MEMORANDUM

As soon as the Jewish community of Los Angeles learned that Dr. Avraham Biran would soon arrive here as the newly appointed Consul General of Israel for the eleven Western States, leaders of the Jewish Community Council and the American Zionist Council decided to sponsor a community-wide welcome and reception for him. The date for this event was fixed for Thursday, March 3rd, and cleared with Moshe Alon, the Acting Consul of Israel in Los Angeles.

In the meantime, we learned that the Israel Bond Organization had scheduled for March 13th a dinner reception in honor of Dr. Biran for the purpose of solicitation of bond purchases. This date had been cleared not with Mr. Alon, but directly with Dr. Biran in Israel by Mr. Henry Montor in New York. We also learned that when apprized of this situation, Mr. Alon made strong representations to the Israel Government authorities, pointing out that it would make for bad public relations in the Jewish community if Dr. Biran were to speak on behalf of the Israel Bond Drive so shortly after his arrival and at the height of the Jewish Welfare Fund Campaign in Los Angeles.

These representations were to no avail. On the contrary, last week Mr. Alon received instructions from the Israel Embassy in Washington to withdraw his approval and clearance from the community reception set for March 3rd and to request that this event, as well as any other event in honor of Dr. Biran taking place prior to March 13th be cancelled immediately.

We are now faced with the situation that Dr. Biran's first public appearance as Israel Consul General in Los Angeles will be at the Bond Solicitation Dinner on March 13th, a fact which has already aroused a great deal of uneasiness in Welfare Fund and UJA circles in Los Angeles, as well as with all those who are concerned with Israel's public relations problems.



UN Stand On Israel Hit As Unjust

Arabs Aggressors, Resident of Border Area Charges Here

A former British army officer who has lived amidst growing border tension for four years expressed angry criticism here yesterday of a recent United Nations condemnation of his country, Israel, for "brutal aggressions" in the Gaza strip of Palestine.

S. Robert Abrahami took the Israell-Egyptian armistice commission to task for blaming Israel without fully considering that "if we killed 38 Arabs, the same number of Jews was killed before then"

Assails Arming of Egypt

"It is always Israel that is called the aggressor, never the Arab states," he declared. "The Egyptians continue to flout international law right in your faces, and still you go on arming them."

ing them.

Mr. Abrahami, here in behalf of the Israel bond sale, describes himself as the "most qualified man in the United States at this moment to comment on this current situation."

He left the British army to join Haganah, Israel's army, and became a citizen of the new nation. Four years ago he founded and was the first resident of the village of Ashkelon, four miles from the Gaza border.

There he is general manager of the Israeli government's Yuval-Gad, world's largest producer of pre-stressed concrete-and-steel irrigation pipe. It is this plant that is supplying all the pipe for construction of the vast system of irrigating the arid Negev.

arid Negev.

So far, 110 miles of pipeline has been laid, and part of the land has been reclaimed. Peanuts and gladfoll are grown there with sufficient success to be exported in large quantities. A thousand miles of pipeline work remains to be done.

"Two or three times a week

"Two or three times a week our pipelines are blown up," Mr. Abrahami said. "This is not the work of poor Arah refugees. It is a military maneuver. It is apparent that professional saboteurs are employed."

Just before he left Israel for this country, he said, two of his factory workers were killed in a raid. A delegation representing 1,000 plant employes "came to me to lead them to make a reprisal. They were in a very ugly mood."

Blames Oil Interests

"I told them I had signed a contract with the army. The army was not to make pipe; I was not to fight Arabs. The Israel army is perfectly competent, able and even willing to repel any attacks at our border and the Arabs know it."

Mr. Abrahami blamed certain oil interests for olping to perpetuate Arab leaders "who wallow in luxury, while the Arab people wallow in filth, ignorance and disease."

He said the United Nations attitude seems to be that "we Jews should not be militant—that we are supposed to go to a synagogue and pray, but not fight." Angrily he added:

"For 2,000 years, the Jews have been spat upon, pushed about from place to place, shot at and trampled on. We in Israel do not intend to let that happen again.

"I can promise you that for every Jew that is shot, an Arab will be shot."

— Egypt, Saudi Arabia and
Syria counted today on the condemnation of Israel for "brutal aggression" to help swing stillhesitant Jordan and Lebanon into their pact against the Jewish nation.

The United Nations Mixed Armistice Commission blamed Israel in a stormy session yesterday for last Monday's prearranged and planned attack" against an Egyptian outpost which cost 42 Egyptian and eight Israeli lives.

At about the same time Egypt, Saudi Arabia and Syria announced in a joint communique they had agreed to form a unified command for their armed forces to repel any attack on any one of them.

The man still buried in the excavation was not identified immediately.

clared:

"Because the Egyptians and Araba realize our army is so determined to defend every blade of grass and every grain of sand in Israel, I doubt that there will be a shooting war in spite of all these border incidents."

"The United Nations com-

plained about Egypt violating every international precept when it seized the Suez Canal, yet nobody charged Egypt with being an aggressor. Israel is the only true democracy in the East, and the only thing we threaten is the feudal way of life of the Arabian millionaires who make the Rockefellers look like paupers."
He said that the United

"instead of coddling these bloody degenerates should make them sit down at a conference to talk peace, open up the Suez Canal and allow the Arabs to be shown a democra-tic way of life. It is the only solution to the problems of the Middle East," Abrahami fumed:

"How long are we expected to follow a policy of restraint while our people are being shot in the back? Just before I came to America last December, two of my plant workers were murdered. For

every Jew who gets shot, an Arab will be shot, too." Abrahami conferred this afternoon with Mayor Lawrence whom he met last year in Israel, and he also addressed the Women's Division of Bonds for Israel in Webster Hall.



HAVE a long letter from Hen-ry Montor in answer to my editorial on his challenge to the U. S. Jewish community on the sale of bonds. The letter is so long that I don't know what to do with it. Yet what is discussed is of real importance to the Jewish community, not alone that part of it concerned with fund-raising or bond-selling. So I'm going to usurp the necessary space to print it in entirety.

One more point: the more discussion and comment on the make-up and direction and obligations of our Jewish community, the more helpful it will be.

DEAR MR. COHEN:

This may be your first letter-tothe-editor from Rome, where I am now engaged in discussions with the Italian Government for the possible licensing of the sale of State of Israel Bonds in Italy. Your Jan, 28 Issue publishes an editorial dealing with Bonds which I would like to analyze. Your own continuously sympathetic and helpful attitude toward Israel Bonds requires that I deal with the questions you raise in the same calm spirit in which you propose them.

The alleged conflict between various financial activities competing for public attention should be seen in some historic perspec-

For about a generation now. the Jewish Welfare Funds of America have regarded themselves, and have been, the central instrument of their respective communities for the raising of philanthropic monies. In a few communities, Welfare Funds had a natural origin, based on the view that maximum effort of manpower and maximum respons of money could be obtained if one central collection agency were established. But in a majority of the communities, the growth of the Welfare Fund was directly attributable to the activities of the Joint Distribution Committee and the United Palestine Appeal. The growing needs of both these vital institutions and the rising competition between them, as their requirements increased, reflected themselves in local tensions. Advocates of both causes decided it would be for their mutual advantage if a combined campaign

were conducted. This happened in many communities, where the title of United Jewish Appeal, Combined Jewish Appeal or Welfare Fund was adopted. Anyone who cares to examine the constitutional structure of the Philadelphia Allied Jewish Appeal, for example, will discover that the original officers were to be named equally by the JDC and UPA. The basic and, in some instances only, purpose of many of these mergers was to raise funds for the JDC and UPA.

AS TIME went on, pressures increased in each community for the inclusion of other causes, Yielding to these pressures seemed more scientific fund-raising but it also eased group and personal relationships. A generation or even a decade ago, many Wel. fare Funds gave anywhere up to 90 per cent of their total net recelpts to the national United Jewish Appeal (the name which the JDC and UPA first took on formally in 1935 for a two-year interval and re-created, permanently, in 1939).

Today, an entirely different pleture exists. Most communities publish annual reports of Welfare Fund operations. It may require accounting experience to read some of them accurately. The ratio of funds now distributed to the United Jewish Appeal differs sharply from that of the past. One community gives 40 per cent of its income to the United Jewish Appeal, Emphasis is not placed on the fact, however, that this ratio applies to a net, from which the cost of raising the funds and administering the community structure and the allowance for shrinkage in collections are deducted. There is a wide range between cities in allocations to the United Jewish Appeal. It would be fascinating to see a certified account of the dollar that is raised and that goes to the United Jewish Appeal.

When we speak of the United Jewish Appeal today, we are speaking of an instrument devoted in largest measure to the requirements of Israel, for even the Joint Distribution Committee does the largest part of its work in Israel and, as everyone knows, does it magnificently.

THE PURPOSE of this seemingly irrelevant historic background is to judge the financial needs of Israel today.

Why is it that the officers of the State of Israel Bond Organization in the United States (and elsewhere) are pressing for continuous efforts to sell Israel Bonds? Why do they take the position that there is no conflict whatsoever, either in objectives or in activities, between Israel Bonds and United Jewish Appeal, on the one hand, or Israel Bonds and Welfare Funds, on the other?

The American Jewish community has rendered-and continues to render-extraordinary service to Israel but there is sometimes a tendency to confuse present activities with the cumulative total of achievements.

What goes on in some minds is reflected in the February issue of Mademoiselle Magazine, which publishes an article on travel in Israel by Mary Parker. One paragraph in that article says Israel is being supported by the United States Government, through grants and loans, estimated at some \$385 million, through United Jewish Appeal, reported at \$435 million, through Israel Bonds, listed at \$161 million. It concludes with the statement that of German reparations of \$812 million due to Israel, about \$700 million has already been paid. And that, says the reporter, explains

why the Arabs are so angry at the United States.

IT IS THIS same type of muddy thinking which animates much of the comment on Israel's current financial affairs. It did good in 1949 when the Export-Import Bank loaned Israel \$100 million, but why create the impression that this is an annual entry in Israel's account hooks? It is true that the United Jewish Appeal was given \$148 million by the American Jewish community in 1948, but is it not more to the point that in 1954, that contribution was down to \$48 million. In 1952 there was a \$72 million grant-in-aid, but in 1954-55, the figure has not yet actually been announced, although there have been rumors of a 340 million grant, of which half may be an outright grant and the other half a long-term loan.

Publicity men render a fine social purpose in clarifying their work to the public but, occasionally, to overcome the blase attitude of editors, they try to create attractive figure patterns to get into the papers. Thus, it is not enough to report what an organization has raised in the particular year. There must be a figure of what that particular organization raised in the last five, ten or even twenty-five years, depending on how jaded the publicity man thinks the editor is. Or else a "new blueprint" is devised, which shows that in the next two or five or twenty years, Israel or some other activity will require \$1 billion or some similarly enticing sum, which might justify a half-column story. The general public (the Jewish public, that is) is left with the impression that a sea of money surrounds Israel (for example) and not a blockaded sea. What DOES Israel do with ALL that money: is the inevitable, cynical reaction of the Jewish public.

The Arabs know better. They keep accurate account of UJA income, Bond income, grant-in-aid income for Israel. That is why their advisers keep saying to impatient war-mongers: "Be calm. The flow of money is going steadily downward, regardless of the publicity stories. Israel will be at our mercy without our having to waste a single bullet."

THERE ARE certain premises which must be taken into account for any serious analysis of your editorial.

(1) The philanthropic income for Israel from the United States

has gone down to a shocking extent. This is true both on the quantitative and qualitative levels. The total philanthropic money for Israel in 1955 will be less than one-third of what it was in 1948. At the very same time, the savings and the income of the American Jewish community have more than doubled in the interim.

(2) Philanthropic contributions in the United States are deductible from taxes, from 20 to 30 per cent of the gross income, depending on whether it is general or religious and educational philanthropy. Every contribution to a Welfare Fund (and to the United Jewish Appeal) is deductible from income taxes. Purchases of State of Israel Bonds by individuals must come from their own income and are not tax-deductible. (3) In 1955, the State of Israel is entering its seventh birthday. It does so with enormous strength, in the agricultural, industrial and military areas. But it represents an economy closely approaching the 2 million population figure. It must create and expand its productive facilities. It must have more and better factories, more electric power, more irrigation. It must increase its agricultural production in order to cut down on its imports.

Who is to supply this money? A large part of it is coming from the Israelis themselves. But their ability to maintain and enlarge their productive plant is being unnecessarily curtailed by the vast amounts that must go into maintenance of adequate armaments (for which both the Arabs and the Western powers may jointly examine their consciences). The economy of Israel is also being strengthened by reparations from Germany. It is truly ironic that not much more is coming from all the LIVING Jews of the world than is being bequeathed in annual installments to Israel by the millions of dead Jews.

IT SEEMS continuously forgotten as to why the Prime Minister of Israel projected a Bond Issue in September, 1950. In the first place, it was becoming clear even then that there was a steady, downward trend in philanthropic contributions (unjustified though that was and is). It was essential, therefore, for Israel to find other channels of money, even to the extent of borrowing on a large scale. In the second place, the Prime Minister emphasized that the existence of a self-respecting nation required that it should not be pauperized and

that it should learn to guard the expenditure of every penny because the money was its own.

There is NO central organism of American Jewry which plans the activities of the American Jewish community. Some say this is good; some declare it evil. The fact remains. The Welfare Fund raises money solely for philanthropic purposes. Its effectiveness even in this field requires the most thorough-going re-examination instead of the unctuous self-esteem in which so many now anoint themselves. But the Welfare Fund is NOT the custodian, either by choice or capacity, for ALL fund-raising programs in the American Jewish community.

It does not raise money for synagogues and rarely for Jewish community centers, hospitals, old aged homes and other social service enterprises. With respect to Israel Bonds, the Welfare Funds hastened to say, from the very beginning of that enterprise: Bonds are not our business; we are exclusively concerned with philanthropic money. Out of that arose the cute semantic term of "free" money. With the same twist of semantics, it could easily be pointed out that the ONLY money which the State of Israel has as its own, "free" disposal is the income from Israel Bonds,

But what Israel needs today is not a competitive exercise in se mantics but an honest study of the sources and extent of its income in the United States, where some 6 million Jews have their comfortable residence—the overwhelming majority of them having a profound concern with the fate of Israel, if only people will talk sense and facts to them, instead of dishing out the old coffee grounds.

A WELFARE FUND pledge is made once each year, in anticipation of the income of an individual in that particular year, taking into account the relevance of that pledge to the tax deduction one may take in his annual tax report. If a large income is anticipated, a large pledge may be made—if the individual is properly generous. If a weak year is anticipated, the pledge suffers,

A purchase of an Israel Bond has no relationship whatever to that type of reasoning. A purchase may take place in January or May or December. A mortgage may be paid up; another bond or security may mature; a windfall may occur in another area of one's financial activities. Or one may convert a small or large part of a savings account or other liquid asset to such a purchase. The current income has no bearing on the decision to purchase a Bond, except for certain psychological effects. That is why the Israel Bond organization points out that Bonds must be offered for sale throughout the year, since the purchase is subject to an individual's financial status currently and not on a projected income basis.

There is another reason why the Israel Bond organization suggests that Bonds should be continuously available for sale: the paucity of manpower in some cases requires a stretched-out effort. If all responsible, voluntary leadership recognized the indispensable importance of Israel Bonds to Israel's economy, then a concentrated, community-wide effort by them could achieve an effective result in a much briefer period of time. In many communities, however, a small band of infinitely devoted men and women-not always the most affluent or 'socially significant'-give of their time, energy and resources with truly consecrated spirit. Because of the smallness of their numbers, it takes much longer for them to do an adequate job. Even then, they cannot begin to cover the community. That is a tragic loss, considering how many Jews in every community would like to purchase Israel Bonds if they could be approached and considering the good uses to which Israel needs to put this money.

LET'S BE SPECIFIC, for illustrative purposes. Cleveland, O. has between 90,000 and 100,000 Jews. It is a community which prides itself, properly, on its long pro-Israel history and its distinguished Zionist leadership. Its Welfare Fund does one of the very best jobs in the nation. Yet, in the year 1954, this vast Jewish community-one of the very wealthiest in the nation-provided only 1.437 purchasers of State of Israel Bonds. Perhaps it might be said: well, subdue all Israel Bond activity in one part of the year and then, in the other half, there will be united activity to make up for the losses. In the spring of 1954, for example, the total income-for six months (of LOANS, not gifts)-was about \$200,000. In deference to the Welfare Fund, there was the proverbial quiet of the tomb. But in the last six months of the year, what happened to that proferred, pledged, promised community aid? The income in the latter half was exactly \$387,250! Remember, this is not money contributed, but money loaned-interest being paid at the rate of 4 per cent per annum, and the principal subject to redemption in United States dollars. What price not operating in the spring months! What price eliminating

all activity during Welfare Fund time! What price love of Israel!

Your editorial of Jan. 28 raised some mighty interesting questions. My suggestion for continuous Israel Bond sales was NOT a strategic move, but one based on four years of experience and one prompted by the desire to enable American Jewry to meet its self-imposed wish to strengthen Israel's economy.

Writing to you in the city where one walks under the Arch of Titus from time to time, one is tempted to become solemn and to remember how once long ago, a Jewish State suffered from the inability of its leaders to realize what makes a State strong.
