

New York, NY --- The Union of American Hebrew Congregations, national congregational body of Reform Judaism in the U.S. and Canada, has acquired the country's only Jewish music publishing house, Transcontinental Music Publishing Company, and will henceforth operate the company as part of the UAHC's publishing division.

Transcontinental Music, founded in 1938 by the late Dr. Joseph Freudenthal, a pioneer in the development of Jewish music, includes in its catalogue selections for the cantor, choir, soloist, the organ, college choirs, and instrumental music, synagogue services, scores for chamber ensembles, string orchestra, chamber orchestra and full symphony.

The company was presented to the UAHC as a gift by the founder's widow, Mari Freudenthal, since she believed that the UAHC through its 720 member synagogues and 1.1 million members could carry out her husband's goal of "producing Jewish music for the perpetuation of Judaism."

According to Rabbi Leonard A. Schoolman, UAHC Director of Program, "the UAHC has always advanced the promotion of Jewish culture and the arts, especially evident at the group's biennial conventions where works were commissioned by such artists as Darius Milhaud, Eli Weisel, David Brubeck, Samuel Adler, David Amram, and Marvin David Levy."

In addition, Rabbi Schoolman noted that the UAHC has "always encouraged experimental religious services blending various art forms and at its 100th anniversary in 1973, commissioned twenty new liturgical works for the synagogue."

He stated that the UAHC pledges itself to "expand and intensify our services to the total Jewish community so that the cause of Jewish music in America might be enhanced and continue to flourish. Our commitment is to the totality of k'lal yisrael."

Rabbi Schoolman announced that Kurt Stone, former editor-in-chief of the Associated Music Publishers has agreed to serve as the new interim editor of Transcontinental Music. Mrs. Freudenthal will also remain available as a consultant.

A Publication Advisory Board has been formed headed by composer and scholar Dr. Samuel Adler, Professor of Composition, Eastman School of Music, Rochester, as the chairperson. Also serving on the board are: Dr. Herbert Fromm, Music Director Emeritus, Temple Israel, Boston; Hazzan Samuel Rosenbaum, Executive Vice-President, Cantors Assembly; and Mrs. Freudenthal, Mr. Stone and Rabbi Schoolman.

To help you begin thinking about your adult courses for next year, we suggest that you consider these new ideas, as well as one or two older successful programs that merit your consideration.

FOR LAWYERS, ACCOUNTANTS, BUSINESS EXECUTIVES

NEW A recent edition of the *Wall Street Journal* called attention to the fact that the growing trend in continuing education programs sponsored by local universities is no longer in leisure activity. It is in professional enrichment.

Jewish Law and Jewish Life: Selected Rabbinic Responses is a new series of pamphlets prepared by Rabbi Stephen M. Passamaneck, professor of talmud, HUC-JIR, Los Angeles, dealing with legal, ethical and business problems faced by Jewish tradition--that are still relevant today.

For example, responsa (organized in a series of thematic booklets) include such subjects as partnership, employer-employee relations, contracts, tax evasion, real property, landlord-tenant relations, privacy, creditor-debtor relations, ethics for the judiciary and attorneys--and much more.

Readers of the manuscript, based on material prepared in Hebrew by Judge Jacob Bazak of Tel Aviv District Court and Bar Ilan University, have told us that this is the perfect course for lawyers, accountants, business executives. They will be turned on. The booklets will be especially valuable for noontime downtown study groups. Available from the UAHC on May 15.

OFF BEAT LOOK AT THE BIBLE

NEW Twenty years ago, Maurice Samuel wrote an extraordinary book, *Certain People of the Book*. It dealt with some off-beat personalities of the Bible, but at the same time, offered an important view of biblical thought.

Now, the UAHC has issued a paperback of this out-of-print classic. It is a joy to read--still--and can serve as the basis for a top notch study series. (More than a few sermons are readily apparent, too.)

Some of the chapter headings are "The Comic as Fool" (Ahasuerus); take a look at Abraham Cronbach's *Stories Made of Bible Stories* for another view of Purim; "Perverted Genius" (Balaam); "An Idyll of Old Age" (Naomi); "The Manager" (Rebekah); "Three Wives" (David's Michal, Abigail, Bathsheba); -- perhaps a series of women biblical characters; "The Hellcat" (Jezebel); now you're interested; "The Brilliant Failure" (Joseph); and more.

Last, but hardly least, Maurice Samuel wrote beautiful English. The kind that is rarely seen these days.

Sanford Seltzer's booklet Jews and Non-Jews: Falling in Love is NEW creating excitement all over the American Jewish scene. This informal guide to interfaith marriage for couples, their families, and the rabbis who counsel them has another valuable use: adult education.

For rabbis who want to explain intermarriage positions in a non-controversial setting, this book offers the easy way. For deeply sensitive insights into how Jewish families deal with mixed and intermarriages, Seltzer helps understanding. And for the couples themselves...

The book is now available, and a family study guide (commissioned by the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods) will be ready this fall.

LEARNING ABOUT PRAYER

NEW

The appearance and wide use of *Shaarei Tefillah* (Gates of Prayer) in our congregations has stirred wide interest in prayer and the prayerbook.

Two volumes are now ready for your perusal for use next fall. Shaarei Binah is published jointly by the CCAR and the UAHC. Edited by HUC-JIR Professor Lawrence Hoffman, it includes these essays with introductions: "Basic Features of the Jewish Liturgy," Jakob J. Petuchowski; "David Einhorn's Guiding Principles," Kaufmann Kohler; "First Debate on Music, 1893 Proceedings of the CCAR Convention;" "1854 Service from the American Israelite;" "Language of Debate and the Language of Prayer," Abraham Cronbach; "Three Paths to the Holy," Samuel S. Cohon; "Individual and Community in Jewish Prayer," Eugene B. Borowitz; "Prayer," Henry Slonimsky; "No Retreat from Reason," Roland B. Gittelsohn; "Polydoxy and Equivocal Language," Alvin J. Reines; "Stumbling Blocks to Prayer," Ely E. Pilchik; "Affirmation and Study," Israel Bettan; "Environment of Prayer," Alexander Gut-mann; "Israel's Influence on American Liberal Synagogue Music," William Sharlin; and two essays by Lawrence Hoffman.

In addition, the book also contains the Notes to Gates of Prayer, Synopses of Services in GOP, and a Table of Scriptural Readings.

Essays on Jewish Worship (B'fi I'Sharim Tithallel), edited by Sanford Seltzer, is published for the Commission on Worship (CCAR-UAHC) by the UAHC. It includes four essays: "Worship and Synagogue Transformation" by Harvey J. Fields; "The Judaism Cosmos" by Herbert Bronstein; "Davening and Congregational Song" by Cantor William Sharlin; and "Some Nature Elements in Jewish Worship" by Everett Gendler.

ACADEMY FOR JEWISH STUDIES WITHOUT WALLS

NEW The UAHC and the American Jewish Committee's Academy for Jewish Studies Without Walls are now engaged in a pilot study using some of the AJC's Basic Studies Courses as self-motivating study materials. The idea is that these "home correspondence" courses would admirably suit *chavurot* or similar study groups in which the students essentially serve as group leaders. The rabbi would serve as a resource leader, not as a teacher.

Since our discussions over the fate of Transcontinental Music have thus far been primarily with you, representing the UAHC, I am writing to you now to report the action of our Executive Board taken this past week.

The Board heard a full report by Bennett Miller, who had just attended the Commission on Jewish Music, as had Barry Greene and I. His report to the Board had four recommendations: That the CCAR seek immediate reimbursement of monies due us for the development of Shaarei Shira (you know that we have been pursuing this for many months, and many dates predicted or promised by you have gone by); second, that the CCAR end our financial involvement in Transcontinental Music; third, that we join in the joint administration of Transcontinental Music through our participation in the Joint Commission on Jewish Music, which will henceforth oversee the administration of Transcontinental; fourth, that we work through the commission to strive to make Transcontinental's administration as effective and efficient as possible.

While no date was specified in the motion, which was adopted in full, it seems most logical to me that this change be effective with the end of the current UAHC fiscal year, namely, June 30th, 1988. That seems best, since the 1987-88 UAHC fiscal year is the first year in which Transcontinental will be in the black.

I know that we will work together in the future in many ways; it has been a personal pleasure getting to know you better in our cooperative effort to do the best we can vis-a-vis effective management of Transcontinental Music.

You indicated that the ACC did not have the available resources to pay its one-third share of the Transcontinental Music deficit dating back to the 1984-85 fiscal year. You also indicated that the ACC would not be able to continue into the future with the tripartite agreement which included the UAHC, CCAR and ACC. In recognition of the above, the ACC will no longer be able to continue as a financial partner in Transcontinental Music, thus relinquishing responsibility for deficit as well as the possible benefits should Transcontinental Music ever become profitable.

We regret that the ACC will no longer be able to financially participate in Transcontinental Music but sincerely hope that the Cantors will continue to aid in the publication and distribution of Jewish music through its support of Transcontinental Music and the Music Commission. We look forward to working with the Conference in the future.

Some days ago you talked to me about the impending publication of Shaarei Shira and you indicated that the Conference would like to have us publish this work.

At the program Committee meeting yesterday which you were compelled to miss because of a funeral, Judy Tisbhler announced that the Transcontinental Music Corporation is publishing this book and that all of the constituent bodies (ACC, CCAR, UAHC) agreed to provide the resources necessary for its publication.

This was news to me since no one had ever cleared this with us. Lenny Schoolman, according to Judy Tischler, made this commitment.

I would appreciate it if you were to follow this up, getting the appropriate budget for the project from Judy and double checking it with Sty.

I would not be at all opposed to either co-publishing this with the CCAR and the ACC provided they put up an equal amount of the capital which is required for its publication, and there is an equal distribution of the profits. Incidentally, I'm convinced that this is a staple which should do almost as well as the Union Prayer book. After all it is intended to replace the Union Hymnal which has fallen into disuse. In other words it should be a profit making venture quite aside from its worth for our congregations. I am so convinced of that, that I would be willing to recommend that the Union invest in this alone provided of course, we receive all the profits.

I had a session with Mel Merians yesterday and I raised this issue with him. He ppomised to pursue it, so you best check with him first so that the two of you don't duplicate efforts.

One other thought in this connection. If this is indeed to be a tripartite venture with investments and the profits to be equally shared, I would insist that the investment money be available up fromt. They may well expect us to pay all the bills, holding their "investment" as an accounts receivable. This would scarcely be cricket. Moreover, so Stu just told me, he has volunteered to produce the work, in which case, his time and overhead should be charged to this venture as part of the investment cost. After all, he is not rendering these services as a "volunteer" on his own time.

Subject Publication of Shaarei Shirah

I am enclosing copies of correspondence from the CCAR regarding the creation of the Joint Board on Music Publications. I do not have in my files a copy of the minutes of the meeting at which the UAHC Board of Trustees passed its approval. This meeting is referred to by Rabbi Elliot Stevens in his letter of December 15, 1982.

In the Minutes of the Meeting of the Joint Board of April 23, 1985, attended by Rabbi Leonard Schoolman, then UAHC Director of Programs, the agreement, already understood since 1982, that Transcontinental would be the publisher of <u>Shaarei</u> Shirah was articulated.

Although we do not have written documentation, Stuart Benick has been consulted on the matter of Book Design and Production costs. A "fake" budget was worked up for the purposes of fund raising. Dan Syme thought he had a donor, but that did not materialize. In early November, a meeting was held of representatives of the Joint Board together with Stu Benick. Some of the production figures were revised. I will prepare a realistic budget within the next few days which will reflect money already spent and future productions costs as they really are and not for fund raising purposes.

Regarding fund raising, Malcolm Stern has approached a donor and we do have a good possibility of significant funding (\$100,000). If this does not materialize, members of the Board of Trustees who are also delegates to the Commission on Synagogue Music have offered their services to help raise money.

We receive daily inquiries as to the projected publication date of <u>ShaareiShirah</u> by TRANSCONTINENTAL. It is common knowledge in the Movement that Transcontinental would be the publisher. It has been subject of serious discussion at the meetings of the Commision on Synagogue Music where the question of any other publishing agent of the Movement was never raised. It has always been understood at these meetings that Transcontinental would be the publisher.

I sincerely hope that five years of concerted effort by Transcontinental and its staff will be allowed to come to fruition at the Biennial of 1986.

PROPOSAL ON REFORM MUSIC PUBLICATIONS ADOPTED BY CCAR EXECUTIVE BOARD 10/20/82

RESOLVED, that there be created a Joint Board on Music Publications with three representatives each from the American Conference of Cantors, the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, and the Central Conference of American Rabbis, who would elect their own chairman. This Board would have ultimate responsibility for reviewing the status and operation of Transcontinental Music, setting priorities and policy, engaging personnel, determining the budget and the administrative structure. There would be an executive committee which would be immediately accessible to the Director of Music Publications, on a model similar to the Placement Commission, its Executive Committee and Director. The Joint Board would prepare an annual budget which would be submitted to appropriate bodies within the ACC, UAHC, and CCAR for annual ratification. All profits and losses would be shared equally, including the shared expenses such as telephone, heat, light, central accounting, cleaning-services, etc., now. borne by the UAHC.

Additionally, the Board of Directors of Transcontinental Music will consist of two representatives each of the CCAR, UAHC and ACC.

MEETING OF THE JOINT BOARD ON MUSIC PUBLICATIONS December 6, 1983

The Joint Board on Music Publications held its first organizational meeting on December 6, 1983, at the UAHC in New York. Present were Rabbis Joseph B. Glaser, Elliot L. Stevens, and Malcolm H. Stern for the CCAR, Cantors Raymond Smolover and Richard Botton for the ACC, Rabbi Leonard Schoolman for the UAHC, and Judith Tischler for Transcontinental Music. A designated representation from the UAHC not yet having been appointed, there was no move to elect a chairman, and the meeting proceeded without one.

The Board first reviewed the mandate and structure under which it had been organized, according to resolutions adopted by the three bodies (attached), and attempted to clarify the role of the Board vis-a-vis its executive committee, an advisory committee and a "board of directors" mentioned in the resolution. Rabbi Schoolman pointed out that with the transfer of Transcontinental Music to ownership by the UAHC, its corporate status had ended, as had the need and existence of a board of directors, Transcontinental Music now being identical in its structural relations within the UAHC to a joint commission. Rabbi Stevens, recalling descriptions of technical distinctions and continuing corporate status in some form, asked for clarification on this point, which will have to await Mr. Broido's return.

The discussion of the executive committee's function clarified that it would be a subgroup of the Joint Board, with one representative from each body, and would deal with the same matters mandated to the overall board - as described in the attached resolution - but on a more immediately accessible basis to the director. Creation of the annual budget, for example, would originate in discussions between the executive director and the executive committee, proceed to review and approval by the joint board, before submission to the three overall bodies which would be asked for ratification.

It was also decided that the advisory committee on specific music publications to be taken up by Transcontinental Music would function under the supervision of the Joint Board on Music Publications, as well as such other sub-committees as the Joint Board might see fit to appoint from time to time.

Also reconfirmed was the role of the various organizations in the publication of <u>Shaarei</u> <u>Shira</u>: the CCAR had paid and was paying for development of the finished manuscript; the UAHC would be paying for engraving and typesetting fees, while the ACC would pay for production. The matter of copyright was still undecided, although it was clear that distribution would be done primarily by the UAHC through Transcontinental Music. The question of accounting was discussed, and it was determined that monthly figures would be provided on expenses and income relating to <u>Shaarei Shira</u> from each organization to Elliot Stevens at the CCAR, who would then issue a separate statement approximately every six months for review by the Joint Board.

The Board then turned to the composition of a newly defined advisory committee, agreeing that both Mrs. Freudenthal and Sam Adler would remain on the advisory committee. In order to fill the various roles which Transcontinental Music would play, and meet the needs of various audiences, it was determined that a broadly representative group would best comprise the advisory committee, and various schemata were discussed as to possible areas of representation. Subsequently, the following names were proposed for appointment to the advisory committee, besides the first two: Richard Botton, Ben Steinberg, Helene Repps, Henry Rosenbloom, Jon Haddon, Motti Lazar, Joshua Jacobson, and a church person to be named by Richard Botton.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE JOINT BOARD OF TRANSCONTINENTAL MUSIC

The Executive Board of Transcontinental Music met on April 23, 1985. Present were Rabbis Leonard Schoolman, Malcolm H. Stern, Joseph B. Glaser, and Elliot L. Stevens, Cantor Ray Smolover, and Ms. Judith Tischler, Director of Transcontinental Music.

One goal of the meeting was to determine the production costs for <u>Shaarei Shirah.</u> It was estimated that the CCAR had spent \$22,000 in fees to the editor, Cantor Charles Davidson; the UAHC would spend approximately \$16,000 for engraving and design work, and paper printing and binding for the two editions would perhaps run to \$27,000, for a total production cost of \$65,000. The engraving and design charge was calculated to \$6,000 for design work, \$5,000 for engraving, and perhaps \$5,000 for proofreading and editing. Production, based on a guess of \$2.00 a book for 10,000 books for the pew edition, and \$7.00 for each of a thousand books in the pulpit edition, made up the \$27,000 for production. If Cantor Davidson's fee is divided such that \$14,000 is attributable to the choir loft edition, the design costs split in half, and production costs allocated as above (\$20,000 for the pew edition, \$7,000 for the choir loft edition), the total would come to \$29,000 for the choir loft edition, or \$29 a book, and \$36,000 for the pew edition, or \$3.60 per copy, for raw production costs without any normal additional overhead.

Cantor Smolover reported that the meager financial resources of the ACC could only provide about \$6,000 per year, primarily through concerts, for Transcontinental Music, with no additional funding possibilities for the production of <u>Shaarei Shirah</u>. He pointed out, however, that his own countless hours of time devoted to the project over many years, as well as that of other cantors in the ACC, represented a substantial enough contribution to warrant the project's being viewed as underwritten jointly by all three bodies, despite their inability to provide cash for the production of <u>Shaarei Shirah</u>. Although others pointed out an apparent contradiction to earlier minutes of the Board, which seemed to indicate that the ACC had made an undertaking to participate in funding production, the reality of the situation was such that, as all agreed, the ACC could not be expected to furnish any money for publication.

It was estimated that, for bulk purchases by congregations of the pew edition, \$10 a book would be about the maximum that any congregation could be expected to pay. Rabbi Schoolman agreed to investigate much more closely with the UAHC Publications Department staff what actual production costs might be. Rabbi Stevens agreed to investigate the actual quantity of <u>Shirim Uzmirot</u> which have been sold since its publication. All in attendance voiced their intention to seek out possible benefactors. In the meantime, Rabbi Schoolman noted that he would direct the process of designing and engraving the pages of music to continue.

Regarding the three-part financial participation in Transcontinental Music by the UAHC, the CCAR and the ACC, it was noted that the CCAR could not take any action to withdraw from the relationship until 1986, thereby securing the 1985-1986 fiscal year budget of Transcontinental on the present basis. The CCAR Committee on Budget and Finance would, however, place the matter of future CCAR participation on the agenda of its fall, 1985 meeting for possible action regarding the following fiscal years.

All agreed in principle that income from sales of <u>Shaarei Shirah</u> would first go to reimburse all editorial and production expenses, following which <u>Shaarei Shirah</u> would be considered as a normal part of the inventory of Transcontinental Music, with profits accruing thereto. Rabbi Stern reported on <u>Shaarei Shira</u>, with the news that the contents had been completed, with arrangements still coming in. Judith Tischler and Rochelle Nelson are also arranging, and two-thirds of the whole were reported as ready for engraving. A designer has not yet been named, although a final choice by Stuart Benick seems near. Elliot Stevens will have the task of seeking permissions, through lists provided by Malcolm Stern.

Judith Tischler added to the future agenda the possibility of a separately published, thin, bound book for use with Shaarei Teshuvah.

The group decided to meet next in February, including full representation from the UAHC, at which time the 1984-85 budget would be discussed, as well as special arrangements with Ephros and New Horizons - the latter reported not to be doing well.

Dear Dan:

It was a pleasure speaking with you a few days ago about <u>Shaarei Shira</u>, and I look forward to meeting with you and all of those who will be involved in its production. To recap: <u>We will try to meet on Tuesday, October 21, at 11:00 a.m. at the UAHC</u>, and I will hope to confirm this date with the others right away.

For your background, this project was originally to be a joint publication by the CCAR and ACC, and we engaged Cantor Charles Davidson as editor at \$500 per month, starting in January, 1979. The deal was the CCAR would fund all editorial and development expenses and get reimbursement from the first sales, subsequently splitting income on a five-eighths - three-eighths basis with the ACC; the CCAR originally was to service orders and handle inventory. The project was killed by our Publications and Budget Committees in 1981, but reapproved by the Executive Board that December. Payments to Davidson ended in June of 1981, and started again in January, 1982, at which time we agreed that Transcontinental would supervise the manufacture, and the egis would be the CCAR and UAHC (per our Executive Board, April, 1982). In October, 1982, the project became joint with CCAR, UAHC and ACC, and we all agreed that all production and distribution would be by Transcontinental Music. By June, 1983 we had paid \$24,000 to Cantor Davidson, \$2,000 more than I estimated off the top of my head when meeting on April 23, 1985 with the "Executive Board" of Transcontinental Music (minutes enclosed).

That meeting, in April, 1985, was the most recent held on this subject, and many of the estimates herein are very raw. Now that we are moving towards final production, I am fairly certain that Judy Tischler and Stuart Bennick should be able to come up with much more nearly exact production costs, based on which we ought to be able to set our pricing and discount policies. For us, this would have the added benefit of enabling inclusion of this work in our 1987 Publications Catalogue, which goes out in January. Incidentally, although it is listed as "forthcoming" in our current Catalogue, we are already getting inquiries and back orders.



In our suburban community, annual Season Concerts are given in the local high school at Christmas and Easter. These concerts, given by our local children, are attended by overflow audiences.

A few years ago, I suggested to the music director/ organizer "equal time" for Chanukah and Passover music. The replies I got were -- "we would love to. But we have searched for, and cannot locate published music arrangements for chorus/choir. If they were available, we would gladly include Jewish music". This problem was confirmed by our temple's music director.

I can well recall my childhood in the Brooklyn public schools when assimilation got off to a flying start as we learned and sang songs from diverse cultures - Italian, Irish, German, French, English, etc. But nothing that was Jewish.

We sang Christmas carols and hymns - but nothing from Chanukah or any part of Judaism.

We children recognized the situation, resented the uneveness, and could say nothing. And this was in a school that was 85% Jewish.

Ironic. Infuriating.

Do we now have, or can we quickly produce such a very significant aspect of our people? I, and others, would love to hear dear, familiar words and melodies. Too many have become estranged and remote. Curl the community ought to know

more about us.

This is to summarize the major points of our conversation on Thursday afternoon, June 10, 1976.

(1) It is the intention of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations to continue the operation of Transcontinental Music Publications, under its own name, and to help it flourish as the only existing Jewish music publishing company in North America.

(2) You will remain for a period of up to 12 months with Transcontinental to insure the safe and easy transition from your personal ownership to its new role as part of the service of the Union to the Jewish community. You will have the option, if you see that the transition is completed earlier than one year's time, to leave active participation in the operation of Transcontinental.

(3) In consideration of your services, the Union will compensate you in the sum of \$800.00 per month.

(4) Transcontinental will commission new compositions in memory of your late husband, Josef Freudenthal, if possible, annually.

I have just talked to Matt Ross to review with him the procedures he wants us to follow with respect to the gift of Transcontinental.

(1) Mrs. Freudenthal will be signing the instrument some time in the next week. The contract, which is attached, calls for the gift to be effective May 1.

(2) For the interim, Transcontinental will operate as before, with Mrs. Freudenthal on the payroll and controlling her accounts.

(3) On May 31, she should give us a statement of her expenditures, including the salary she pays to herself, and the income. The balance, presumably on the income side, will be paid to us by check.

(4) After she signs the instrument of gift, she will give us a list of her obligations which Matt tells me are limited to royalties payable. She also has a list of royalities receivable which will also be given to us at the same time.

(5) At his earliest convenience, Fred Cohen will meet with her accountant who, by the way, works for Loeb and Troper and does the Transcontinental account moonlighting, to determine what future steps should be taken with respect to moving the business inventory and the like.

(6) Fred tells me that Joe Lowenstein of Loeb and Troper believes that the inventory is undervalued at \$11,000. I am not in a position to evaluate that statement.

(7) Mrs. Freudenthal will remain with Transcontinental for the next several months until we are able to absorb the business and make a careful determination as to how it can function most effectively. The publishing board will meet some time in the next 90 days to evaluate the business, its purposes and the like. Hopefully by then Fred will have some kind of a handle on the finances to serve as input for the publishing board and for us to make a determination of our future course. AGREEMENT made in the City and State of New York this 1st day of May, 1976, by and between MARI FREUDENTHAL, residing at 201 West 89th Street, New York, New York (Donor) and UNION OF AMERICAN HEBREW CONGREGATIONS, an Ohio corporation qualified to do business in the State of New York, with its principal office at 838 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York (UAHC).

WHEREAS, Donor is the owner of a certain publishing business of Jewish liturgical music operated under the name Transcontinental Music Publications, at 1674 Broadway, New York, New York, and

WHEREAS, Donor wishes to donate said business to UAHC, and

WHEREAS, UAHC is willing to accept such gift.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, it is mutually agreed as follows:

1. Donor hereby assigns and transfers to UAHC all of her right, title and interest in and to the business of Transcontinental Music Publications, together with the good will and trade name thereof including, but not limited to, furniture, fixtures, equipment, sheet and other music inventory, catalogues, copyrights, royalty agreements (expressly excluding, however, cash and accounts receivable).

2. UAHC hereby assumes the obligations of Donor for payment of royalties to composers under royalty agree-

ments or arrangements which accrue on or after May 1, 1976.

3. UAHC hereby accepts said property as a gift.

4. UAHC intends to:

(a) Continue to operate said business under the said name and subject to the present existing policies with respect to the publication of Jewish liturgical music.

(b) Create an Advisory Committee for the purpose of advising UAHC regarding matters of publication; invite to serve as members of such committee representatives of the Conservative, Reform and Orthodox Movement, and include on such committee insofar as is possible, at least three prominent composers and a cantor from each of the said three denominations.

(c) Hold competitions for the publication of Jewish Liturgical music or commission liturgical composers with a view toward encouraging young composers.

5. Donor agrees to execute bills of sale and other documents of transfer as may be necessary to complete the terms of this Agreement, including assignment of copyrights and royalty agreements.
