Max Fisher opened the meeting/by wishing everyone present a Happy New Year and

expressing his appreciation of their presence at this meeting. He also expressed

his appreciation of the tremendous job done in getting off the plateau in 1985, for

the good job being done in 1966 and was hopeful that the trend was upward for 1967.

Mr. Fisher then called on Herbert Friedman for a report of the 1986 campaign and his projection for the 1987 campaign.

Mr. Friedman gave his report on the campaign for 1966 as follows:

Spring phase of campaign almost completed. 1965 - \$82, 631,000 estimate for 1966 - \$86,991,000 increase \$4,360,000 this does not include New York Cisty

UJA Shere. 1965 - \$40,905,000 estimate fer 1966 - \$43,146,000 gein - \$2,241,000

Pall Campaign starting now. 1965 - \$5,900,000 UJA share \$3,900,000 no estimate as yet for this year, but the mood is good

Mr. Friedman made a special note of the Women's I ision activities. W.D. raised

113 million or 10% of all the money in the country and they did 3/4 of a million better than before. Out of 175 W.D. campaigns 98 have exceeded the 1965 total. Mr. Friedman was sorry that Mrs. Karp, the W.D. Chairman was not at the meeting but gave her a special vote of thanks for her efforts on behalf of the campaign. Mr. Friedman's prognosis for 1967-

- 1. Study Mission largest in the 12 years of running the mission with some 230 going oversess. 105 men in the 810,000 and over category.
- 2. Good Will 30 or 40 communities involved. Our ley leaders will be going into these communities with two Israelis to lay the groundwork for the 1967 campaign.
- 3. November A series of visits to communities such as Boston, Philadelphia, etc., which looks promising.
- 4. Insugural Dinner on December 8 with Sir Issac Wolfson,
 Edmond de Rothschild and Gov. Romney, to consist of \$10,000 and over
 contributors. This dinner will give us a clue as to the 1967 campaign.

 Mr. Friedman stated that although we are fighting/economic situations on the
 outside, there is every chance in the world for us to have a good campaign in
 1967.

Mr. Pisher then took to the microphone again to say that although we have raised more money, we have not kept pace with the needs in Israel. He stated that today marked the start of the Fall Campaign with a meeting in Rochester. He reported that Dellas has joined the "Million Dollar Club" and Mr. Pisher publicly thanked Jacob Feldman for his efforts.

Mr. Fisher then called on Phillip Stollman who reported on Congregations. Mr. Stollman reported that we have not raised enough money to meet the needs in Israel and that we ought to broaden the base of givers by involving the members of congregations and temples. He stated that about 50% of the members are not giving to either UJA of the Welfare Funds.

on them to become closer involved with UJA and Welfare funds. Mr. Stollman ended his remarks by wishing everyone present a Happy New Year.

Mr. Fisher acknowledged that Mr. Etollman had done a tremendous job and hoped that this effort can show favorable results.

Mr. Fisher remarked on the major changes that will be taking place in the Israel Education gund and called upon Mr. Baneley to report.

Mr. Bensley reported that in the pest 17 or 18 mouths the IMF had gone over the 24 million mark. He lauded Mrs. Elsine Siris for her work with the Women's Division. Mr. Bensley stated that they will establish about half dozen Estional Chairmanships Managh throughout the country, such as Jacob Feldman in the South West, Lawrence Schacht in New York, which has reised about 50% of all the funds, Philip Zimman on the East Coast, Joseph Shame on the West Coast and Joseph Eanter in the Middle West. Mr. Bensley priesed Albert Parker and Jerry Klorfein especially for their work and ended his report on an optimistic note. Mr. Bensley also pointed out that Dr. William Jamsen and Dr. Harold Gores were both especially helpful in drawing up the initial report for IMF. He mentioned Mr. Theodore Raccosin, who had started with a \$100,000 gift and ended up with a complete school.

Mr. Fisher then introduced Israel's Minister of Finance, who has the tough job of straightening out Israel's economy and who hi is doing his job with great courage. The sudience gave Mr. Sapir a standing ovasion.

Mr. Sapir greeted those present, said he was happy to be here and expressed his thanks for all that has been done.

Mr. Sapir went into great detail to explain Israel's economy and the reasons for the stringent and sustere measures the Government he had to take in order to make the country more economically secure. He explained how Israel is forced to spend inordinate sums of money on her defences; that she is educating and training immigrants from North Africa and Asia; that the German reparations have terminated; that restitution payments have declined and that Israel's future depends on building its industry to be able to compete with international fine markets. He called on USA to continue to raise funds for insurance of a better future of the Jews in Israel; to finish the job of rescue and to set refugees on their feette give them the opportunity of becoming productive individuals. He called on the UJA to undertake social and educational development in the development towns. The sudience stood up to applause Mr. Sapir at the end of his speech.

Mr. Fisher thanked Mr. Sspir and assured him that we understood Israel's problems and that we were in this together, and invited questions from the floor for Mr. Sapir to enswer.

Mr. Sapir thanked Mr. Fisher for his wonderful job of the past two years and and empressed his pleasure at Mr. Fisher's agreement to remain as General Chairman for the coming year. He also thanked Mr. Bensley for the splendid job he's doing in raising funds for education.

Mr. Sapir answered questions from the floor and at the end of the question and enswer period, Mr. Fisher summed up the meeting, parenthetically thanked Albert Parker for his excellent job as chairman of the Mission for the past two years and adjourned the meeting at 3:10 p.m.

Dear Adi:

For the sake of good order, let me simply summarize in this letter the subject of our conversation last week in Jerusalem.

- 1. You explained to me the frame of reference of the work you are going to undertake, as requested by Mr. Sapir and Mr. Pincus. You indicated that there would be no conflict with the Israel Education Fund, because you would be selling projects which were much larger in size and scope. You indicated that the principle of clearance of names with the UJA, before you solicit them, had been agreed upon.
- 2. I indicated to you that both Irving Bernstein and I had made two points to Mr. Sapir - first, we thought that the principle of "matching" was harmful; and secondly, that the amount of money sought should be somewhere in the range of \$5 million from an individual. The reasons for these suggestions are as follows: "matching" is not really required, in our judgment, in order to obtain a contribution. It should not be offered. If, in the course of negotiation, it turns out that the offer to match is really necessary in order to close the gift, then it is hard to object and we certainly would not. But, with the level of contributions rising so high now in the Emergency Fund campaign, without any matching and without even any building being named, it seems a bit unfair to the good disciplined donor. Regarding the second point, of a high ceiling, we have in this year's campaign 13 gifts of \$1 million or That is the best reason in the world for keeping the "special project" amount very, very high. Again, we are not attempting to be rigid. We suggest \$5 million, in order to leave room for annual giving to increase, without coming close to the "special" giving. If you find someone who is willing to offer \$4 million we would not insist that you refuse it. What we are attempting to make clear is the general operating principle.

Mr. Adi Yaffe 12 May 1971 3. As you requested, we shall go through various lists of prospects which exist here in the office, and at the first opportunity we will sit down together, especially since you will be located in our office in Jerusalem, and start to clear a list of names from which you can begin to work. I am sure you understand that we are pleased at the possibility that new avenues of revenue may be opened for Israel. I am sure you also know how pleased we are to be able to work with you personally. The only thing we must always keep in mind is that we should do nothing to jeopardize the on-going work of the UJA in our zeal to find new sources. - 1. Mr. Kreutner briefly reviewed the activities of the secretariat to date and emphasized in particular the need for coordination and follow-up of these activities. He put at the disposal of the secretariat the services Guest Department of the Keren Hayesod.
- 2. Mr. Cassuto reported Mr. Henry Bernstein's request for further details relating to four projects.

 IT WAS AGREED THAT Mr. Jaffe should pass on to Mr. Henry Bernstein whatever km information he could through Mr. A. Nesher who is at present in the country. In any case, the required details will be passed on to Mr. Henry Bernstein as contained in the classified data file to be sent to him soon.
- 3. Mr. Jaffe reported that he had received the cardex of contributors from Mr. U. Raskin and that the classified data file which includes details of the various projects would be ready within a few days.

Mr. Jaffe also reported the following:

- (a) Sir Max Rine's representative, Mr. Milligan is expected to arrive in Israel on 15.5.71 for a few days. Mr. Milligan intended to investigate possibilities of giving contributions for premises for research and instruction laboratories at the Beilinson Hospital or another project in the field of medicine or health. Meetings will be arranged between Mr. Milligan and and the people of the Ministry of Health and of Kupat Holim who will present their projects to him.
- (b) Mr. Bernard Lewis, who is at present in the country, is considering the possibility of giving a contribution of £240,000 towards a chemistry laboratory at the Haifa Technion. A meeting between Mr. Lewis and the Technion has been arranged for 4.5.71 and he would be accompanied by Mr. Jaffe.
- (c) Lady Avie Joanh
 reports on the progress of her projects. Apparently, she had not received such reports from the institutions to whom she had made her contributions. Mr. Cassuto stressed the importance of maintaining regular contact with contributors by submitting reports on the progress of the relevant projects. Mr. Jaffe would forward the requested reports to Lady Joda.
- (d) The Minister of Finance met the Contractors' Association and received their personal undertaking to contribute the sum of II.3 million. The Contractors' Association set up a committee to mobilize additional contributions from among the contractors.

- 1, Mr. E. Jaffe reported on his action in regard to the following:
 - (a) Mr. Bernard Levis visited the Haifa Technion escorted by Mr. Jaffe. Although he had been initially prepared to give a contribution of £100,000 sterling, Mr. Lewis was/considering giving a contribution of £240,000 sterling to the laboratory section of chemical engineering.
 - (b) Sir Max Rein's representative, Mr. Mulligan, is due to arrive in Israel on 16.5.71 and meetings have been arranged for him with the Director-General of the Ministry of Health, as well as visits to the Tel Hashomer, Beilinson and Rambam Hospitals.
 - (c) The Finance Minister has submitted a written report to Lady Jedah about the progress of the project at the Negev University. He is expected to meet Lady Jedahduring his present trip abroad, and he hopes to interest her in the second and third stages of the Engineering School at the Negev University.

Also a current progress report has been promised to Lady Joda Lon projects under the aegis of the Ministries of Education and Housing.

- (d) A possibility has been indicated of receiving a contribution through a bequest, amounting to \$1.5 million. (At this stage no mention was made of the name of the contributor.) The Finance Minister standard projects at the Haifa University, the University of Jerusalem or part of the Tel Hashomer Hospital as suitable for the above contribution.
- 2. Mr. Kreutner stressed the importance of finding new ways and further contacts for approaching Mr. Sam Bronfman. The matter was discussed and IT WAS AGREED that the subject be raised with the Finance Minister.

Mr. Kreutner also reported that the Minister of Justice's impending visit to Germany was scheduled to start on 5.5.71. The Minister would meet with various groups of lawyers and also potential contributors in Germany.



1. Mr. Kreutner reported on his meeting with the State Comptroller on February 8, 1971. He gave the comptroller details of activities for securing special contributions from Jews all over the world through national institutions or other institutions recognized abroad for tax exemption purposes, without such funds being transferred through the Israel Government. These moneys are earmarked for improvement and development of health services, education and welfare. Dr. Nebenzal was apparently enthusiastic about the idea and proposed that the construction of housing for young couples be regarded as a project for contributions. also raised the question of liaison between the government bodies, who are interested in receiving the contribution, and the contributor.

It was agreed that a report of Mr. Kreutner's meeting with the Comptroller and the proposal made be brought before the Minister of Finance, the Minister of Justice and Mr. Pincus.

2. Mr. Kreutner reported on the cooperation between the Minister of Justice - during his European tour - and the Keren Hayesod emissary, Mr. Rak-Oz. He proposed that Mr. Rak-Oz should organize activities in Europe.

It was agreed to put this proposal before the Minister of Finance, the Minister of Justice, and Mr. Pincus.

3. The Finance Minister's proposal concerning the Puah Brothers was discussed, viz., that the brothers should receive a mortgage on their property in Switzerland and that the funds enlisted in this way be transferred for projects in Israel. In due course the Swiss company will be able to realize the mortgage on the property of the brothers (i.e. after their death). Mr. Cassuto remarked that he was unable to suggest how the matter could be arranged with the Italian authorities.

It was agreed that Mr. Cassuto undertake the task of finding a solution.

4. Uzi Raskin drew the attention of the Secretariat to the bottleneck which was obstructing the preparation of projects. Mr. Sivan replied that a large proportion of the responsibility rests on the shoulders of institutions which change data from time to time, and they refuse to complete their proposal until they know that of parallel institutions.

It was agreed:

- (a) to give priority to the preparation of introductions (re specific projects) to material collected;
- (b) to fix a date up to which time data received will be included in projects. Corrections will be made if necessary;
- (c) that all the material to be distributed in English be reviewed by Mr. Chinitz.
- 5. Mr. Kreutner reported on information he had received from Dov Sinai in connection with Mr. Bronfman. The latter was staying in the Bahamas at present and Dov found it impossible to approach him. It was possible that he would approach Mr. Bronfman in either March or April.
- 6. Mr. Cassuto would discuss the question of Louis Mintz with the Ministry of Justice.



Dear friend Sapir:

I have read the "New York Times" report on the interview you gave in Jerusalem on November 15 and wish to congratulate you. It was a fine exposition of your views.

There is one aspect of it, affecting the United Jewish Appeal, that I yould suggest might be differently expressed in future statements:

The underlying basis for UJA's Israel Emergency Fund Campaign is the fact that the people and the Government of Israel are no longer able to make the contribution that they voluntarily made in the past to the humanitarian causes served by UJA. It should be stressed that at no time did the Government or the people of Israel have any legal responsibility to pay the costs of immigration or of the absorption of immigrants; that this has always been the responsibility of World Jewry including UJA; that because of the events that have occurred since May, 1967, the Government and people of Israel are no longer able to help the financing of these costs; and that therefore World Jewry, including UJA, must bear the entire cost of the humanitarian work that has always been its responsibility.

I suggest that this could be said substantially as follows:

The people of Israel have never had the legal responsibility of paying the costs of immigration to Israel or the costs of immigrant absorption. This has always been the obligation of World Jewry, including UJA.

In the past the people of Israel voluntarily helped finance the costs of immigration and the absorption of immigrants. This they no longer are able to do because of the events that have transpired during and since June 1967. Therefore it has become necessary for World Jewry, including UJA, to fully carry what has always been its responsibility by bearing the total cost of the humanitarian work of immigration and immigrant absorption.

I know you will be interested in hearing that the campaign in this country seems to have gotten off to a pretty good start. Actually, only a limited number of fund-raising meetings have been held so far in the communities and the pace will accelerate during the next couple of months. The fragmentary figures to date show the regular campaign running a little ahead of last year while the Israel Emergency Fund is running a little behind. The smaller Emergency Fund totals reported by a number of communities seem to be the result of reduced pledges by just one or two large contributors who came through very generously in 1967. We are planning several special solicitation efforts to reach these contributors again as well as others who may represent unique problems.

There is evidently a great deal of understanding and desire to respond among the contributors, but there is an inevitable delay in making large commitments again.


