Operating Plan

- 1. Form a corporation ("wholly-owned" by UJA) Corporation for the Future (see attached memo for names of board)
- 2. Find chief executive in U.S. Erich Zahler (two-year leave of absence)
- 3. Find chief executive in Israel (one of forum people)
- 4. First-year budget 30 million
- 5. Overhead administration 3 million (10%) salaries, travel, phone, rent
- 6. House the corporation either in Wexner's office or UJA office

Steps to Get Started
