Mr. David Ben Gurion Prime Minister of Israel Jerusalem, Israel Dear Mr. Ben Gurion: With a most successful UJA Annual National Conference for 1959 now behind us, and with our campaign for 1960 already getting off to an encouragingly early start, we of the UJA are presently trying to look shead with the necessary kind of foresight to 1961. As the prelude to that campaign, we will hold the twenty-third Annual National Conference on or about December 17th of 1960. I know you understand the significance of our annual conference as a traditional occasion for the leaders of the American Jewish communities to gather together for the purpose of rededicating themselves to our rause. It is most important that the Conference in 1960 be as fully effective as day held in the past. We strongly feel that the participation at that time of Mr. Abba Eban would assist in very large measure to achieve that result. I would like, therefore, formally to request that circumstances be arranged to permit Mr. Eban to come to the United States to address the Conference next December, and also to remain in this country for two or three weeks thereafter for the purpose of addressing fund-raising meetings in some key communities here. This would be of particular help and importance in view of the manner in which the fund-raising drives in an ever-growing number of communities are getting under way earlier. Thank you for your letter of February 16 enclosing copy of a letter addressed to Mr. Ben Gurion by Mr. Morris Berinstein in which he asks the Prime Minister to permit Mr. Eban to go to the United States for the National Annual Conference in December 1960. I do not recall having seen a copy of this letter before. In any case I have already started a discreet inquiry on the subject and I hope to be able to supply you with some information within a few days.

In one of his letters Dr. Berman mentioned March 8th or 9th as the date of his return to Israel. I know that they are trying to keep him there a little longer but I think he has made up his mind to be back by that date: I cannot say, of course, whether he is getting tired of England but I do know he feels he ought not to prolong his absence from his family any longer.

With regard to Mr. Sharett's short visit to the USA. I am now informed by Mr. Eshkol's office that he will be addressing two UJA meetings, namely one on March 1st and one on March 2nd. Obviously this is not all that Mr. Berinstein had in mind when he wrote to Mr. Levi Eshkol and I know it is not sufficient for your purposes, but on the other hand it is really the maximum that Mr. Sharett could do.

I was very happy to learn from your letter of February 10th about Ida Loew's success. May I say that this was exactly what I expected of her. She is a sincere and vital personality and possesses poise and self-assurance. I am sure she will be a real asset to your campaign.



SENT TO PRESIDENTS AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS

Dear Friend:

The 23rd Annual Conference of the United Jewish Appeal will be held at the Statler-Hilton Hotel in New York City on December 9th, 10th and 11th. Traditionally the most important function in the UJA's calendar, the Conference will have an additionally significant aspect this year which I want to call particularly to your attention.

The establishment of a national campaign goal for 1961, based upon the basic and realistic budgetary requirements of the constituent agencies of the UJA, will be the major item for consideration at the Conference. For several years, the UJA has not set a campaign goal but, instead, submitted to the community a statement showing the total needs of its agencies.

The formation of the new Board of the Jewish Agency for Israel, Inc., to exercise control over the spending of funds in Israel makes it incumbent upon the UJA to establish a goal and to realize it. This Board, consisting as it does of American Jewish leaders, will determine the particular activities and programs of immigration, absorption, resettlement, education and other philanthropic activities conducted by the Jewish Agency for Israel which should be supported -- as well as the extent of that support -- through funds raised by the United Jewish Appeal. The Board of the Jewish Agency and the Joint Distribution Committee are preparing careful budgets which will result in definite commitments. In performing their operations, the Board of the Jewish Agency and the JDC must look to the decisions and attitude taken by the leadership of American Jewry as represented at the UJA Annual National Conference.

In addition to deciding on the national campaign goal, this will involve establishing quotas for the drives in each and every community in the United States. These decisions in turn will inevitably relate to the overall goal for local, national and overseas needs in each community. The subjects of the national campaign goal and community quotas were intensively discussed at the last meeting of the officers of the UJA, and in view of their overriding importance a determination was made to refer these to the UJA Annual Conference for final decision. It will also be the function of the Conference to map out a campaign for the UJA in 1961 that will be proportionate to the great needs which must be met.

Within the Conference proper, the major decisions are made by the Steering Committee. From what I have already pointed out, I am sure you will agree it is especially vital this year that members of the Steering Committee be particularly representative of their communities. It would seem to us that

officers of your Federation and members of your Allocations Committee would be among those best suited to serve in this capacity, although by this we do not mean to suggest a hard and fast rule to you by which members should be designated. In any event, of course, the decisions of this Committee must command the respect of the entire Jewish community and, as such, can be expected to be implemented to the fullest extent only if the Committee is adequately representative of the individual communities throughout the country. For that reason, it is imperative that your community be well represented on this Committee.

The Conference will be addressed by New York State Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller; Israel Ambassador Avraham Harman; Leon Uris, author of "Exodus", Dr. Dov Joseph, the Treasurer of the Jewish Agency; Moses Leavitt, Executive Secretary of the JDC; and by others including most of the officers of the UJA. There will also be a report from the new Board of the Jewish Agency, and the budgets of the UJA's various constituent agencies will be presented in a manner high-lighting the vast human needs which these budgets represent.

Among these needs in Israel which will confront the UJA in 1961 are the consolidation of the 485 farm settlements, established since the beginning of the State, which are still not economically self-sufficient; the 40,000 who are still living under primitive conditions in the meabarot; the clearance of wretched city slum conditions; additional water in the Negev; the need to develop further the border areas; and, last but not least, all the problems entailed in the continuing immigration of some 25,000 to 30,000 a year. Furthermore, there are the vital programs of the JDC in North Africa, in Western Europe, in Poland and elsewhere to provide aid for the needy and to assist local Jewish communities to re-establish their institutions. The requirements of the JDC encompass indispensable operations in 25 countries.

Representation on the Steering Committee is according to the following formula:

If your community has a Jewish population up to 15,000, you may designate one delegate and one alternate to represent it on the Steering Committee. If your Jewish population is from 15,000 to 40,000, your community is entitled to two delegates and two alternates -- while those with Jewish populations in excess of 40,000 are entitled to three delegates and three alternates. These, together with 15 delegates from the Greater New York area, 12 delegates representing the 8 regions of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, 25 delegates representing the country at large, and the national officers of the UJA constitute the Conference Steering Committee.

Please act at once to designate your delegates and alternates. As soon as you notify us of their names, we shall send them their credentials as Steering Committee members.

I know from past experience that you will extend every cooperation in regard to advising us as soon as possible who will represent your community on the Steering Committee -- and I do hope that you can let us know you will attend the Conference.

It is meant for everyone who is concerned, in heart and soul, with this throbbing issue. Your participation certainly can be expected to contribute a great deal towards assuring that the wisest and most effective decisions will be forthcoming from the conference.

The report of the 1960 Study Mission which had an opportunity intimately to note the needs and requirements while abroad last month -- in Europe and Israel -- will be presented and will play an important role in the deliberations on the scope and shape of the 1961 campaign. In addition, the establishment of a national campaign goal will make necessary setting UJA quotas for inclusion in the drives in each and every community in the United States and this, of course, inevitably will relate to the overall goal for local, national and overseas needs in each community. As a practical matter, therefore, this Annual National Conference of the UJA will determine, on the basis of the budgets presented by UJA's constituent agencies, the financial commitment each community in the country must make to the UJA.

We are certain you will appreciate our strong feeling that your help and counsel will be exceedingly meaningful in making the decisions and in assuring that the conference is as thoroughly represented as it must be if its vital commitments are to be effectively implemented by the individual communities throughout the country. We urge you to attend.

Dear Chaverim and Chaverot:

From the daily press you have undoubtedly learned that the 23rd Annual Conference of the United Jewish Appeal will this year meet at the Statler-Hilton Hotel, in New York City, on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, December 9, 10 and 11.

As in previous years, the UJA Conference will manifest the greatest unified determination on the part of American Jewry to attain next year the maximum results in aid on behalf of the people of Israel and Jews the world over who may be in need. Delegates from hundreds of communities throughout the country, representing all shades and walks of Jewish life, are expected to attend.

The most urgent business before the Conference will be action on the report of the Seventh UJA Study Mission, a 125-person group, which has just returned from a three-week survey of Jewish needs in Europe and Israel. It seems that the progress Israel has made and is making, has blinded some American Jews to the fact that about one-third of the total immigrant influx since 1948, is still not completely absorbed, still not fully self-supporting, still lagging far behind. The picture is particularly disturbing when we realize that this unabsorbed group constitutes almost one-sixth of Israel's total Jewish population.

Then there is the problem of the continued immigration to Israel. There are no newspaper headlines, no figures, no names of ports of embarkation, no news when they disembark. But they come, almost daily - not in large numbers, not in tens of thousands - in small batches, but in the aggregate, at the end of the fiscal year, they constitute a substantial addition to the population. They, however, bring with them all of the problems that plague Israel absorption, integration, settlement, education and housing.



The 23rd Annual Conference of the United Jewish Appeal will be held Honorary Special Fund Chairman SAMUEL HUBBN at the Statler-Hilton Hotel in New York City on December 9th, 10th and 11th. Traditionally the most important function in the UJA's calendar, the Conference will have an additionally significant aspect this year which I want to call particularly to your attention.

The establishment of a national campaign goal for 1961, based upon the basic and realistic budgetary requirements of the constituent agencies of the UJA, will be the major item for consideration at the Conference. For several years, the UJA has not set a campaign goal but, instead, submitted to the community a statement showing the total needs of its agencies.

The formation of the new Board of the Jewish Agency for Israel, Inc., to exercise control over the spending of funds in Israel makes it incumbent upon the UJA to establish a goal and to realize it. This Board, consisting as it does of American Jewish leaders, will determine the particular activities and programs of immigration, absorption, resettlement, education and other philanthropic activities conducted by the Jewish Agency for Israel which should be supported -- as well as the extent of that support -- through funds raised by the United Jewish Appeal. The Board of the Jewish Agency and the Joint Distribution Committee are preparing careful budgets which will result in definite commitments. In performing their operations, the Board of the Jewish Agency and the JDC must look to the decisions and attitude taken by the leadership of American Jewry as represented at the UJA Annual National Conference.

In addition to deciding on the national campaign goal, this will involve establishing quotas for the drives in each and every community in the United States. These decisions in turn will inevitably relate to the overall goal for local, national and overseas needs in each community. The subjects of the national campaign goal and community quotas were intensively discussed at the last meeting of the officers of the UJA, and in view of their overriding importance a determination was made to refer these to the UJA Annual Conference for final decision. It will also be the function of the Conference to map out a campaign for the UJA in 1961 that will be proportionate to the great needs which must be met.

Within the Conference proper, the major decisions are made by the Steering Committee. From what I have already pointed out, I am sure you will agree it is especially vital this year that members of the Steering Committee be particularly representative of their communities. It would seem to us that officers of your Federation and members of your Allocations Committee would be among those best suited to serve in this capacity, although by this we do not mean to suggest a hard and fast rule to you by which members should be designated. In any event, of course, the decisions of this Committee must command the respect of the entire Jewish community and, as such, can be expected to be implemented to the fullest extent only if the Committee is adequately representative of the individual communities throughout the country. For that reason, it is imperative that your community be well represented on this Committee.

The Conference will be addressed by New York State Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller; Israel Ambassador Avraham Harman; Leon Uris, author of "Exodus", Dr. Dov Joseph, the Treasurer of the Jewish Agency; Moses Leavitt, Executive Secretary of the JDC; and by others including most of the officers of the UJA. There will also be a report from the new Board of the Jewish Agency, and the budgets of the UJA's various constituent agencies will be presented in a manner high-lighting the vast human needs which these budgets represent.

Among these needs in Israel which will confront the UJA in 1961 are the consolidation of the 485 farm settlements, established since the beginning of the State, which are still not economically self-sufficient; the 40,000 who are still living under primitive conditions in the maabarot; the clearance of wretched city slum conditions; additional water in the Negev; the need to develop further the border areas; and, last but not least, all the problems entailed in the continuing immigration of some 25,000 to 30,000 a year. Furthermore, there are the vital programs of the JDC in North Africa, in Western Europe, in Poland and elsewhere to provide aid for the needy and to assist local Jewish communities to re-establish their institutions. The requirements of the JDC encompass indispensable operations in 25 countries.

Representation on the Steering Committee is according to the following formula:

If your community has a Jewish population up to 15,000, you may designate one delegate and one alternate to represent it on the Steering Committee. If your Jewish population is from 15,000 to 40,000, your community is entitled to two delegates and two alternates -- while those with Jewish populations in excess of 40,000 are entitled to three delegates and three alternates. These, together with 15 delegates from the Greater New York area, 12 delegates representing the 8 regions of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, 25 delegates representing the country at large, and the national officers of the UJA constitute the Conference Steering Committee.

Please act at once to designate your delegates and alternates. As soon as you notify us of their names, we shall send them their credentials as Steering Committee members.

I know from past experience that you will extend every cooperation in regard to advising us as soon as possible who will represent your community on the Steering Committee -- and I do hope that you can let us know you will attend the Conference.

It really is of the utmost importance that the 23rd Annual Conference of the United Jewish Appeal, taking place at the Statler-Hilton Hotel in New York City on December 9th, 10th and 11th, be as fully representative as it possibly can. I am therefore writing again to stress how vital it is to have your reply to my letter to you of October 19th regarding the selection of leaders who would represent your community on the Conference Steering Committee.

As previously indicated, the matter of the 1961 national campaign goal for the United Jewish Appeal will be importantly involved in the deliberations at the Conference, since the formation of the new Board of the Jewish Agency for Israel, Inc., makes it incumbent on the UJA to establish a goal for the year ahead and to realize it. The commitment on the national campaign goal in turn will involve establishing quotas in each and every community. The Conference also will be concerned, of course, with charting a campaign for the UJA in 1961 that can realize the goal set and meet the great needs which face us.

As also indicated in my previous letter, the Board of the Jewish Agency, and the Joint Distribution Committee, will present budgets based on their realistic and urgent requirements for consideration at the Conference in making decisions. In addition, the report of the 1960 UJA Study Mission, which had the opportunity intimately to note needs and requirements while abroad recently in Europe and Israel, will be presented to the Conference and undoubtedly play an important role in the deliberations on the scope and shape of the 1961 UJA campaign. There certainly is much in this report requiring urgent and thoughtful consideration.

It really cannot be stressed too strongly how vital it is to have the participation in the Conference of understanding delegates from your community for the making of proper decisions and to assure their subsequent implementation. To recapitulate from my previous letter, within the Conference proper the major decisions are made by the Steering Committee. Representation on the Steering Committee is according to the following formula:

If your community has a Jewish population up to 15,000, you may designate one delegate and one alternate to represent it on the Steering Committee. If your Jewish population is from 15,000 to 40,000, your community is entitled to two delegates and two alternates -- while those with Jewish populations in excess of 40,000 are entitled to three delegates and three alternates. These, together with 15 delegates from the Greater New York area, 12 delegates representing the 8 regions of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds.

25 delegates representing the country at large, and the national officers of the UJA constitute the Conference Steering Committee.

I do hope you will write me now naming the leaders who will represent your community on the Conference Steering Committee. In replying, incidentally, it will be most helpful if you would advise us in regard to each delegate you name the number of plates that should be reserved for the luncheon on December 9th, the dinner on December 10th and the breakfast on December 11th. Please also let us know in the case of each delegate whether and from what date hotel reservations may be required, as well as whether these should include single or double room accommodations. We would also welcome being informed of the estimated time of arrival of each delegate.


