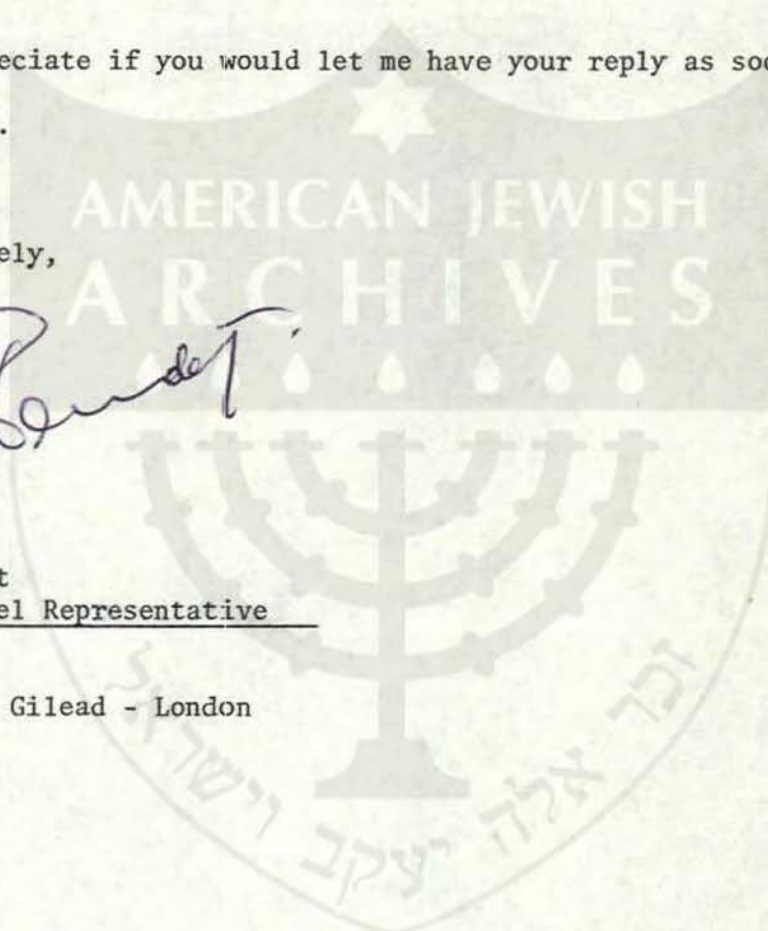

You will have heard that I did, in fact, decide to continue with my responsibility in the J.I.A. I just felt that I could not duck out and it would have been irresponsible of me to leave at a time when I had insufficient time to train my successor. Firstly, let me welcome you here as a working member of the J.I.A.

On Monday 28th January, we have arranged for you to address a meeting with the Chigwell J.I.A. Committee, recently formed during the October War, and consisting of young people in their thirties - a good basis for young leadership.

These people came forward in order to help Israel, and we succeeded in organising them as a committee. The area itself is in the East of London, a well-to-do area, and this committee has managed to collect all the outstanding monies that were pledged. The Chairman, Mr. Paul Balcombe (34) is also the Chairman of the J.N.F. Executive, and he was the leading figure in the area.

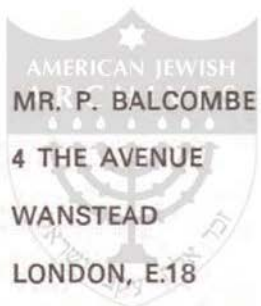

Wounded commando describes one of Sharon's missions KAETZELE'S PRIVATE WAR

BEILINSON HOSPITAL. — "My name is Ya'acov Katz, but everybody calls me Kaetzele," the youngster said. His bed had been moved next to the window of a plastic surgery ward, overlooking the lawns and tall green trees below. This is as close as he is going to get to the outdoors for many months.

"I intend to get well," Kaetzele says. "Not only that — I'm going to save this game leg of mine so they'll take me back into my old unit. I owe it to my friends who didn't make it. I made a pledge."

The pledge means a lot to 22-year-old Ya'acov. More than to most.

Ya'acov, a Yeshiva student from Bnei Brak, was on his pre-discharge leave when the October 6 war broke out. Before that he had been a deputy company commander with the rank of Lieutenant in one of the elite reconnaissance units attached to the Southern Command.

"I was getting ready to drive to Jerusalem that Friday, the eve of Yom Kippur. I wanted to spend the holiday praying in Yeshivat Harav Kook, where my brother is studying. Only a few hours before my departure I received a phone call, ordering me back to my unit."

"I had already signed out of my unit, turned in all my equipment. I had planned to study at the Yeshiva. No, I don't think I'm cut out to be a Rabbi. But I wanted to gather some values before making up my mind. Maybe I'll teach delinquent youth, or join a moshav. Do something worthwhile, you know."

He continued, "When I showed up at the camp they still had my equipment. It was all there, waiting for me. My Kalachnikov rifle and all the rest of my stuff."

"We still didn't know what was going on. But I had a feeling this was going to be a war of *mitsva* (religious duty) and that it would release me, partially, from many of the holy day's restrictions. I prayed in the vehicle that carried us southwards the following day, the Day of

Atonement. We rejoined our battalion. I fasted, although I learned later that I shouldn't have, under the circumstances.

"We were hoping that the fighting would be a local thing and that we'd soon be returning home."

"But about two o'clock that day — Saturday — all hell broke loose. The skies were filled with Egyptian planes, swooping down at us from all directions. A camp behind us became one blazing inferno. We could hear the sound of artillery fire from across the Canal, although we were beyond its reach, and we prepared to defend our installations in the area. Each time the Egyptian planes came over I would jump into a half-track and open fire at them with a swivel-mounted machine-gun. I didn't hit any of their planes. But at least I fired back."

"I don't know what prevented them (the Egyptians) from overrunning our lines at that stage. There were pitifully few Israeli tanks, but they fought back, contesting every inch of ground. But the Egyptians could have advanced."

"Sunday Arik Sharon (a divisional commander) came down to join us. There were a number of us, myself included, who didn't have any clearly defined tasks. There weren't enough troops for us all to command, so I rounded up a small number of officers — nine of them, including two lieutenant colonels, former battalion commanders. We also 'borrowed' a half-track and a couple of jeeps and organized ourselves into a special task force."

"We spent the first few days roaming around near the Egyp-

tian lines, picking up their artillery spotters and Egyptian pilots who had bailed out and were trying to regain their positions. We captured four of them — some high-ranking officers, including one full colonel and a major. The other two were captains."

"It was all sand dunes. From time to time we found ourselves sandwiched in between the two armies, and we were often under artillery fire. But we were an agile unit and always managed to evade them in good time. We filed reports on Egyptian spearheads. We reported directly to Arik."

"Six of us were in the half-track," Ya'acov continued. "Three more were piled in the jeep."

"Most of our encounters were minor — rounding up Egyptian commando units and stuff like that. But my last battle was more serious."

"It occurred on Sunday, the following week. We were alerted about four o'clock in the morning. They said a sizable unit of Egyptian commandos had landed somewhere behind the Israeli lines. The nine of us went out to find them."

"They were supposed to have landed somewhere near the line where the tanks of the two armies were slugging it out. Well, we found them all right. About 6 a.m. 60 or 70 of them, well dug in. We called in a couple of tanks to support us with their guns. Then we charged — the nine of us, in two jeeps and my half-track. But they scored with a bazooka. A bull's eye, killing the driver and another man."

"Me — I was lucky. They say it doesn't pay to stick one's neck out,

but in my case I suppose it did. I was standing up, exposed, firing my machinegun. If I hadn't been, that missile would have gone right through me. As it was, it hit me in the thigh.

"Are you squeamish? See? They can't even put a bandage on it yet, and the bone is still broken. It isn't even all there. But they'll put in a piece of metal or something..."

(I looked under the open-ended canopy that covered Kaetzle's lower body. Where his left hip should have been there was a deep pit.)

"It's ever so much better now," he assured me. "They are already doing skin grafts."

"Well, I knew I'd had it. But I still had enough strength to pull myself up towards the edge of the half-track and roll off it. I groped for my personal bandage, but it was gone, along with most of my hip. I knew I had to stop the blood, so I put my fist right inside the wound. I could feel the smashed bones with my fingers."

"The boys couldn't help me. There were only six of them left. The driver, a second lieutenant, got it in the head. He was gone, instantly. The other guy, behind me, was also dead. And I was out of action. So the remaining six had to keep on doing what they were doing. I don't think many of those Egyptians got away. My unit mopped them up. But two more were wounded. There were only four of them left."

"They came over to me. Later they told me that after taking one look at my leg they decided I wouldn't live more than five minutes. Since the area was still under fire, they couldn't call in a helicopter. So they bound me to a tank and got me back to an evacuation point."

MEDICAL FREAK

"Yeah — they think I'm a medical freak around here. I kept on losing more blood than they could pump into me. It took over 20 pints of blood to bring me round. The professor says I was dead for all intents and purposes by the time I got here. It wasn't a question of whether or not they should amputate my leg — but of whether I would last a few more minutes."

"Thank God I am recovering. What annoys me is that they lowered my health profile to 24 — from 97. But I'll show them, I don't want a duty-free car. I don't intend to become an invalid. I've seen officers fight with artificial legs. Praise God, I've kept my two legs and I intend to use them again — in the army."

Kaetzle explains that he is now the only survivor of a group of three friends who volunteered for the reconnaissance unit. "We all went to the same school (Kfar Haroeh) and graduated together. One of them had intended to go to a yeshiva after completing his army service. But he changed his mind during the war. He told me just before he died that since so many officers had been killed, it was up to him to contribute his personal bit to plug the gap. Since he was killed I intend, if I can, to fill in for him."

Yaacov Katz—a handsome youngster with deep-set, dark blue eyes — is the unchallenged favourite of the ward. He has been lying immobile for weeks now on his back. He has no complaints, and only one wish — could I bring him a cassette recording of "My Fair Lady?"

I said I would.

"But be sure you don't bring it on Saturday — I wouldn't want you to violate the Sabbath."

I promised I wouldn't, that I would bring it on Sunday.

1. This Report is the first attempt to evaluate the results obtained and recorded in the last 12 weeks.
2. These figures were supplied by the Directors and Organisers of the Divisions - being the result of their manual recording, and are not final.
3. The computer is taking on this data and will, in due course, give us final figures, separating the Middle Range from Grass Root in the following categories :

4. To speed up and streamline this operation, the Computer Advisory Committee was reorganised and a Computer Expert is in process of being appointed as J.I.A. Communication Manager.
5. The Report reveals the overriding importance and strength, Fundraising wise and community involvement wise, of the London Districts and Provincial Division in the Middle Range and Grass Roots.
6. This year, due to the fact that the £5,000 and over contributors have been dealt with, our Divisions now have time to find new contributors among the 65,000 names recorded to date in the Middle Range and Grass Root levels. We have now 3 to 6 months to turn the quantity contributors into quality contributors.
7. There is a strong case to start a mass campaign, telephone canvass and even postal campaign for the 30% to 40% of the community who have not yet given. We now have the lists. Let us now do a thorough, indepth approach to every Jewish household in the United Kingdom. This residue of contributors will obviously be mostly in small amounts. In spite of this,

in Brighton where such an operation started and still continues, there were some 100 successes out of the 1,000 approaches, ranging from £1. to £250. additional contributions.

8. Directors, Assistant Directors and Organisers are now being reallocated to obtain a more balanced distribution of manpower in the Divisions.
- 8b) The recruiting (and on the job training) of additional organisers is now energetically pursued. We requested the help of members of the C.E.C. a month ago to put forward names of suitable candidates, but to-date we have not had one single suggestion.

10. Conclusions

The total amount recorded - over £12,000,000 - to which
one can already add £500,000 pooled income of the J.N.F.

Dear Mr. Chairman,

Firstly may I wish you all success in your endeavours in 1974.

Now, with the holiday season over, the Campaign faces its major test keeping our committees mobilised for the task of bringing in the cash. I cannot repeat too often the urgent need for cash and stress that Israel's immigration and social welfare programmes require money not promises.

During 1974, we estimate that 80,000 to 100,000 immigrants will arrive in Israel, between 55,000 and 60,000 will come from the Soviet Union. This means some 20,000 family units needing an initial expenditure of £20,000 per family. One can, of course, cite other examples.

The dangers exist from within, as well as without, and one may foresee a period of complacency, with the Geneva Peace Talks entering a new stage following the elections in Israel. We must face the reality that until a peace agreement is signed the "war continues" and Israel's needs grow. The emergency is there and you, Mr. Chairman, must alert your committee to this fact.

The Honorary Officers and the C.E.C. will be meeting next week and their discussions will have added meaning since many of them have been in Israel over the holiday period. Which leads me, naturally, to missions. Our mission programme now extends into April and the request of our Deputy Chairman Trevor E. CHINN that all committees participate now takes on a more urgent character. Participation in a mission is the most positive way of sustaining the Campaign effort by your Committee.

NEWS FROM THE PROVINCIAL DIVISION

The Glasgow Mission led by Mark GOLDBERG leaves next week. There are some 40 participants including contingents from Brighton and Manchester.

The Joint Chairman of the Provincial Executive Committee Bernard ZISSMAN would like to hear from Committee Chairmen the names of prospective participants for the Provincial Division Mission he will lead early in February. Names to the Director for the Provinces S.W. GOLD at Rex House. The Mission leaves February 7th 1974.

Mr. Alan M I L L E T T accepted the Co-Chairmanship of the Provincial Division and both he and Mr. Bernard Z I S S M A N are now in the process of forming their Provincial Executive Committee which will be called to its first meeting soon.

Redeeming of pledges - seven Provincial Centres are "fully paid up". Congratulations to Belfast, Brighton, Fylde, Hull, Jersey, Newcastle and Southport. An example to us all.

Tribute to Israel Mission No. 3 under the joint leadership of Messrs. Stafford F E R T L E M A N of Finchley and David P O M S O N of Hendon returned on Tuesday to London. Mr. Michael R I C H M A N, Co-Ordinator of the Mission reported that the 45 members raised an additional £30,000 over and above their 1974 contributions.

Mr. J. Edward S I E F F our beloved President is recovering after the barbaric murderous attempt on his life. Our wishes for a full speedy recovery as well as our admiration for his courage and stamina. We associate ourselves with the hundreds of cables and telephone calls from Israel, America and all parts of the United Kingdom which have arrived at Rex House, expressing their deep felt concern to Mrs. J.E. S I E F F and the family.

Dear Mr. Chairman,

The editorial of last week's Jewish Chronicle commenting on the attempted murder of our much respected JIA President, Mr. J. Edward S I E F F said:

"It might be supposed that the aim of the would-be murderers was to frighten the Jewish community in this country out of its steadfast support of Israel and her just cause. If so they will be disappointed. The Jewish community's resolve to stand by Israel will only be strengthened."

As we enter 1974, we must renew our efforts on behalf of the current appeal. We have to realise that the Campaign has to be reactivated and we have a long way to go.

Our Divisions through their committees now have the time to find on their lists contributors who have not been approached in this Campaign. Obviously, these people must be canvassed. There will also be names amongst the 65,000 contributors who have pledged within the Middle Range and at the Grass Root level whose contribution may be such that you consider a selective recanvass necessary to bring their gift to a level related to the increased needs. We have between three and six months to turn the quantity contributors into quality contributors.

There is a strong case to plan your mass Campaign, telephone canvass or even a postal Campaign to reach for the 30% to 40% of the community who have not given to date. We have the lists and we must now undertake a thorough, careful approach to every Jewish household in the United Kingdom. Individually this residue will produce mainly small amounts, yet in Brighton where such an operation was begun and still continues there were 100 successes out of 1,000 individuals approached. The amounts secured ranged from £1 to £250. A worthwhile exercise.

COVENANTS - Chairmen and Keyworkers should, wherever possible, encourage contributors to enter into a covenant. In most cases covenant documents have been sent to all contributors who pledged to the '74 Campaign. I am sure we know the value of covenants which, under the present tax laws, can enhance our Campaign revenue by 40% over the next seven years. The number of covenants received now numbers about 6,000. A substantial increase of this figure depends on our workers in the field.

THE TRIBUTE TO ISRAEL MISSION NO. 4 returned to London on Tuesday. 40 participants took part under the combined leadership of Messrs. Walter L A N D A U of Hendon Reform, Charles M A R G O L I S of Wembley and Martin S H A W of the West London Synagogue. The Co-Ordinator of the Mission, Stephen H O R N E , reported that the delegates raised an additional £63,000 over and above their earlier contributions to the '74 Campaign.

THE TRIBUTE TO ISRAEL MISSIONS are by invitation only and are directed only to the categories of contributors and keyworkers as previously agreed. Under no circumstances should a mass circularised invitation be sent out. On the other hand we know that the best letter will hardly bring in participants and the approach should be made individually by the Chairman or his Committee members to the invitees as a follow-up to the letter.

The Campaign is now gathering momentum. I am able to report that a large number of meetings have taken place in all Divisions - I am mentioning only those held during the past two weeks :

W. Reform, Woolwich and Hampstead Garden Suburb.

TRADES - Office Equipment, Radio & Electrical, Printing, Paper & Packaging with Mendel K I N G as Guest Speaker, Antique & Art Dealers, Food Trade, Fruit Trade, Young Fruit Trade, Motor Trade, Diamond Trade and Fashion Trade.

PROFESSIONS - City & Finance, Bench & Bar, Property and Banking Group.

WOMENS DIVISION - West End, Hampstead Garden Suburb, Golders Green and Kensington.

YOUNG LEADERSHIP - Post Mission Reunion - fifty participants.

Information Meetings or Teach-Ins : Cockfosters & North Southgate Teach-In with Mendel K I N G, Stanmore - Information Meeting addressed by Mendel K I N G, N.W. Achdut - Information Meeting addressed by Matti G O L A N, Brighton, Abridge Golf Club and Polish Jewish Ex Servicemen.

The cash flow is continuing, despite the current economic situation. For the week ending 11 January 1974 there is again a six figure total. Committees joining the list of those fully paid up as of this week now include Chigwell, Cricklewood, Ealing, Edgware, Ex South Africans, Golders Green, Hammersmith, Highgate, Kenton, Kenwood, Palmers Green, Polish Ex Servicemen, West London and Willesden.

TRIBUTE TO ISRAEL MISSION NO. 5 returned to London on Tuesday. Fifty participants took part under the combined leadership of Messrs. Mark G O L D B E R G of Glasgow and Martin M E N D O Z A of the Shoe Trade. The Co-ordinator of the Mission, Alan F O X, reported that Delegates raised an additional £ 30,000 over and above their earlier contributions to the 1974 Campaign.

The efforts of Brighton, in planning a mass Campaign, was mentioned in my last Newsletter. A large number of committees in all Divisions are working with initiative and ingenuity in planning their own Campaigns. These case histories may be of value to you, Mr. Chairmen, and I shall deal with them over the next few weeks. My first subject is the Fashion Trade at work.

When the Yom Kippur War began, our Fashion Trade was a problem committee. On 7 October thirty leaders came forward to serve on a reorganised committee, under the Chairmanship of Ben R A V E N, assisted by Conrad M O R R I S and Alfred S I M O N S. A series of Appeal Meetings resulted in 350 contributions with a further 200 contributions secured by canvassing. In addition to the 550 donations, many members of the Industry contributed to their local committees in London and the Provinces.

As Ben R A V E N says. "We wanted to get our committee working and observe the principle of getting as many gifts as near to their assessment as possible. We can now call upon twenty to twenty-five canvassers to approach members of our Trade at any one time. Committee Meetings with an attendance of twenty to thirty members is the usual. My colleagues share with me the belief that the Mission Programme is of the utmost importance. We are now doing

- a selective recanvass of those contributors who pledged during the War and who have not been recanvassed.
- a personal approach to principal donors who have been assessed but not yet canvassed.
- a Cash Campaign by letter and telephone to donors for the redemption of their pledges."

A splendid example of leadership, dedication and involvement, worthwhile following.

The Assistant Director of the Trades Committees, Leon R O S E N reports that the leadership of the Trade were among the first to participate in Tribute to Israel Missions. This has resulted in the recruitment of new Committee members. A second Mission is planned next month to link up with the Tel Aviv Fashion Fair.

I have received a message from Sidney C O R O B, a member of the CEC, who has just returned from Israel and says that gifts for soldiers at the Front are still required. So Mission members travelling to Israel - perhaps you can take with you chess sets, backgammon sets, volley balls, transistor radios with mercury type batteries, jigsaw puzzles and footballs, woollen scarves and gloves, in parcels clearly marked for - VAAD LEMAAN HA'CHAYAL, (WELFARE FUND.)

The Israel Office of the British Zionist Federation continues to co-operate closely with the JIA Israel Office. All Missions meet with the Director, Eric L U C A S, who presents the case for Aliya and reviews the various possibilities that exist for British Olim, with particular reference to the help given to Settlers.

Ralph R U R K A, Director of the Israel Industries Advisory Company Ltd., addresses our Missions on Trade possibilities. Israel G A L - E D D, former Deputy Director General of the Israel Ministry of Development, deals with the economic front, and participants on our Missions are thus given an all round picture on the potential that exists in all these fields.

Mr. Michael M. S A C H E R introduced the Honorary Officers of the JIA to the new Israel Ambassador to the Court of St. James's, Gideon R A F A E L, at a meeting held at the Israel Embassy.

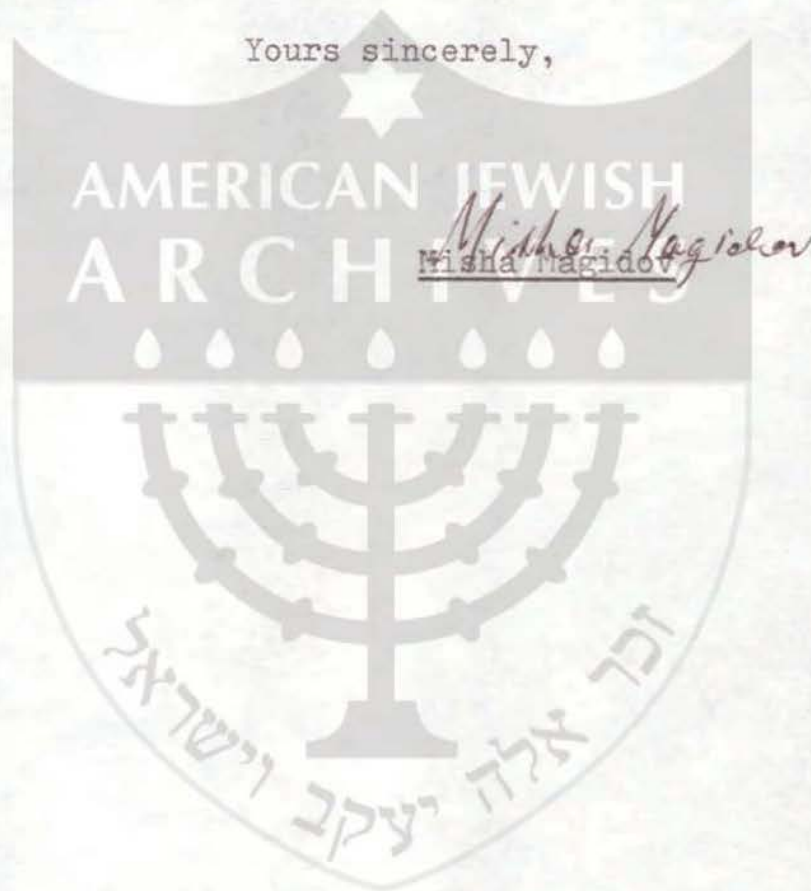

2. On average, each canvasser has four prospects.
3. Very important - on each card there is an assessment for the '75 contribution. Put this figure to your prospect in the first sentence you speak to him.
4. You have one JIA senior staff member attached to you who will help you to locate your prospect and act as a liaison between you and M. Barzilay and/or A. Klein. Take into account that each staff member is servicing two canvassers so if he does not locate you, try to locate him. You have been given a list of staff members and their canvassers.
5. Be near the entrance of the River Room during the Reception. As soon as you have seen your prospect, start canvassing. You have only 45 minutes Reception time. Those who you cannot canvass during the Reception, you will have to do during dinner, which is much more difficult.
6. Respect a strict discipline. Do approach only your prospects. Do not deal with or interfere with any other canvass. Work only according to the cards which you have been given, except if a colleague asks you for help.
7. In addition to the canvassing cards, you have been given pledge cards (T.E.C. to show physically a card) with the name of your clients on the envelope. After Golda has finished speaking and I start the Appeal ask your prospects to complete the cards, in their own handwriting, and be sure that he is putting on the card the amount you discussed with him. Give the completed cards to the JIA Senior Staff member attached to you. We have 125 prospects tonight for a total of £.4.00 assessment. The total in this category from the 31 donors is £6.1 m.

I don't want to mislead you. The 31 contributions in the Emergency totalled £13.3 instead of the £6.1 m. pledged this year, but in 1973 these same 31 donors gave only £3.7 m.



Biographical Resumé

Herbert A. Friedman

Herbert Friedman was born in New Haven, Connecticut, U.S.A. on September 25, 1918. His parents migrated to the United States from Vilna in the 1890's.

He graduated from Yale University with a B.A. in 1938. He attended Columbia University Graduate School of Business Administration during the Academic year of 1939-40. He graduated from the Jewish Institute of Religion with the degree of M.H.L. (Master of Hebrew Literature) and Rabbi, in January, 1944. This Rabbinical Seminary had been founded by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise as a bold attempt to create a harmonious understanding among students from orthodox and liberal backgrounds. The school was unique in that regard.

Friedman served Temple Emanuel of Colorado for one year; he served in the United States Army as a Chaplain for 2½ years; he returned to Denver and remained there until 1952.

During his army service which took place in Germany, Herbert Friedman was the Jewish Chaplain of the 9th Infantry Division and later of the Berlin Headquarters Command. He also served as assistant to the Advisor on Jewish Affairs to the General in command of the European Theater. During this same period he served the Hagana in the Alia Bet Program. He was subsequently decorated by the State of Israel for that Service.

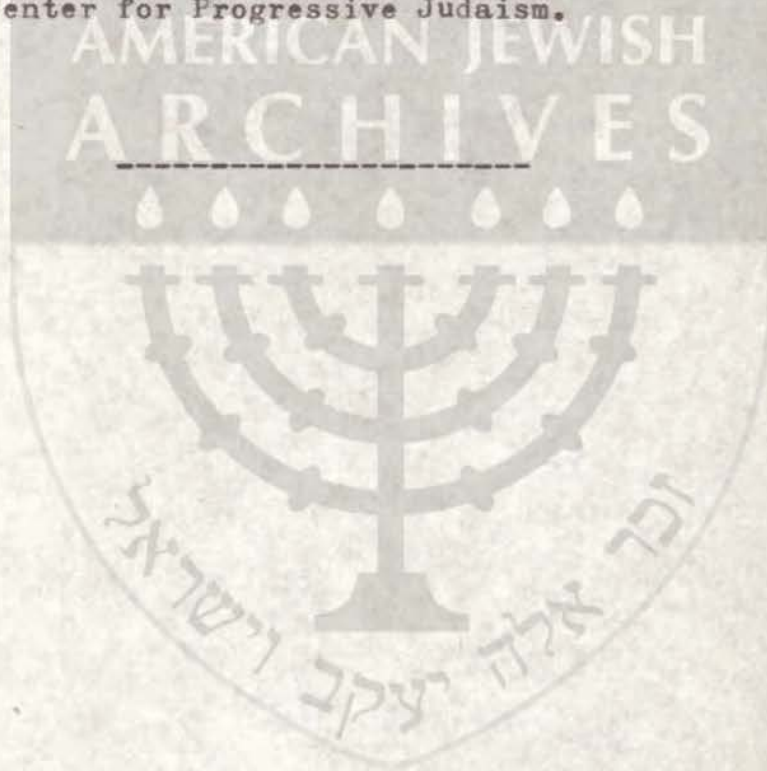
Upon return to the United States he was enlisted by the United Jewish Appeal as the Chairman of its Speakers Bureau and served for many years in that capacity, speaking in hundreds of communities throughout the United States.

In early 1952 he accepted the call to the Congregation Emanuel in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and remained there until summoned by the United Jewish Appeal in 1955, to be its Chief Executive Officer. He remained in that position almost 18 years, developing the policies and programs which were necessary to interpret Israel's needs to American Jewry.

In 1971 he migrated to Israel and lives in Jerusalem and Caesarea.

The settlement in Israel with his family represents the fulfilment of a lifetime of commitment to the survival of the Jewish people and the development of the Jewish state.

While continuing to serve the U.J.A., and speaking for the Keren Hayesod in other countries, he has assumed a new responsibility in Israel, namely the development of a liberal or progressive religious movement in Israel. He feels that this is necessary in order to add to the quality of Jewish life in the national homeland. He is currently serving as Director of Planning and Development for the World Education Center for Progressive Judaism.

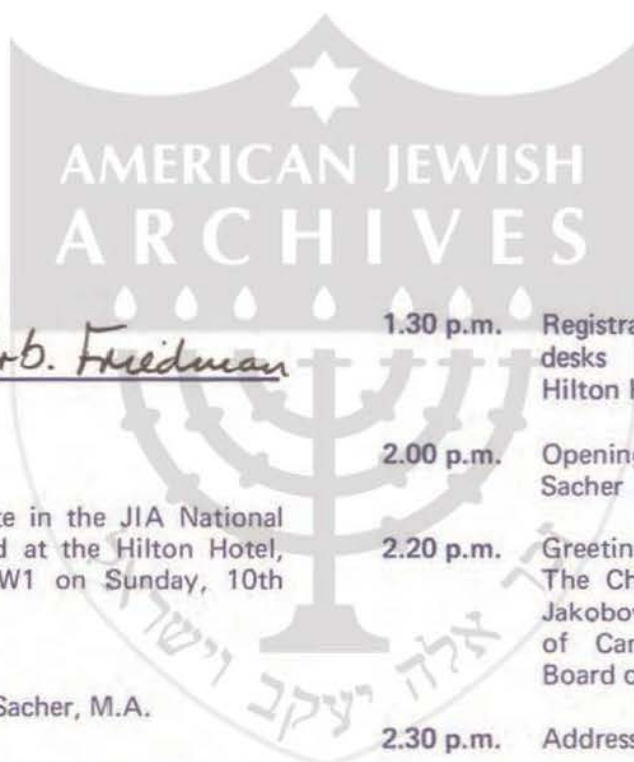

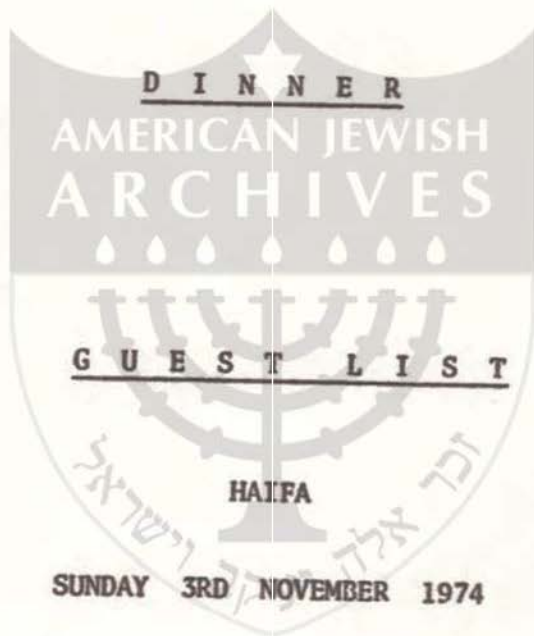
