's memo on his meeting with Dr. David Axelrod on July 26th. I believe that some very worthwhile suggestions were discussed at this meeting. I would like to comment on these suggestions. I shall refer to them by the number that precedes each suggestion as listed in Ramie Arian's memo. (1) We should proceed to identify successful models, establish criteria for evaluating them, and consider which would be most suitable for our implementation. (2) In my discussion with Dr. Axelrod on April 9th, we noted the homogeneous aspects of NFTY. Dr. Axelrod said that as this problem has a cultural component there is value in working with a narrowly defined group, and then finding ways to reach a broader constituency. (3) I agree with Dr. Axelrods view that we should address ourselves to the issue of general adolescent mental health. (4) I would be pleased and honored to be one of the founders of such an institute. (5) All six ways in which the institute would operate seem worthwhile. However, I do not want any programs created to satisfy my needs. Unless a program has merit it will not satisfy anyone. (6) I believe we should determine with more certainty if any organization of the type we are contemplating exists, so as to avoid duplcation and more clearly define areas of need. (7) This is an area that shows much promise and possibility of outside support with no religious affiliation. (8) I agree with Dr. Axelrod that a program with a positive approach, that avoids labeling participants will attract far more people. (9) The book that we are working on with Rabbi Syme addresses itself to that issue. (10) I can also provide you with names of people in the field who can serve as resource people.

I want to thank you again for all the attention that you are giving to this issue and for keeping me imformed.

At your request, and as Anita Saltz recommended, I met with Dr. David Axelrod, New York State Commissioner of Health, on Thursday, July 26th, regarding the issue of teenage suicide. The purpose of the meeting was to receive Dr. Axelrod's feedback and suggestions regarding the UAHC's proposed creation of a suicide crisis intervention program.

Dr. Axelrod had met previously with Anita Saltz, although they were not acquainted prior to that meeting. He was familiar with her proposals, and with the general structure and function of the UAHC.

Dr. Axelrod's significant suggestions are summarized below:

- (1) There exists a fairly well-defined body of knowledge regarding suicide in general, and teenage suicide in particular. There exists a variety of successful models for suicide prevention and for crisis intervention. Therefore, the issue is not to create programs from scratch, but rather to build systems for the delivery of these programs to the appropriate constituencies.
- (2) Dr. Axelrod wondered gently whether a congregationally-based, religious organization was well-positioned to reach large numbers of the target constituency for a suicide prevention program. Whatever programs we sponsor would be of value to a constituency far broader than the members of NFTY youth groups, for example, and even far broader than the larger constituency of the UAHC itself.
- (3) He asserted that been suicide is but one manifestation, albeit the urgent, of a whole galaxy of general teenage mental-health issues. He believes strongly that to deal with suicide on an ad hoc basis, outside of the context of general adolescent mental health, is to limit the scope of the program inappropriately, and ultimately would be counter-productive.
- (4) Consequently, he wondered about, and strongly urged for our consideration, the creation of an institute on adolescent psychiatry. Such an institute could be founded and controlled by the UAHC, but could ultimately operate with a number of partners, perhaps involving other denominational groups (Jewish and non-Jewish), health and mental health professionals, etc.
- (5) Such an institute would operate in several ways:
- -- It would bring together experts in the field, to deal with adolescent psychology in a coherent intellectual framework.
- -- It would deal with teenage suicide in the context of an understanding of adolescence, and not in a vacuum.
  - It could deal with the implications for religious bodies of the tone of a

society which engenders an epidemic of suicide among its youth.

- -- It could create suicide prevention programs immediately, as pilot or demonstation programs, thereby satisfying Anita Saltz's needs.
- -- It would attract substantial additional funding from various foundations and research organizations.
- -- It would be attractive to youth and parents who might be scared away by programs with overtly religious overtones.
- (6) To the best of Dr. Axelrod's knowledge, such an institute (devoted to adolescent mental health issues in a broad context) does not exist anywhere in the United States at the present time. Thus, the creation of such an institute would be a valuable contribution in ways far beyond the suicide issue.
- (7) He spoke of the usefulness of computers in possible programming. For example, he could imagine the creation of drop-in centers where individual youths could sit at an interactive computer terminal, and get carefully programmed general information about depression, suicide, and other adolescent issues, without taking the risks inherent in initiating human contact. The computer could help the individual take appropriate action in terms of seeking professional help or human contact when needed. I had an opportunity to visit a comparable center that the N.Y. Department of Health runs in Albany on general health issues, and he said they are working on establishing a series of comparable programs on teenage pregnancy. He said he was quite sure that firms like IBM and Digital Equipment would be willing, even eager, to donate expertise, equipment, and time to the creation of such programs.
- (8) Again, he emphasized that the key is creating programs that are inviting and easy for potential clients to get involved with. Resources need to be available to youth without being threatening. For example, a center should be called a "Teen Resource Center" rather than a "Crisis Intervention Center".
- (9) Dr. Axelrod believes that adolescent education and parent education are the two most effective avenues, in the long run, to undertake in attacking the suicide problem.
- (10) He left me with the names of about a half dozen health experts whose fields intersect with the suicide issue, and who would be helpful should we decide to proceed with the concept of an institute for adolescent mental health.

SOL GORDON BOOK PROPOSAL ON TEENAGE SUICIDE

As you requested, I have shared Gordon's proposal with a group of campers, and their reactions are summarized below. On the whole, I thought they were remarkably thoughtful, perceptive, and on-target.

The participants were promised anonymity. For the sake of the summary, their first names, ages, and states of origin are as follows:

The overwhelming first and overall reaction was positive. The students agreed that the book is helpful, useful, important (one even said inspiring). They said it made them think about issues they knew they had to face but had never really thought about before. They said they learned a lot from the selection.

They particularly liked the specific, concrete suggestions Gordon gives as advise to one who is suicidal, or who is helping someone who is. They felt these were useful and reassuring.

They liked Gordon's style of writing. They characterized it as easy to read, and interesting. They said that based on the sample, they would want to read the whole booklet.

They felt personally addressed by Gordon's use of the first person. They felt that the author was talking directly to the individual reader. However, they were not unanimously happy about this perspective. Steve (Michigan) felt that the writing was below his level, and that in being personally addressed at such a low level, he was insulted. But most of the students disagreed, and felt the stype engaging.

Gordon's non-traditional segments were controversial. For instance, some people liked his use of interspersed poetry, while others found it a turn-

off. Some, who did not like it personally, thought it should nevertheless be included because it might touch someone who was potentially suicidal.

Similarly, his use of religious language and imagery got mixed reviews, but in this case they were mostly negative. The students objected to Gordon's comments such as that one way to combat depression is to do mitzvot. They did not like his suggestion that the second great miracle is the coming of the Messiah. They were unmoved or turned off by his mention that "salvation does not care how you get there". Becky, however, felt that the religious language might speak to someone on the verge of suicide (although most of the students disagreed). The objections seemed more directed at the limiting particularity of <u>Jewish</u> terminology than at religious language in general.

Becky summarized the feeling of the group when she said that the book made the issue of suicide real for those who had never confronted it before.

When asked to rate the book on a scale of 1-10 (ten is the highest), most people said 8, and the average was just under 8.

When asked if the UAHC should publish this book, 9 of the ten said yes.
